



VETERAN PRIORITY REGISTRATION FORM

Veterans have been granted priority registration by Kutztown University. Priority registration really means early registration. Veterans may schedule classes ahead of students with priority registration, but once general registration begins you will compete for class spaces along with all other students allowed to register at that time.

The term “veteran” refers to an individual who:

- a. Has served in the United States Armed Forces, including a reserve component and the National Guard, and
- b. Was discharged or released from such service with a condition other than dishonorable.

To exercise this benefit, veterans should send a copy of the **Member 4 section of their DD-214** (indicating character of discharge) and active duty members should send a letter from their command stating their dates of service. These documents should be sent to the Registrar’s Office by either:

Once your DD-214 is received an entry will be made in the University’s student information system that will notify the Registrar to allow you to access priority registration.
