TWO-YEAR DESIGN:

Students complete the traditional MSW curriculum through a full-time study for two academic years and engage in concurrent field experience.

THREE OR FOUR YEAR DESIGN:

Students have the option of completing the advanced and foundation years part-time.

ADVANCED STANDING: 1 CALENDAR YEAR

Students with a Bachelor of Social Work from a Council on Social Work-accredited program are eligible to apply for advanced standing and potentially complete the program in one year. In the summer before they begin their advanced year, advanced standing students engage in a full-time practicum and seminar experience.

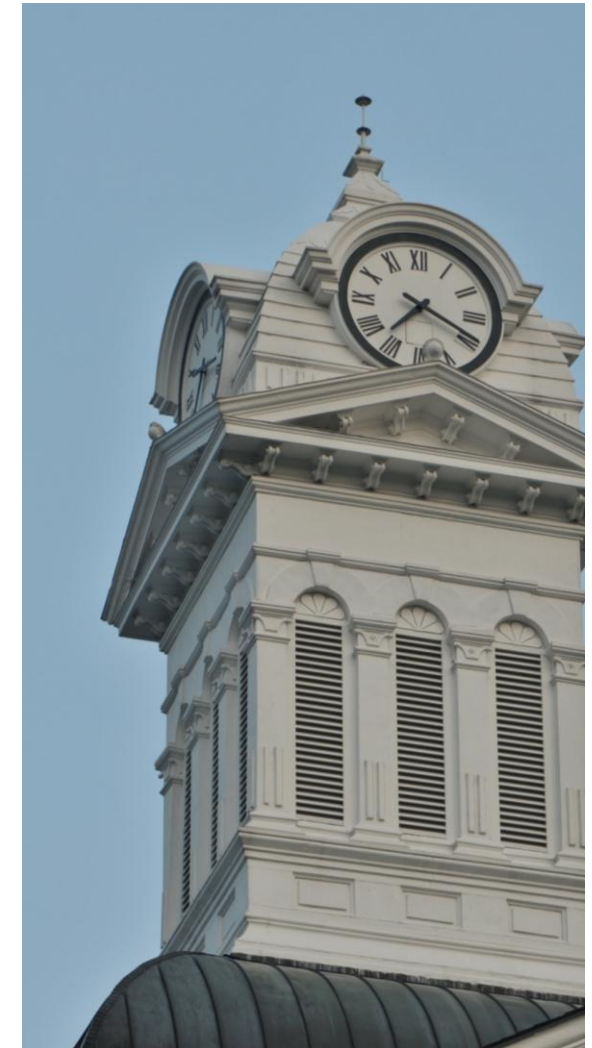
