This workshop teaches you how to unlearn the behaviors that are creating negativity in society and how you can do to help others to unlearn them.

Some of the topics covered include definitions and examples of sexual assault and relationship violence, the warning signs of relationship violence, victim blaming, and what you can do to support a victim.
