# Kutztown University Athletic Facilities

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venue on campus.

## Keystone Hall ►

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the mecca of indoor athletic activity on campus. The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the volleyball, men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams. It was also the location of President George W. Bush's visit in 2004. Keystone Hall houses the Golden Bear sports medicine department, designated locker rooms for intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room. The football coaching staff and locker room are located in the west wing of Keystone Hall.



## ▲ University Field

A 5,600-seat stadium that features a synthetic track and a grass playing field, University Field is the site of all home football games and outdoor track & field meets. It has been the site of PSAC Championship track & field meets. The stadium features a state-of-the-art scoreboard that debuted in the fall of 2001.



## ◀ Risley Weight Room

Athletes get extensive use out of the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

## Keystone Fieldhouse ►

Keystone Fieldhouse is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The fieldhouse is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events and many camps and clinics throughout the year. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as former President Clinton's address during his visit in 1994.

## Dr. F. Javier Cevallos - President

Dr. F. Javier Cevallos is Kutztown University's 11th president, appointed on July 8, 2002, and inaugurated on April 25, 2003. He earned his bachelor's degree at the University of Puerto Rico at Mayaguez, and his master's and doctorate from the University of Illinois.

He began his academic career as an assistant professor of Spanish at the University of Maine at Orono. After three years in Maine, Cevallos moved to the University of Massachusetts, where he rose to the rank of full professor within eight years. From that point he held several positions in university administration and governance, including that of presiding officer of the university senate.

In 1996, Cevallos was named a fellow of the American Council of Education, an honor generally bestowed upon young scholars who show great promise of becoming a university president.

Since coming to Kutztown, Cevallos has led the campus community in an open, inclusive university-wide self-study that resulted in a revised mission and vision statement and a renewed focus. Kutztown University has resolved that we will be the region's center for academic excellence, cultural enrichment, and public engagement. In his opening remarks at the Decision Makers speech last spring, Cevallos explained that a complete education does not happen solely in a classroom or laboratory. Cultural perspective and public context give deeper meaning and greater understanding to the lessons learned in the classroom. In support of this vision, and through the generosity of a recent retiree, the university has created the Carlson Chambliss Gold Medal for Faculty Research and Creative Work. The winners of the medal will be asked to share her or his work with the community in a Distinguished Faculty Lecture. Dr. Chambliss also established Gold, Silver and Bronze Academic Achievement medals for students.

Since Cevallos arrived, Kutztown University has been included in the Princeton Review Guide to the Best Mid-Atlantic Colleges. Among the outstanding programs and initiatives cited in the letter announcing the university's selection, was the fact



that Kutztown University is the only public university in the state, perhaps the region, with a Spanish-language version of its website.

Since 2002, the university has added 33 smart classrooms, and more are planned. Moreover, the university has created and funded a "teachology" program to be sure all faculty have the chance to become proficient in the classroom use of emerging technologies.

Consistent with that philosophy, Cevallos encouraged the faculty to undertake an expansive review of the general curriculum.

"One of the crucial challenges facing Kutztown University and American higher education today is redefining the role higher education plays in the new and challenging information society. For the first time in our history, thanks to the Internet, information is readily accessible and free. For the first time, as well, we face challenges by institutions that offer a fast and cheap way to

obtain a diploma. We know that we do much more than that. Our university provides our students with much more than 'training' for a job: we offer an education. If we are to thrive in the next decades, we must reaffirm our firm commitment to a comprehensive liberal arts education. At its core is general education. Defining a sound general education foundation for our students, then, is essential to our future."

In addition to the leadership Cevallos provides on campus, he also gives generously of his time and energy offering guidance and leadership in the community. Among the organizations and agencies on whose boards he serves are the Allentown Art Museum, Good Shepherd, Hawk Mountain and Minsi Trails Boy Scout Councils, Olivet Boys and Girls Club, Reading Public Museum, Reading Musical Foundation, St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center, and United Way of Berks County. Cevallos and his wife, Josee Vachon, a professional French-Canadian folk singer, live in the president's residence on campus with their two children, Alex and Caroline, both of whom attend area public schools.

## A Look at Kutztown University

Visitors to Kutztown University of Pennsylvania are immediately attracted to the beautiful campus, high-quality academic programs, distinctive educational opportunities, and a student-life program that stresses involvement, leadership and a feeling of community.

There are important advantages that make a difference for students. For instance, KU students can excel by participating in the honors program offered throughout the curriculum. Honor students in all of the undergraduate colleges not only take honor-approved courses and projects, they get together throughout the year to discuss their areas of interest and to support and learn from one another. Besides the honors program, there are numerous opportunities for students to be involved in independent study and special projects. There are also internships that provide hands-on experience, adding a very practical dimension to learning. In fact, the Career Services Office this past year identified several internship placements that could be available to KU students.

At Kutztown, degree programs as unique as communication design, marine science and geography can be found among the more than 50 major fields in the four undergraduate colleges: Liberal Arts and Sciences, Business, Education, and Visual and Performing Arts. The electronic media program provides state-of-the-art equipment and modern facilities as well as opportuni-

ties for students to help produce programs for KUTV, the university's cable television channel. Students in the physical sciences have access to facilities such as the planetarium, observatory, and weather station. Additionally, a \$20 million science center opened in 2003, complete with the most up-to-date equipment and labs.

KU professors bring a wealth of experience and information to their students. Many are published authors, engaged in scholarly research, or are active consultants in their fields.

A well-rounded student life program adds fun and enjoyment as well as personal growth for KU students. The program is highlighted by a 21-sport NCAA Division II intercollegiate athletics program that continues to grow and improve. KU's teams have produced a host of standout athletes in a wide variety of sports. Sports available to men and women include basketball, cross country, soccer, swimming, tennis, and track & field. Sports for men include baseball, football and wrestling. Sports for women include field hockey, golf, softball and volleyball. The university also provides a comprehensive intramural and club sports program that offers a broad range of activities for all students, as well as an extensive array of student activities. KU will break ground this fall on a new student recreation center.

**Jack Entriken**  
Interim Director of Athletics

Jack Entriken assumed the role of interim director of athletics on August 2, as the university searches for the full-time replacement for Clark Yeager. Yeager left the post to become the assistant to the provost at KU.

Entriken has served as an athletic trainer at Kutztown since 1992. In addition to his duties in the sports medicine area, Entriken spearheaded the creation and served as advisor for the Student-Athlete Advisory Council for eight years. He is a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association

and the Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers Society.

Entriken is a 1987 graduate of West Chester University, where he earned a degree in health and physical education. He went on to earn a master's degree in counseling (student personnel) from Shippensburg University in 1992. Between earning those degrees, Entriken was employed by the Chester County Orthopedic and Sports Physical Therapy Clinic. He is a graduate of Central High School in Philadelphia.

Entriken is active in the community of Kutztown, helping to organize youth sporting events with the Optimists Club of Kutztown.

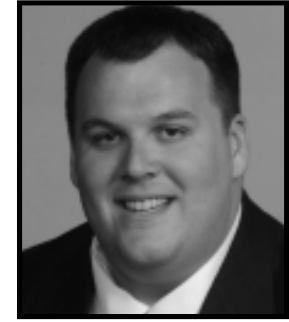

# Over a Century of Tradition

The tradition we know as Kutztown University football today began over 100 years ago, when KU was known as Keystone Normal School. Keystone won all five games it played during the initial 1895 season, including a 10-4 win over Reading High School. The school fielded a team until 1905, when the sport was suspended due to a serious on-field injury. In 1923, football became, for the most part, a permanent fixture of the campus.

Those initial seasons set the foundation for football and athletics in general at KU. The early teams were nicknamed the "Golden Avalanche," and featured many competitive players and teams before the current nickname of "Golden Bears" was adopted in the 1960s.

Since then, KU has had its share of prominent players who have received national attention and fame on the football field. Additionally, numerous Golden Bears have gone on to successful coaching, teaching, business and many other careers. The individuals listed on this page are prime examples of the many fine men who call Kutztown University their alma mater.

### Doug Dennison, RB

*Dallas Cowboys, 1974-78*

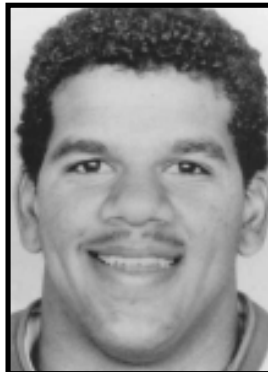
Doug Dennison opened the doors to the NFL when he joined the Dallas Cowboys' roster in 1974. A member of KU's Hall of Fame, Dennison was a running back with "America's Team" during the glory years of Coach Tom Landry and Hall of Fame quarterback Roger Staubach.



### Bruce Harper, RB

*New York Jets, 1977-84*

Bruce Harper, a standout for the New York Jets in the late 1970s, set an NFL record as a kick returner. Harper was a running back for the Golden Bears under head coach George Baldwin. He is also a member of the KU Athletic Hall of Fame and in 2003, was named to the New York Jets' All-Time Team as a punt/kick returner.

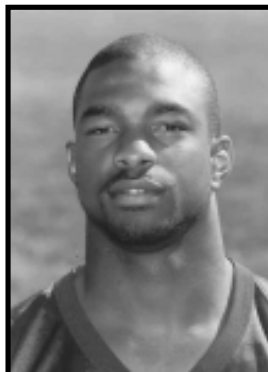


### Andre Reed, WR

*Buffalo Bills, 1984-1999*

*Washington Redskins, 2000*

One of the top receivers in National Football League history, Andre Reed played for the Golden Bears in the early 1980s. Reed, who played in four Super Bowls for the Buffalo Bills, is a member of the Kutztown University Athletic Hall of Fame. In 2000, Reed played for the Washington Redskins before retiring in 2001. In 2002, Reed was inducted into the Division II Football Hall of Fame.



### John Mobley, LB

*Denver Broncos, 1996-2003*

John Mobley made history in April of 1996 when he became the first player in PSAC history selected in the first round of the NFL Draft. Mobley was the 15th pick overall and the first pick of the Denver Broncos. Mobley has started at linebacker for the Broncos in each of his seven seasons, helping Denver to back-to-back Super Bowl Championships.

# Coaching Staff

## Head Coach



### **Dave Keeny**

Dave Keeny enters his seventh season as head football coach at Kutztown University.

During his tenure as head coach, Keeny's teams have established themselves as some of the winningest football teams in school history. He has set or tied records for wins in a season, as well as wins in two-, three- and four-straight seasons.

In just six years, he has moved into third place on KU's career coaching victories chart, passing Hall of

Famer Jim McGovern and his predecessor, Al Leonzi, in 2002. With a 32-31 career record, Keeny has the best career winning percentage among KU's head football coaches.

Last year, Keeny's troops were 6-5 overall, 3-3 in the PSAC East. The wins marked the third time in four seasons that KU had won at least six games in a season and improved upon the 2002 record of 4-7. The previous two seasons, Keeny's teams were 6-4 and 7-4 - the first back-to-back winning seasons since the early 1980s. The seven wins in 2000 tied the school record for single-season victories. From 1999-2001 and from 2000-2002, the team won 17 games, tying the record for most wins in a three-year span set from 1979-81. As a rookie head coach in 1998, Keeny recorded a 5-5 overall record, becoming the winningest first-year coach in Kutztown football history.

Prior to taking over as head coach, Keeny served as KU's offensive coordinator for five seasons. He was the associate head coach from 1996 to 1997. Under Keeny, the Golden Bears developed the most potent ground attack in school history. His offenses produced four of KU's seven 1,000-yard rushers, including Darrien Peoples, the all-time leading rusher in school history, and Emneko Sweeney, the only back in school history to rush for over 1,000 yards twice. Keeny produced 12 All-PSAC selections as offensive coordinator.

Since taking over as head coach, his players have earned two Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) and three PSAC East Player of the Year honors, three PSAC Rookie of the Year awards and 46 All-PSAC, eight All-Region, two All-America, two Academic All-America and one PSAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year selections.

Keeny earned his bachelor's (1983) and master's (1987) degrees from Kutztown. He was an All-PSAC running back selection on the 1980 team that won the school's only PSAC East title.

Keeny returned to KU after amassing a wealth of coaching experience in championship programs around the country.

Keeny came back to KU from Thomas More College in Crestview Hills, KY, where he served as offensive coordinator for three years. During Keeny's stay, Thomas More won two conference titles and advanced to the NCAA Division III tournament.

Prior to Thomas More, Keeny amassed valuable coaching experience on the staffs at a number of Division I programs. Keeny was a graduate assistant coach for the 1986 Penn State national championship program under head coach Joe Paterno. He also had stints at two other nationally prominent Division I programs - Arizona (1988) and Virginia (1984-85). The head coaches at those two schools at the time, Dick Tomey and George Welsh, respectively, are two of three coaches who are the winningest mentors at a pair of Division I-A institutions. Keeny was also the quarter-backs/receivers coach at Morehead State (1989-90).

Keeny has two sons - Brandon, 14, and Matthew, 12.

## Assistant Coaches



**Al Holcomb**  
*Defensive Coordinator/  
Defensive Backs*

Al Holcomb joins the Golden Bear coaching staff this fall to serve as defensive coordinator and coach defensive backs. He comes to Kutztown from Bloomsburg University, where he coached linebackers and was special teams coordinator for six seasons. During his time at Bloomsburg, 12 of his linebackers earned All-PSAC honors. Prior to Bloomsburg, Holcomb coached at Colby (ME) College, where he also coached linebackers. Before Colby, he was a graduate assistant at Temple University for two years working with the linebackers. He was also an administrative assistant at West Virginia University, where he earned his undergraduate and graduate degrees. Holcomb is responsible for recruiting in District 3 and central New Jersey.



**Steff Kruck**  
*Offensive Coordinator/  
Quarterbacks*

Steff Kruck joins the Golden Bear coaching staff this year as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Kruck comes to Kutztown from West Chester, where he coached for 10 years. He spent eight seasons at WCU as offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. His 1998 Golden Rams offense led the nation in passing. He began his collegiate coaching career as quarterbacks coach at West Chester in 1988, before moving on to Fordam. There he was offensive coordinator, quarterbacks and receivers coach for three seasons before returning to WCU in 1994. In college, Kruck played at Alabama under the legendary Paul 'Bear' Bryant. Kruck is responsible for recruiting in District 1, Philadelphia and southern New Jersey.

He was inducted into the KU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1999, and was named one of the Top 30 Athletes of the 20th Century at Kutztown. He graduated from KU in 1994 with a bachelor's degree in general studies.

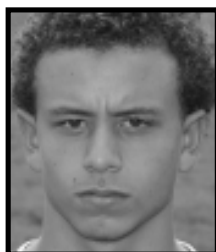

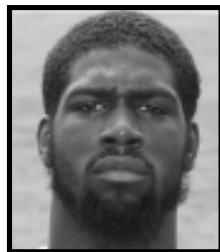

# Q&A With Coach Keeny

## What is the outlook for 2004?

We expect to be an improved football team in 2004. Our coaching staff and players have worked very hard in the off season to continue to improve in all areas of the program.

## What are your short-term and long-term goals for the program?

Our immediate priority has been to make players accountable and dedicated to their teammates and coaching staff. We are interested in building a base of positive-attitude people who display a strong work ethic and a passion for playing football. We want people who will strive to be challenged both in the classroom and on the practice field.

Our long-term goals are to play hard on Saturdays, win the PSAC East title, and have a team capable of going to the national playoffs.

## How has working in three top NCAA Division I-A programs influenced your coaching career?

As a coach, you are essentially a culmination of your experiences. From Joe Paterno, I learned the value of organization and the team concept. George Welsh at the University of Virginia taught me the importance of details and toughness in the business of football. Dick Tomey at the University of Arizona gave me broad experiences and insight into the process of recruiting.

## What type of offense and defense does KU employ?

We utilize a multiple offense. We look to spread the field with our formations and try to create mismatches offensively. We employ a 4-3 defense, that includes multiple fronts and coverages with an emphasis on developing a good, physical defense with athletes that tackle well.

## What are you looking for in a recruiting prospect?

We look for hardworking kids with character and good attitudes who have some range of athletic ability and want to earn a degree.

## What does the campus of Kutztown University have to offer prospective football recruits?

An opportunity to get a quality education on one of the State System's most attractive campuses. KU has excellent athletic facilities and an outstanding library. The university has recently completed expansion to the cafeteria and Student Union Building and unveiled a state-of-the-art science building in 2003. Additionally, we are in a great location for our players to experience a multitude of diverse opportunities.

## What academic support is available to student-athletes?

We have tutorial services, study hall requirements and grade monitoring through progress reports.

Our coaching staff meets weekly with our players during the season to keep updated on classes.

The faculty members at the university are willing to help students who want to achieve academically as well as athletically.

## What is your philosophy on two-sport athletes?

## Hall of Fame Honors Pour in for Former Golden Bear Reed

Former Kutztown University and Buffalo Bills standout **Andre Reed** is a sure bet for enshrinement into the National Football League Hall of Fame in Canton, OH, when he becomes eligible. In the meantime, several other halls of fame have enshrined Reed.

A 1991 KU Hall of Fame inductee, he was named to the NCAA Division II Football Hall of Fame in 2002. This past spring Reed was inducted into the Lehigh Valley Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. In October, he will be added to the Greater Buffalo Sports Hall of Fame.

Reed was a four-year letterman at Kutztown from 1981-84, making 142 career catches for 2,002 yards and 14 touchdowns. Upon completion of his collegiate career, he held school records for catches, receiving yards and touchdowns in a game, season and career. He was named All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference in 1983 and 1984.

He was drafted in the fourth round by the Buffalo Bills following his senior season. He played the next 15 years with the Bills, helping to lead the team to four Super Bowls. Reed finished his career among the top receivers in the history of the NFL, with 951 receptions for 13,198 yards and 87 touchdowns.

Reed was inducted into Kutztown's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1991. He was selected for the NCAA Division II Team of the Quarter Century in 1997.
