# MEN'S & WOMEN'S TENNIS

**History:**

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

**Location:**

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

**Enrollment:**

Approximately 9,400 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 19 states and 39 nations are represented in the student body: 62% women, 38% men.

**Academic Year:**

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

**Faculty:**

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

**Majors/Degrees:**

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

**Special Academic Programs:**

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

**Library:**

Modern, spacious facility; 492,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

**Special Facilities:**

Gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 15 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

**Student Life:**

Approximately 150 student organizations include: advisory councils, academic, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station), diversified interest, Greek, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

**Residence Halls:**

Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style complexes and one residence house and two apartment-style complexes accommodate 4,100 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone and Internet and campus network access.

## **Head Coach Suresh Ramamurthi**

Suresh Ramamurthi begins his sixth season as head coach of the men's and women's tennis programs at Kutztown University.

Ramamurthi guided the men's tennis team to the 2004 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) championship, marking Kutztown's fourth PSAC crown in five years. Six of his players earned All-PSAC honors. The team appeared in its seventh-straight NCAA East Regional qualifier, winning it for the third-consecutive year and advanced to the NCAA round of 16.

Three of Ramamurthi's players earned All-PSAC honors in 2003 and the team also featured the PSAC Athlete and Rookie of the Year. The Golden Bears appeared in the NCAA East Regional qualifier for the sixth straight season, where KU advanced to the NCAA Division II National Championships for the second straight year. In 2002, Ramamurthi was named the PSAC and NCAA Division II East Region Coach of the Year.

For the Golden Bear women, Ramamurthi's troops completed a resurgence in 2004. His squad finished 10-8 for its first winning season since 1997-98. Three Kutztown players were selected to the All-PSAC honors. The team also advanced to the NCAA East Regional qualifier.

Ramamurthi amassed over 20 years of experience before coming to Kutztown for his first collegiate coaching position. He served five years as director of tennis and head professional at the Talamore Golf & Country Club in Ambler, PA. He also served as director of tennis at the Willow Grove Racquet Club, the Upper Dublin Racquet Club, the Indian Falls Swim & Tennis Club (Wayne, PA), and the Gulph Mills Racquet Club (King of Prussia, PA).

Previously, Ramamurthi had been the director of tennis at the Chester Valley Golf Club (Malvern, PA) and the St. Albans Tennis Club (Newtown Square, PA).

He has coached all levels of players, from children to adults. He coached top collegiate athletes, including David DiLucia, the top ranked NCAA Division I player in 1992, on the ATP Tour. Ramamurthi also coached Lisa Raymond, who is currently ranked in the top 25 on the WTA tour.

A 1983 graduate of the University of Poona, in Maharashtra, India, with a master's degree in commerce, Ramamurthi was a four-year member of the varsity tennis team. He represented Poona at the Indian National Championships twice.

Ramamurthi is in his third year as chairman of the NCAA East Region Tennis Committee.



## Season Outlook

### Men's Tennis Hoping for Another Run at Regional, PSAC Titles

Kutztown University's men's tennis team has spent much of the last four seasons ranked among the elite of the East Region and NCAA Division II Tennis Programs. KU has won three of the last four Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Championships and has won an NCAA East Regional Qualifier to advance to the NCAA Division II Championships for three consecutive seasons.

In order to remain on top, the Golden Bears will have to replace three departed seniors who combined to win 370 singles and doubles matches in their careers. Despite the losses, Kutztown returns several key veterans, adds a top transfer as well as some key freshmen, all with sights set on continuing championship caliber tennis at KU.

Heading the list of returning players is senior **Mukundan Nandakumar**. The three-year starter at #1 has tallied a 47-16 career singles record and a 59-19 mark in doubles matches for 106 combined victories. Last year, Nandakumar was named to first-team All-PSAC honors after winning the PSAC's inaugural singles and doubles championships.

Battling Nandakumar for the top spot this year will be newcomer **Harsh Sharma (Calcutta, INDIA)**. A junior, Sharma comes to KU via South Carolina-Aiken, where he was a two-year letterwinner.

With KU's #2-#4 singles players gone to graduation, the next several singles spots will be up for grabs.

Junior **Radoslaw Hlubinski** was 10-4 in singles action last year, playing third through sixth seed. He was named to second-team All-PSAC honors last year after earning the PSAC's rookie of the year award as a freshman.

Sophomore **Lukas Beman** was named to second-team All-PSAC honors last year, after a perfect 5-0 record in singles matches. He was also 8-2 in doubles play.

Sophomore **Somdeep Appineni** (3-3 singles, 11-5 doubles) and junior **Ija Semjonovs** (11-4 singles, 8-0 doubles) also return.

Freshmen **Nicholas Gallagher (King of Prussia/Upper Merion)**, **Matthew Gawrych (Burlington, NJ/Holy Cross)** and **Thomas Miller (fr. Tuscarora/Tamaqua)** will fight for time.

### Women's Tennis to Build off Regional Appearance

Kutztown University's women's tennis team notched its first winning season in six years and advanced to the NCAA East Regional Qualifier last year.

Kutztown was 10-8 last year, including a 2-2 record in the PSAC East to finish third, one space out of the conference play-offs. KU, however, qualified for the NCAA East Regional qualifier, falling in the first round to Slippery Rock.

The Golden Bears will look to build upon the success of last year with a talented group of returning players and some key newcomers.

Sophomores **Priya Pachkawde** and **Jharna Nansi** lead the returners. Pachkawde was a second-team All-PSAC selection last year after turning in a record of 10-5 in singles and 11-1 in doubles play. Nansi was 8-7 in singles play and 13-4 in doubles, also earning second-team All-PSAC honors. The duo will battle for the top singles spot this season, along with **Kerstin Kloeffler**, who was 10-2 in singles and 10-3 in doubles last year. Kloeffler is expected to rejoin the team in the spring.

Seniors **Mindi Bell** and **Jolie Falkowski** and junior **Kristen Bodalski** also return. Bell is a three-year letterwinner, racking up 12 singles wins playing at fifth and sixth singles. Falkowski rejoins the Golden Bears after sitting out last season. She was 11-9 to lead the team in singles wins in 2002-03. Bodalski has tallied 15 singles victories in two years with the Golden Bears.

KU's recruiting class this year features freshmen **Vanessa Walsh (Scranton/Bishop Hannon)** and **Amy Withers (Essendon, AUSTRALIA)**.

## Facilities

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the Eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

### Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the mecca of indoor athletic activity on campus. The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the volleyball, men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room. The arena also served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004.

### KU Courts ▶

Golden Bear tennis players call the KU Courts home. Resurfaced over the summer of 2000, the KU Courts are comprised of 10 regulation size playing areas. The courts are conveniently located near Keystone Hall's locker room and sports medicine facilities.



### ◀ Risley Weight Room

Athletes get extensive use from the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

### Keystone Fieldhouse ▶

Keystone Fieldhouse is home to the KU indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The fieldhouse is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events, including space for three regulation tennis courts. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in 1994.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past nine years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class, while the 2003-04 school year saw all student-athletes achieve a highest-ever GPA of 2.86. Also last year, 87 student-athletes garnered Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete honors. During the same period, the athletic success of KU's teams reached all-time records.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

**The Monitoring of Progress:** The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored. This includes: GPA reports, persistence rate reports, close monitoring of first-time students, and NCAA eligibility compliance reports.

**Course Selection and Registration:** In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

**Academic Coaching:** This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete. The meetings are held more frequently in the fall in recognition of the benefits of establishing good habits early. During these meetings, the following topics may be addressed: seminar follow-up, class attendance, parental intervention and involvement, and information about

advising and registration. These meetings can also serve to address any other academic and/or personal matters of concern to the student-athlete.

**Faculty Advising:** This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

**Awards and Honors:** KU has developed or participates in a number of programs to provide the incentive for and acknowledgment of academic achievement. KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

**Pre-Season Academic Seminars:** During pre-season camps and the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships, and graduation planning. Materials are provided and used as a reference throughout the semester.

**Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors:** Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are required to visit the Career Services Office. They will be tested to measure their interests and help them select a major.

**Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies:** Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of this department's services in regard to tutoring or other needs for specialized instruction.

**Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center:** Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues. Such referrals are available to all student-athletes.

**Mentoring:** Student-athletes can be referred by their coach to either the formal University mentoring program or to faculty and professional staff volunteers for more informal mentoring.

**Financial Aid Liaison:** The financial aid liaison provides information to prospects and student-athletes concerning policies and guidelines of the financial aid office. Through the early version process, the liaison provides prospects with an estimate of potential funding sources. The liaison provides student-athletes with information concerning deadlines and regulations for continued financial aid, and is available to help families learn more about the financial aid process.

**Library Tour:** A library tour is required of all incoming student-athletes.

**Personal Computer:** Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

**Graduation Reception:** The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.
