SOFTBALL

History:

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Location:

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment:

Approximately 9,400 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 19 states and 39 nations are represented in the student body: 62% women, 38% men.

Academic Year:

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty:

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees:

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs:

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library:

Modern, spacious facility; 492,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities:

Gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 15 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life:

Approximately 150 student organizations include: advisory councils, academic, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station), diversified interest, Greek, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

Residence Halls:

Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style complexes and one residence house and two apartment-style complexes accommodate 4,100 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone and Internet and campus network access.

Head Coach Judy Lawes

Judy Lawes begins her 18th season as head softball coach at Kutztown University.

Last season, Lawes guided KU to a 31-19 record and a second place finish at the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional. The Golden Bears were 15-9 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) East, good for second place. It was the 16th time in 17 seasons that her team has won 20 or more games and also marked her 17th consecutive winning season.

This came a year after her Golden Bears posted a 23-18 record overall and finished third in the PSAC East with a 14-

10 record. Kutztown qualified for the Mid-Atlantic Regional, and finished fourth. Lawes led the Golden Bears to a 28-18 overall record in 2002, and to the PSAC and Mid-Atlantic Regional tournaments in both 2000 and 2001. The Golden Bears set a school record in 2000 with 19 PSAC East wins.

During her 17-year tenure at KU, Lawes has led the Golden Bears to all seven of their appearances in the NCAA Division II Tournament in the school's history. She guided them to three-straight appearances in 1994-96 and then again in 2000, 2001, 2003 and 2004.

Lawes has received many honors for her coaching accomplishments. She was named PSAC East Coach of the Year in 1989, 1994 and 2000. Lawes also garnered the Dr. Dorothy Moyer Award in 1994, 1995 and 2000, which is presented to the KU Coach of the Year for women's athletics. Other accomplishments include setting the school record for overall wins (39) in 1995 and wins in the Eastern Division (19) in 2000. Additionally, her team won a share of the PSAC East title in 1994. Lawes is among the top 25 all-time winningest softball coaches in NCAA Division II with a record of 445-287-1 and has posted 17-straight winning campaigns on the diamond since her arrival. Among her wins, 210 have come against PSAC East foes. Lawes is also Kutztown's winningest coach in school history, regardless of sport.

Lawes came to KU in 1987 as head softball coach, head women's tennis coach and assistant women's basketball coach. She held the basketball position until 1990 and the tennis position until 1991.

Lawes also serves as the director of the Judy O'Connell softball camp for girls, one of the top youth camps in the area.

Lawes received her bachelor's degree in communications from Shippensburg University in 1984 and her master's degree in counseling/student personnel from Shippensburg in 1987. In October of 2001, she was inducted into Shippensburg's Athletic Hall of Fame for her record-setting accomplishments as a softball and tennis player.

Lawes and her husband, Robert, have an 11-year-old daughter, Rachel, and five-year-old son, Ryan.

Assistant Coach Reds Moser

Reds Moser is in his second year with the Golden Bear softball program.

Moser came to KU after coaching softball at Brandywine and Kutztown high schools. Moser was the coach at Brandywine from 1996-2001 and led Kutztown High School in 2002.

Moser is a member of the All-Season Sales and Marketing men's major softball team, two-time Pennsylvania ASA state champions. He is a graduate of Parkland High School, where he played football and baseball.





KU Softball team looks to match impressive 2004 season

With most of its core returning from a team that finished 2004 with a 31-19 overall record and a second-place finish at the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional, the Kutztown University softball team has high hopes for the 2005 season.

The 2004 team, under head coach **Judy Lawes**, used strong pitching and timely hitting to place third in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) tournament and then second at the Mid-Atlantic Regional.

Pitching should be the strength of this year's team. All of the key members of the pitching staff, which finished the season with a 1.96 earned run average, return. **Natalie Buch** will look to build on an impressive freshman season that saw her set a KU record with a 1.08 ERA. A pair of tested veterans join her in the rotation. **Stacey Denlinger**, a junior, led the team with 12 wins and 90 strikeouts and posted a 1.70 ERA. Senior **Cheryl Griffith** won 11 games with a 1.65 ERA. Both Denlinger and Griffith were named to the All-Tournament team at the Mid-Atlantic Regional.

A pair of newcomers, **Rachel Weidensaul (Ashland/Cardinal Brennan)** and **Lindsay Bennett (Rising Sun, MD/Rising Sun)**, will challenge them for time inside the circle. Bennett comes to the Golden Bears after twice earning County Player of the Year honors in high school.

Shortstop **Stacy Bricker** will anchor the infield. The senior will be a four-year starter and ranked third on the team last year with a .303 batting average and led the team with 11 doubles. At the Mid-Atlantic Regional, she was selected to the All-Tournament team. Bricker has not missed a game in her three-year career.

At first base, sophomore **Kathleen Bittner** and freshman **Lindsay Bennett (Rising Sun, MD/Rising Sun)** will replace defensive standout Jess Balchikonas, who was lost to graduation. Bittner tied for the team lead with two home runs in limited duty as a freshman.

Second base will feature a platoon of freshman **Jackie Messina (Allentown/Parkland)** and Griffith, when she is not pitching. Griffith last saw extensive action there as a sophomore, hitting .327. Messina is also likely to spell Bricker at shortstop, if

needed. In high school, Messina was twice named both all-area and all-league.

Erin Livingston returns at third base. She tied for the team lead in runs batted in with 18 in 2004. Newcomers **Tarin Horonyz (Fleetwood/Fleetwood)** and **Caitlyn Hague (Lansdale/North Penn)** are expected to pose stiff competition for playing time. Horonyz was a member of the 2001 Fleetwood state championship team and was selected All-Berks County. Hague was a two-time all-league selection in high school.

Behind the plate, sophomore **Dani Spalik** returns. Spalik started 36 of the squad's 50 contests a year ago. Backup **Sara Cook**, a junior, also returns. Freshman **Jennifer Lincoln (Stafford, VA/North Stafford)** will also see time at catcher. When not catching, Lincoln will serve as the team's designated player. In high school, she was named to the all-district, all-region and all-state teams.

Speed should be abundant in the outfield, where some reshuffling will take place. **Adriane Willmer**, who split time between second base and left field last year, could move to center field to replace All-PSAC East selection Karli Hausman. Willmer served as the leadoff hitter as a freshman last year, batting .304 with a team-high 25 runs scored and four triples. She earned second team All-PSAC honors. Newcomer **Sam Flowers (Harleysville/Souderton)** may also get a look in center field.

Dani Wunderlich will return as the starting right fielder. The sophomore started 47 games as a freshman in 2004, hitting second in the order.

In left field, the picture is crowded, with no less than four players battling for time. Willmer could stay in left. If she moves to center, Flowers may see time in left. Sophomores **Megan Alexander** and **Megan Bainbridge** are also likely to see time. Alexander saw limited time a year ago, while Bainbridge led the squad with nine steals.

Versatility and athleticism will be strengths of the team, as well. The fact that four members of the squad are two sport athletes, exemplifies this. Bainbridge and Weidensaul are also members of the basketball team, while Flowers and Livingston play field hockey.

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the mecca of indoor athletic activity on campus. Keystone Hall houses a 4,000-seat arena, a 25-yard competition pool, the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room. The arena served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004.

North Campus ► Complex

North campus complex includes baseball and softball diamonds. The complex also includes the start/finish area for on-campus 5K, 6K and 8K cross country courses, as well as practice fields for the men's and women's soccer and field hockey teams.

Keystone Fieldhouse ►

Keystone Fieldhouse is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The fieldhouse is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events and many camps and clinics throughout the year. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in 1994.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past nine years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class, while the 2003-04 school year saw all student-athletes achieve a highest-ever GPA of 2.86. Also last year, 87 student-athletes garnered Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete honors. During the same period, the athletic success of KU's teams reached all-time records.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

The Monitoring of Progress: The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored. This includes: GPA reports, persistence rate reports, close monitoring of first-time students, and NCAA eligibility compliance reports.

Course Selection and Registration: In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

Academic Coaching: This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete. The meetings are held more frequently in the fall in recognition of the benefits of establishing good habits early. During these meetings, the following topics may be addressed: seminar follow-up, class attendance, parental intervention and involvement, and information about

advising and registration. These meetings can also serve to address any other academic and/or personal matters of concern to the student-athlete.

Faculty Advising: This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

Awards and Honors: KU has developed or participates in a number of programs to provide the incentive for and acknowledgment of academic achievement. KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

Pre-Season Academic Seminars: During pre-season camps and the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships, and graduation planning. Materials are provided and used as a reference throughout the semester.

Academics & Athletics at KU

Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors: Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are required to visit the Career Services Office. They will be tested to measure their interests and help them select a major.

Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies: Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of this department's services in regard to tutoring or other needs for specialized instruction.

Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center: Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues. Such referrals are available to all student-athletes.

Mentoring: Student-athletes can be referred by their coach to either the formal University mentoring program or to faculty and professional staff volunteers for more informal mentoring.

Financial Aid Liaison: The financial aid liaison provides information to prospects and student-athletes concerning policies and guidelines of the financial aid office. Through the early version process, the liaison provides prospects with an estimate of potential funding sources. The liaison provides student-athletes with information concerning deadlines and regulations for continued financial aid, and is available to help families learn more about the financial aid process.

Library Tour: A library tour is required of all incoming student-athletes.

Personal Computer: Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

Graduation Reception: The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.
