# FIELD HOCKEY

**History:**

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

**Location:**

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

**Enrollment:**

Approximately 9,400 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 19 states and 39 nations are represented in the student body: 62% women, 38% men.

**Academic Year:**

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

**Faculty:**

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

**Majors/Degrees:**

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

**Special Academic Programs:**

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

**Library:**

Modern, spacious facility; 492,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

**Special Facilities:**

Gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 15 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

**Student Life:**

Approximately 150 student organizations include: advisory councils, academic, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station), diversified interest, Greek, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

**Residence Halls:**

Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style complexes and one residence house and two apartment-style complexes accommodate 4,100 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone and Internet and campus network access.

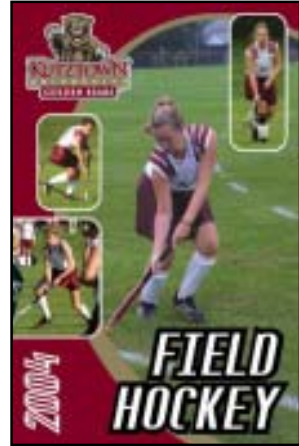

### **Head Coach Betty Wesner**

Betty Wesner enters her 25th season as head field hockey coach at Kutztown University. She is also head compliance coordinator for the entire athletic department.

Wesner has played a vital role in the growth of field hockey and women's athletics at Kutztown over the past 24 years. She has compiled a record of 236-188-15, posting winning seasons in 16 of those 24 years.

Over the past four years the Golden Bears have won 33 games, after going 7-12 overall and 6-10 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) in 2003. During the 1999 season, Wesner recorded her 200th career victory, an overtime decision over Mercyhurst with the winning goal coming from her daughter, Sarah.

In 1998, Wesner's young team reached the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Playoffs. In 1997, the Golden Bears reached the pinnacle of success, advancing to the NCAA Division II Championship game for the first time in school history. For her effort, Wesner was named National Field Hockey Coaches' Association (NFHCA) Division II Coach of the Year, as well as NFHCA South Region, PSAC, and Kutztown University Women's Coach of the Year.

Wesner was named PSAC Coach of the Year after her 1988 squad recorded a school-record 18 wins and finished fifth in the national tournament. She has captured three PAIAW conference crowns, while coaching one national player of the year, 30 national All-Americans, eight all-regional selections, 19 PAIAW all-stars, and 41 All-PSAC honorees.

Wesner served as head women's lacrosse coach at KU from 1984 until the program was discontinued in 1990. She was the director of equal opportunity in sports from 1985-1987.

Prior to KU, Wesner taught health and physical education and coached field hockey in the Twin Valley School District. Her field hockey teams won several sectional and divisional titles and county runner-up awards. Her 1975 squad won the Berks County title.

Wesner serves on several field hockey committees, including that of the PSAC and the NFHCA. She recently completed a term as Chair of the NCAA Division II Field Hockey Committee. She has served as the president of the Lehigh Valley Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women.

Wesner received a bachelor's degree in health and physical education from West Chester in 1971.

Wesner and her husband, Doug, reside in Exeter Township. Their son, Joshua, passed away in April 2000 after a courageous battle with Hodgkin's Disease. Their daughter, Sarah, was a member of the field hockey team from 1997-2000, and was a team captain in 2000. She graduated with a degree in social work and a minor in anthropology from KU in 2002. She is pursuing a master's degree in school counseling at Gwynedd-Mercy College, where she also serves as the head field hockey coach.

### **Assistant Coach Jodi Cipolla**

Jodi Cipolla begins her first season as an assistant coach at KU. She graduated from KU in 2003 with a degree in speech communication. As a member of the field hockey team, Cipolla was a four-year letter winner, a PSAC Scholar Athlete, an All-PSAC second team selection, an NFHCA North/South Senior All-Star, team captain, and team co-MVP. In 2002, Jodi served as a student assistant while completing her academic requirements.

Last year, Cipolla was an intern at Nichols College in Dudley, Massachusetts, where she was the assistant field hockey coach and the academic/athletic liaison for female athletes. She was also the field hockey sports information contact for the Commonwealth Coast Conference.

### **Student Assistant Coach Kristen Puzino**

Kristen Puzino will serve as a student assistant coach for the Golden Bears this fall, after completing her playing career in 2003.

Puzino was a two-year starter in the KU backfield, starting 37 games during her career. She also tallied two goals and five assists, for nine points. As a senior, she ranked second on the squad with three defensive saves. Puzino also earned a spot in the NFHCA Division II Senior All-Star game after the 2003 season.

A native of Ocean Township, New Jersey, Puzino will continue working on her degree in elementary education.

## Season Outlook

---

### **Golden Bear Field Hockey to Make a Run at the Post-Season in 2004**

The 2004 Kutztown University field hockey team will be in search of bids to both the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference and NCAA Championship playoffs.

To earn those bids, the Golden Bears will have to reverse recent history, having been shut out of the post-season since 1998. Three years ago, the PSAC tournament has expanded to four teams, while this fall the NCAA Championship expands to six teams. Kutztown, under the guidance of head coach Betty Wesner, will make a run at those extra post-season opportunities.

KU will have to improve upon last year's records of 7-12 overall record and 6-10 in the PSAC, if the team is to reach the playoffs. The Golden Bears played tough, with five losses coming by a single goal, including three in overtime.

Kutztown returns eight starters and 15 letterwinners to provide experience.

The KU defense will again be its strong suit. Senior **Erin Livingston** was an All-PSAC and All-America selection last season. She also contributed on offense, with three game-winning goals.

Also returning on the back line are junior **Colleen Healey** and senior **Jackie Girard**. Healey will be entering her second season as a starter after scoring three goals a year ago. Girard saw limited action as a junior, but is expected to step into the starting lineup. Sophomore **Andrea Kocher** also returns to provide depth.

In the cage for the Golden Bears will be junior **Trista Hershey**, who has started 35

games during her career. She provides an experienced and capable goalkeeper after posting a 1.90 goals-against average and notching three shutouts a year ago. She will be backed up by freshman **Samantha Flowers (Harleysville/Souderton)**.

A pair of juniors and a sophomore are expected to start in the midfield and contribute on offense and defense. Junior **Laura Kline** appeared in all 19 games, including 13 starts, last season. She had two assists. Another junior, **Jamie Kennally**, started one contest in 2003. Sophomore **Laura Belfatti** played in every game, making 12 starts.

At forward, Kutztown returns two of its top three scorers from a year ago in seniors **Ciara Borden** and **Lauren McCabe**. Borden led the team in points (14) and assists (8), while McCabe was the team's leading goal scorer (5). Joining them up front are senior **Lauren Blain** and junior **Amanda Behney**. Blain scored a pair of goals in 2003, while Behney chipped in with three. **Mandy Turner**, who scored two goals a year ago, also returns.

The Golden Bears consistently outshot their opponents in 2003. A trio of freshman forwards are coming in to help KU capitalize on those chances. **Kerri Ripker (Swarthmore/Ridley)**, **Amber Rudy (Elizabethtown/Lower Dauphin)** and **Laura Wieder (Emmaus/Emmaus)** could all see significant time.

Kutztown opens its 2004 campaign when it travels to the St. Michael's Tournament on August 28-29.

## Remembering Josh Wesner

---

Josh Wesner, son of KU field hockey coach Betty Wesner, passed away in April of 2000 after a long battle with Hodgkins Disease. He was 23 years old. Josh was a special part of the KU family.

He was a psychology major at KU with a minor in biology. In December of 2001, KU awarded Josh his diploma posthumously. He was a member of Student Government and was the president and initial organizer of Phoenix, an organization for disabled students run through the University's Human Diversity office. In addition, Josh was the scoreboard operator for the Golden Bear field hockey team and was the winner of the team's Coach's Award for inspiration in 1998.

A KU field hockey scholarship and golf tournament have been established in Josh's memory. Anyone interested in contributing to the scholarship should contact the KU Athletic Advancement Office at 610-683-4755.

Additionally, the annual tournament featuring Kutztown, Indiana (PA), Philadelphia and Catawba was named in memory of Josh.

## Facilities

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

### Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the mecca of indoor athletic activity on campus. The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the volleyball, men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams. Additionally, it served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room.

### Keystone Field ▶

Located behind Keystone Hall, Keystone Field includes the 300-seat grass home to the Golden Bear field hockey team. Beginning in 1999, the KU men's and women's soccer teams also called South Campus home, inaugurating their new facility adjacent to the field hockey field.

### Practice Fields

Kutztown expanded its practice facilities in the spring of 2004 to include new fields for field hockey and soccer on KU's North Campus.

Keystone Fieldhouse is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The fieldhouse is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in January 1995.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past nine years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class, while the 2003-04 school year saw all student-athletes achieve a highest-ever GPA of 2.86. Also last year, 87 student-athletes garnered Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete honors. During the same period, the athletic success of KU's teams reached all-time records.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

**The Monitoring of Progress:** The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored. This includes: GPA reports, persistence rate reports, close monitoring of first-time students, and NCAA eligibility compliance reports.

**Academic Support Service:** Student-athletes are encouraged to visit the academic support office in Keystone Hall for any academic problem which may arise. Confidential, one-on-one meetings can address the following concerns: information about additional services at KU, study skills tips, information about registration, and current academic performance. These sessions can also be utilized to discuss any other academic and/or personal matters of concern that the student-athlete may have.

**Course Selection and Registration:** In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

**Academic Coaching:** This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete. The meetings are held more frequently in the fall in recognition of the benefits of establishing good habits early. During these meetings, the following topics may be addressed: seminar follow-up, class attendance, parental intervention and involvement, and information about advising and registration. These meetings can also serve to address any other academic and/or personal matters of concern to the student-athlete.

**Faculty Advising:** This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

**Awards and Honors:** KU has developed or participates in a number of programs to provide the incentive for and acknowledgment of academic achievement. KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

**Pre-Season Academic Seminars:** During pre-season camps and the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships, and graduation planning. Materials are provided and used as a reference throughout the semester.

**Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors:** Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are required to visit the Career Services Office. They will be tested to measure their interests and help them select a major.

**Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies:** Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of this department's services in regard to tutoring or other needs for specialized instruction.

**Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center:** Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues. Such referrals are available to all student-athletes.

**Mentoring:** Student-athletes can be referred by their coach to either the formal University mentoring program or to faculty and professional staff volunteers for more informal mentoring.

**Financial Aid Liaison:** The financial aid liaison provides information to prospects and student-athletes concerning policies and guidelines of the financial aid office. Through the early version process, the liaison provides prospects with an estimate of potential funding sources. The liaison provides student-athletes with information concerning deadlines and regulations for continued financial aid, and is available to help families learn more about the financial aid process.

**Library Tour:** A library tour is required of all incoming student-athletes.

**Personal Computer:** Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

**Graduation Reception:** The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.
