# A Look at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania

## **History:**

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

## **Location:**

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

## **Enrollment:**

Approximately 9,400 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 19 states and 39 nations are represented in the student body: 62% women, 38% men.

## **Academic Year:**

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

## **Faculty:**

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

## **Majors/Degrees:**

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

## **Special Academic Programs:**

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

## **Library:**

Modern, spacious facility; 492,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

## **Special Facilities:**

Gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 15 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

## **Student Life:**

Approximately 150 student organizations include: advisory councils, academic, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station), diversified interest, Greek, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

## **Residence Halls:**

Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style complexes and one residence house and two apartment-style complexes accommodate 4,100 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone and Internet and campus network access.

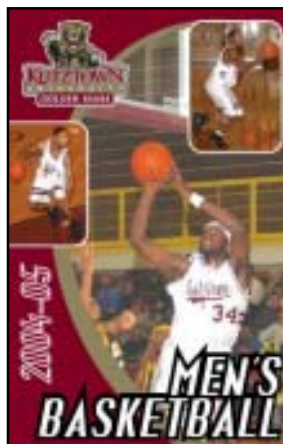

### **Head Coach** **Bernie Driscoll**

Bernie Driscoll returns for his fifth season at the helm of the men's basketball team at Kutztown University.

In his four years at the helm of the Golden Bears, Driscoll has tallied a 47-61 overall record. However, after a two-year rebuilding process, he has a 36-21 mark the past two seasons. Driscoll has led the Golden Bears to back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. His mark in PSAC East play stands at 19-29, but KU is 15-9 over the last two seasons.

Last season, Driscoll guided KU to one of the best seasons in the program's history. The Golden Bears finished 18-11 overall, including 7-5 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) East Division. KU reached the PSAC title game for the first time in 16 years. In 2002-03, Driscoll guided KU to a remarkable turnaround and earned PSAC East Coach of the Year honors in the process. After winning a combined 11 games in two years, the Golden Bears went 18-10 overall, and 8-4 in the PSAC East. The squad made its first PSAC playoff appearance since 1999, winning the second-most games in school history in the process.

Driscoll came to Kutztown from West Chester, where he served as the top assistant coach since 1987. In his final three seasons there, the Golden Rams won two PSAC East titles, and received two bids to the NCAA Tournament. WCU produced a string of three straight 20-win seasons, and appeared in the PSAC Final Four each of those three years. In addition, Driscoll was a key factor in the academic success of the Golden Ram basketball program, which boasted a 98% graduation rate for its players.

Driscoll, 49, received a bachelor's degree in biology from Dickinson College, Carlisle, PA, in 1977. While at Dickinson, he participated in varsity football and baseball. He still holds most of the career receiving records at the school. He received a master's degree in education from St. Joseph's University, Philadelphia, PA, in 1988.

Driscoll and his wife, Liz, have three children - daughters, Maureen (20) and Kelly (18), and son, Ricky (16).

### **Assistant Coach** **Tom York**



Tom York enters his fourth season as assistant men's basketball coach at Kutztown University.

A KU graduate with a bachelor's degree in elementary education, York was a three-year starter and two-time MVP selection as a Golden Bear. He earned first-team All-PSAC East honors in 1980-81. After coaching at Phoenixville and Glen Mills high schools, York compiled a 96-92 record in seven seasons as KU's head women's basketball coach (1987-94). He was named PSAC East Coach of the Year after guiding the women's basketball team to an 18-10 record in 1989-90.

York then spent four stellar seasons as head coach of girls' basketball at Wilson High School (1996-00) in West Lawn, PA. He compiled a record of 105-20, winning two county championships and three AAAA District III titles. He came back to KU from Exeter High School, where he coached girls' basketball in 2000-01.

York and his wife, Wendy, have two children - son, Travis (14) and daughter, Amanda (12).



### Golden Bears Seek to Challenge for PSAC Crown

A year after finishing 18-11 and making an appearance in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Championship game for the first time in 16 years, the Kutztown University men's basketball team is looking to continue its ascent into the conference elite.

The Golden Bears won 18 games 2003-04, matching their win total for the previous season as the second highest total in school history. This year's squad will be looking for the first run of three straight playoff appearances in school history. The team has won 36 games the past two seasons after a combined 11 during head coach Bernie Driscoll's first two rebuilding seasons.

Kutztown will have to replace standout guard Jeff Brickus, who distinguished himself as one of the program's best players in his four years at KU. He finished his career as the all-time leader in assists and scored over 1,200 points.

Despite the loss of Brickus, the Golden Bears return three senior starters who all could make a run at the 1,000-point mark, and keep KU in the mix in the competitive PSAC Eastern Division. All three - **Bilal Salaam**, **Bobby Eberhart** and **Tyree Brickus** - will serve as captains this season.

Salaam, a three-time All-PSAC East pick, returns for his senior campaign after finishing second in Division II in blocked shots during each of his first three seasons. He has shattered both the school and conference career blocks records (302) during that time. He finished second on the team with 12.6 points per game on a team-high 55 percent shooting (137-of-249) last season. He also led the team with 8.8 rebounds per game and 3.5 blocks per game.

Salaam figures into a three-man rotation in the paint, along with senior **Tyler Reynolds** and junior **Ben Arnold**. Reynolds picked up eight starts last season and averaged 3.2 ppg and 2.1 rpg, while tying for second on the team in blocks. Arnold added 2.6 ppg and 3.1 rebounds.

The Golden Bears welcome a trio of forwards as newcomers. **Brian Riggins**

(**Glenmoore/Downingtown East**) was selected to the All-Ches-Mont team. Rounding out this year's freshman class are six-foot-eight **Kevin Hafera (Red Lion/Red Lion)** and **David Benn (Coatesville/Coatesville)**. Benn, who will redshirt this season, was selected second team All-Philadelphia and first team All-Ches-Mont.

Kutztown led the PSAC in three-point accuracy a year ago, connecting on 36 percent of its attempts (210-of-579). KU also hit 30 more threes than any other conference school. The Golden Bears should once again be strong on the perimeter with the foursome of Eberhart, Tyree Brickus, junior **Frank Moultrie** and sophomore transfer **Dorian Sims (Reading/Central Catholic)**. Eberhart, Brickus and Moultrie all finished in the top ten in the PSAC in three-point accuracy.

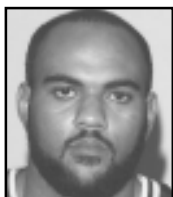
Eberhart, a three-year starter, was the team's third leading scorer as the three-guard/small forward. He averaged 11.1 ppg on 48 percent shooting (125-of-262) and 40 percent from three-point range (48-of-120). He was also second on the team in assists.

Brickus and Moultrie should once again split time at shooting guard. Brickus converted 41 percent (53-of-130) of his threes to average 8.1 ppg. Moultrie, meanwhile, led the team in three-point accuracy at 44 percent (52-of-119) and scored 7.9 points per game.

Sims redshirted last season after transferring from Shepherd College in West Virginia. Expected to step in as the starting point guard, he scored 10.2 ppg as a freshman for the Rams and hit 36 percent (44-of-121) of his threes.

Also seeing time in the backcourt will be seniors **Vince Pease** and **David Moyer** and sophomores **Terrance Davis** and **Ryan Eisenhart**. Freshman **Mike Shatzman (Pequea Valley/Paradise)** will challenge for time.

The 2004-05 season gets underway on November 15, when the Golden Bears host Columbia Union.

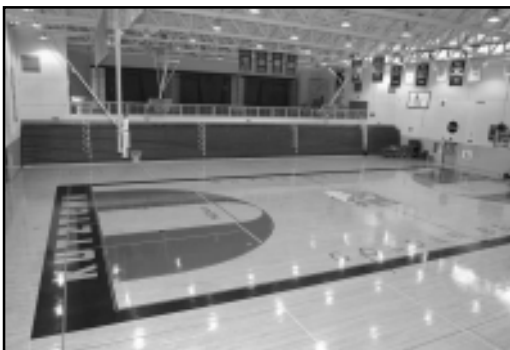
Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the Eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

### Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the mecca of indoor athletic activity on campus. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room.

#### Keystone Arena ▶

The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the Golden Bear volleyball team in the fall, and the men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams in the winter. It served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004 and was the training camp home of the NBA's New Jersey Nets in the fall of 1995.

Athletes get extensive use out of the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

#### Keystone Fieldhouse ▶

Keystone Fieldhouse is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The fieldhouse is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events and many camps and clinics throughout the year. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in 1995.

# Men's Basketball History/Honors

On January 24, 1903, then Keystone State Normal School faced off against Reading High School. Although the Maroon & Gold was defeated, 24-8, the game began a century of men's basketball that has produced numerous outstanding players and several conference championships.

The first faculty coach was also a standout player. KU Athletics Hall of Fame member George B. Ely came to Kutztown in 1905. He was a standout athlete and coach, leading the basketball team to successful records from 1905-08.

The men's basketball program reached a high level of success in the late 1910s, winning two Pennsylvania State Normal School championships. The program's first title, and the first championship in any sport at the school, came in 1917. Coach Bert Bohler and player Raymond Loose led the team to a perfect 18-0 record that season. In 1919, Bohler led an almost completely new cast of players to a second championship.

Arlan Bayer was one of the best players in the first half of the century at Kutztown. He scored 711 points from 1926-30, a scoring record that stood for 25 years. He also held records for points in a season (249) and a single game (32).

In 1936, a group of future Hall of Famers brought another title to Kutztown. Hall of Fame coach James MacGovern, and Hall of Fame players Russ Stoudt (captain), Joseph "Gino" Musso, John Polischak and George Kovich were key factors in the title run. The team finished the year 11-2, defeating West Chester, a team it had lost to earlier in the year, for the Pennsylvania State Teachers College championship.

The program, discontinued during World War II, was reinstated in 1945-46 by Hall of Fame coach Walt Risley. Risley coached the cagers until 1963. Roger Cocivera (1952-56) became the first 1,000-career point scorer, finishing with 1,231 points.

The 1960s and 1970s produced seven 1,000-point scorers, including John Cresswell, the first to eclipse 1,400 career points in 1969, and George Krell, who passed Cresswell with 1,467 points in 1970. Hall of Famer Eddie McTague set the school records for assists and steals in 1980 that still stand today.

In the mid-1980s, head coach Rick Binder produced several standout players and a three-year span of 53 wins. Hall of Famer Butch Hills set the school's scoring record with 1,525 career points. He teamed with fellow Hall of Famer Marty Eggleston, who holds the career rebounds and blocks records, to lead the 1987-88 team to a school-record 21 wins. That team also won the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Eastern Division title and qualified for the NCAA playoffs.

The 1990s produced the school's current scoring leader, Lock Jennings, who scored 1,682 points from 1989-93, and 1,000-point scorer, Keith Mackrey (1,046 from 1991-96).

In KU's second century, current head coach Bernie Driscoll has posted back-to-back 18-win seasons, and led Kutztown to an appearance in the PSAC title game. The decade has also produced the school's all-time leader in assists (425) and 1,000-point scorer Jeff Brickus (1,218 from 2000-04).

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past nine years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class, while the 2003-04 school year saw all student-athletes achieve a highest-ever GPA of 2.86. Also last year, 87 student-athletes garnered Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete honors. During the same period, the athletic success of KU's teams reached all-time records.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

**The Monitoring of Progress:** The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored. This includes: GPA reports, persistence rate reports, close monitoring of first-time students, and NCAA eligibility compliance reports.

**Academic Support Service:** Student-athletes are encouraged to visit the academic support office in Keystone Hall for any academic problem which may arise. Confidential, one-on-one meetings can address the following concerns: information about additional services at KU, study skills tips, information about registration, and current academic performance. These sessions can also be utilized to discuss any other academic and/or personal matters of concern that the student-athlete may have.

**Course Selection and Registration:** In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

**Academic Coaching:** This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete. The meetings are held more frequently in the fall in recognition of the benefits of establishing good habits early. During these meetings, the following topics may be addressed: seminar follow-up, class attendance, parental intervention and involvement, and information about advising and registration. These meetings can also serve to address any other academic and/or personal matters of concern to the student-athlete.

**Faculty Advising:** This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

**Awards and Honors:** KU has developed or participates in a number of programs to provide the incentive for and acknowledgment of academic achievement. KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

**Pre-Season Academic Seminars:** During pre-season camps and the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships, and graduation planning. Materials are provided and used as a reference throughout the semester.

**Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors:** Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are required to visit the Career Services Office. They will be tested to measure their interests and help them select a major.

**Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies:** Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of this department's services in regard to tutoring or other needs for specialized instruction.

**Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center:** Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues. Such referrals are available to all student-athletes.

**Mentoring:** Student-athletes can be referred by their coach to either the formal University mentoring program or to faculty and professional staff volunteers for more informal mentoring.

**Financial Aid Liaison:** The financial aid liaison provides information to prospects and student-athletes concerning policies and guidelines of the financial aid office. Through the early version process, the liaison provides prospects with an estimate of potential funding sources. The liaison provides student-athletes with information concerning deadlines and regulations for continued financial aid, and is available to help families learn more about the financial aid process.

**Library Tour:** A library tour is required of all incoming student-athletes.

**Personal Computer:** Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

**Graduation Reception:** The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.
