History:

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Location:

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment:

Approximately 9,400 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 19 states and 39 nations are represented in the student body: 62% women, 38% men.

Academic Year:

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty:

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees:

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs:

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library:

Modern, spacious facility; 492,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities:

Gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 15 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life:

Approximately 150 student organizations include: advisory councils, academic, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station), diversified interest, Greek, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffee-house, financial center and cyberlounge.

Residence Halls:

Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style complexes and one residence house and two apartment-style complexes accommodate 4,100 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone and Internet and campus network access.

Head Coach Otto Ormosi

Otto Ormosi begins his seventh season as head coach of the men's soccer program at Kutztown University. Ormosi's 53-52-7 record in his first six seasons as head coach gives him the highest winning percentage in KU men's soccer history.

Last year, Ormosi's squad went 8-7-4, including 4-4-0 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC). The season culminated as the Golden Bears defeated California (PA), 4-3, to finish above .500 for the first time since the 2000 season. The team finished at .500 for the 2002 season.

Ormosi's players have won a number of awards in his six seasons. They have earned 15 All-PSAC awards, as well as seven All-Region selections. In 2000, John Lapore was named the PSAC Rookie of the Year.

In 1999, Ormosi guided the Golden Bears to their winningest season in school history. Kutztown was 12-7, shattering the previous wins record of nine set in 1975 and equalled in 1991. In PSAC action, KU was 4-4. In 1998, Ormosi's first KU squad was 7-11 overall. During Ormosi's six seasons, the Golden Bears have posted a 37-22-5 record against non-conference foes.

Ormosi came to Kutztown from Raritan Valley Community College in Somerville, NJ, where he was the head men's soccer coach from 1988-1997. Over his 10 seasons at Raritan Valley, Ormosi compiled a mark of 102-66-12. He led his team to winning records in seven of his last eight years, and eight regional tournament appearances between 1990 and 1997.

In 1997, Ormosi's final team at Raritan Valley finished 18-4-1. The team won the regional championship and finished with a national ranking of fifth. For his effort, Ormosi was named New Jersey Soccer Coaches Association, Garden State Athletic Conference and National Soccer Coaches Association of America Mid-Atlantic Coach of the Year.

Prior to Raritan Valley, Ormosi was the head soccer coach at Delaware Valley Regional High School from 1984-87. He led his squad to two league titles during that time.

Ormosi, a resident of Ottsville, PA, and native of Middlesex, NJ, received a bachelor's degree in education from the College of Emporia (KS) in 1970. He holds a master's degree in physical education and athletic administration from Trenton State College (now the College of New Jersey).

Assistant Coach Skip Sibiski



Skip Sibiski enters his first season as a member of the Kutztown staff. He will serve as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's teams.

Sibiski previously served as an assistant boys coach at Brandywine Heights High School for three years. He has also been the girls head coach at Brandywine Heights since 2003. Sibiski has 11 years of coaching experience at the club level.

Sibiski played collegiately at Moravian, graduating in 2002 with a degree in financial economics. He and his wife, Shannon, reside in Kutztown with their children, Kirby (8) and Beckham (5).



Young Golden Bear Men's Soccer Team Looking to Rebuild in 2004

The 2004 Kutztown University men's soccer team will be looking to rebuild this season after a successful 2003 campaign. With the arrival of this year's talented recruiting class and the leadership and experience of the returning letterwinners, the Golden Bears hope to continue in the right direction under head coach Otto Ormosi.

The Golden Bears are coming off a season in which they finished 8-7-4, including a 4-4 mark in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).

In order for Kutztown to reach the postseason, they will have to do it without All-Region players E.T. Hunter and John Lapore. Lapore finished his career with a school-record 24 assists, along with 39 goals, and was second all-time with 102 points. Hunter finished second all-time in assists with 23.

Kutztown returns three starters and 11 letterwinners in 2004. Among those returners are four seniors, who will be looking to lead this young team on and off the field. Combined with a top level recruiting class, KU is on the right track towards the playoffs.

This season's team is led by one of the toughest defenses in years. **Jason Sherman** will anchor the defense from the goalkeeper position. Sherman played every minute in goal last season, recording a 1.35 goals-against average, with 75 saves and seven shutouts. He is two shutouts away from tying the KU career record. **Ryan Kratz (Perkiomenville/Boyertown)** and **Sam Skiles (Narvon/Pequea Valley)** will serve as backups.

Leading the defensive backfield is junior **Marc Benson**. Benson brings experience to the field, and will play the entire game if necessary. **Steve Gorski** has good speed, improved ball-handling, and will look to start this season. Senior **Bob St. Laurent** appeared in 15 games last season, and will be taking a new position as the team's stopper this season. Rounding out the defense is **Mike Schendock**.

Newcomers **Chris Shepherd (Eagleville/Methacton)**, **Christopher VanDeBoe (Aston/Sun Valley)**, and **Luke Ott (Pottsville/Blue Mountain)** will challenge him for playing time.

The midfield features four returning players. Junior **Alan Hallman** (goal, assist) and senior **Stephen Blank** will run the midfield. Blank is versatile, and may play several positions. Sophomore **Kareef Wallace** will be a big presence in the starting lineup, and is able to play either forward or defense. Sophomore **Dan Wilson** (goal) has good speed, which he showed subbing for injured players last season.

Freshmen midfielders **Matt Kade (Quakertown/Quakertown)** and **Collin Dalton (Carlisle/Big Spring)** will be counted upon to provide depth.

The offense features two hard working players taking charge of the scoring. Sophomore **Jim D'Angelo** (4 goals, assist) is the team's leading returning scorer. D'Angelo looks to build off his performance of 2003 and impact the team more this season. **Brian Walter**, who played in 17 games last season, will step into a starting role and add to the offense.

Newcomers **Mike McCabe (Shohola/Delaware Valley)**, **Greg Sassaman (Blairstown, NJ/North Warren)**, **Giovanni Russo (Washington, NJ/Warren Hills)**, **Antoine Bell (Duola, CAMEROON/Bridgton Academy {VT})** and **Chris Capone (Southold, NY/Southold)** will add depth and skill to an otherwise talented front line. McCabe and Sassaman were all-state selections in high school.

The schedule will be tough this season for the Golden Bears. Nine of the teams they will face were ranked last season.

The 2004 season begins on September 1st at home against Bloomfield. KU begins its PSAC schedule on September 18th at Shippensburg.

Facilities

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the mecca of indoor athletic activity on campus. The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the volleyball, men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams. Additionally, it served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams and a state-of-the-art fitness room.

Keystone Field ▶

Located behind Keystone Hall, Keystone Field includes the 500-seat grass home to the Golden Bear men's and women's soccer programs. The facility, which debuted in 1999, sits adjacent to the KU field hockey field.

Athletes get extensive use out of the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

Practice Fields

Kutztown expanded its practice facilities in the spring of 2004 to include new fields for field hockey and soccer on KU's North Campus.

Keystone Fieldhouse ▶

Keystone Fieldhouse is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The fieldhouse is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events and many camps and clinics throughout the year. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in 1995.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past nine years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class, while the 2003-04 school year saw all student-athletes achieve a highest-ever GPA of 2.86. Also last year, 87 student-athletes garnered Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete honors. During the same period, the athletic success of KU's teams reached all-time records.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

The Monitoring of Progress: The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored. This includes: GPA reports, persistence rate reports, close monitoring of first-time students, and NCAA eligibility compliance reports.

Academic Support Service: Student-athletes are encouraged to visit the academic support office in Keystone Hall for any academic problem which may arise. Confidential, one-on-one meetings can address the following concerns: information about additional services at KU, study skills tips, information about registration, and current academic performance. These sessions can also be utilized to discuss any other academic and/or personal matters of concern that the student-athlete may have.

Course Selection and Registration: In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

Academic Coaching: This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete. The meetings are held more frequently in the fall in recognition of the benefits of establishing good habits early. During these meetings, the following topics may be addressed: seminar follow-up, class attendance, parental intervention and involvement, and information about advising and registration. These meetings can also serve to address any other academic and/or personal matters of concern to the student-athlete.

Faculty Advising: This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

Awards and Honors: KU has developed or participates in a number of programs to provide the incentive for and acknowledgment of academic achievement. KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

Pre-Season Academic Seminars: During pre-season camps and the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships, and graduation planning. Materials are provided and used as a reference throughout the semester.

Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors: Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are required to visit the Career Services Office. They will be tested to measure their interests and help them select a major.

Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies: Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of this department's services in regard to tutoring or other needs for specialized instruction.

Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center: Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues. Such referrals are available to all student-athletes.

Mentoring: Student-athletes can be referred by their coach to either the formal University mentoring program or to faculty and professional staff volunteers for more informal mentoring.

Financial Aid Liaison: The financial aid liaison provides information to prospects and student-athletes concerning policies and guidelines of the financial aid office. Through the early version process, the liaison provides prospects with an estimate of potential funding sources. The liaison provides student-athletes with information concerning deadlines and regulations for continued financial aid, and is available to help families learn more about the financial aid process.

Library Tour: A library tour is required of all incoming student-athletes.

Personal Computer: Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

Graduation Reception: The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.
