# WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

**History:**

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

**Location:**

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

**Enrollment:**

Approximately 9,400 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 19 states and 39 nations are represented in the student body: 62% women, 38% men.

**Academic Year:**

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

**Faculty:**

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

**Majors/Degrees:**

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

**Special Academic Programs:**

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

**Library:**

Modern, spacious facility; 492,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

**Special Facilities:**

Gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 15 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

**Student Life:**

Approximately 150 student organizations include: advisory councils, academic, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station), diversified interest, Greek, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

**Residence Halls:**

Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style complexes and one residence house and two apartment-style complexes accommodate 4,100 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone and Internet and campus network access.

**Head Coach**  
**Janet Malouf**

Janet Malouf is in her 11th season as head women's basketball coach at Kutztown University.

Malouf guided the Golden Bears to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference playoffs for the ninth consecutive season last year. Overall, her team finished 9-18 and 5-7 in the PSAC Eastern Division, good for fourth place.

During her ten seasons at Kutztown, Malouf has led the Golden Bears to more wins (163) and PSAC East victories (75) than any previous coach. She has been named PSAC East Coach of the Year twice (1995-96, 1997-98), while eight of her players have earned a total of 18 All-PSAC East awards. She has coached one PSAC Player of the Year and one PSAC Rookie of the Year. She holds a 163-110 overall record.

Malouf has had the two winningest seasons in school history. In 1999-2000, the Golden Bears set a school record with 21 victories. During that season, Malouf became Kutztown's first women's basketball coach to win 100 career games. In 1995-96, Malouf's squad won a then school-record 20 games, including a 9-3 mark in the PSAC East and a share of the regular season division title. The Golden Bears advanced to the NCAA Regional Playoffs for the first time in school history.

During the 1997-98 and 1998-99 seasons, Kutztown advanced to the semifinals of the PSAC Playoffs for just the second and third times in school history, respectively.

Prior to Kutztown, Malouf was the assistant women's basketball coach at Lafayette College for four seasons. The Leopards had winning campaigns three of the four seasons during her tenure. Malouf received her master's degree in sports management from Purdue University in 1990, where she served as a volunteer basketball assistant.

In addition to her Division I coaching experience, Malouf also played at Division I powerhouse Rutgers University, where she received her bachelor's degree in sports management. She was a four-year starter under head coach Theresa Grentz, who was also the coach of the 1992 U.S. Olympic women's basketball team. Malouf helped the Scarlet Knights to the NCAA tournament four-straight years, finishing in the Elite Eight in 1986 and 1987 and in the Sweet 16 in 1988. She held the university's assist record for men and women (718 career, 209 season) until 2001. Last April, she was inducted into the Rutgers Women's Basketball Hall of Fame.

**Assistant Coach**  
**Steve Hahn**

Steve Hahn is in his 19th season with Golden Bear basketball. Hahn is now in his tenth season as assistant women's basketball coach after serving nine seasons as the assistant men's basketball coach.

Hahn is primarily responsible for on-floor coaching, scouting and the academic progress of players.

During his tenure at KU as men's assistant coach (1986-95), the Golden Bears advanced to the PSAC finals and earned the school's first-ever invitation to the NCAA Division II Tournament. Prior to KU, Hahn served as head men's coach at Reading High School and posted a 43-15 record.

Hahn owns a bachelor's degree from Albright and a master's degree from Temple.





# Golden Bears Look for 10th-Straight PSAC Playoff Appearance

The Kutztown University women's basketball team will enter the 2004-05 season in search of its 10th-straight trip to the post-season and will attempt to climb back over the .500 mark after back-to-back overall losing records.

The 2004-05 team will be young, with just one senior, but the returnees have seen a lot of time already and should be prepared to handle larger roles. Add in a deep cast of newcomers and KU appears up to the challenge.

The Golden Bears must find replacements for three-point artists Danielle Warntz and Amanda Zinobile, last year's leading scorers. The pair left Kutztown as the two most prolific long-range shooters in school history.

**Megan Bainbridge**, a sophomore, joined them in the backcourt and returns to build on a strong freshman season. Bainbridge led the team in assists (116), steals (46) and three-point accuracy (33 percent). The point guard also averaged 7.7 points per game.

Four players, two newcomers and two returners, will compete for the other guard position. Freshman **Rachel Weidensaul (Ashland/Cardinal Brennan)** can play either guard or forward and helped her high school to a pair of district titles. Fellow newcomer **Nicole Germani (Birdsboro/Daniel Boone)** should also compete for time in the backcourt. She was twice named to the All-Berks County team.

**Sara Elliot** and **Jen Loprete** also return in the backcourt. Elliot, a junior, saw action in 16 contests. A sophomore, Loprete was used sparingly. Both will compete for more minutes this season.

Junior **Monique Boykins** will be the

Golden Bears' primary force in the paint once again. A second-team All-PSAC East selection, Boykins stepped up her play as a sophomore, leading the conference in shot blocking with 63. She also led the team in rebounding (8.8) and was third in scoring (8.0). The junior picked up her play significantly down the stretch as KU made its playoff push.

Junior **Trish Dudeck**, sophomores **Jess Brady** and **Jackie Daley** and senior **Brooke Martin** also return in the frontcourt. Each saw action in the starting lineup last year. Brady started 15 games a year ago and chipped in with 5.8 ppg and 4.0 rpg. Dudeck led the team in field goal percentage (57 percent) and averaged 4.4 ppg and 3.6 rpg in 23 contests, including 18 starts. Daley averaged just 3.2 ppg and 2.8 rpg, but stepped up her game over the final few contests. Martin, the team's lone senior, picked up a pair of starts in 24 games.

As many as five newcomers will be fighting for time in the frontcourt. **Maritza Reyna (Burlington, NJ/Burlington Twp.)** should compete for time on the wing. **Mercedes Van Wagner (Mullica Hill, NJ/Clearview Regional)** is a 6-2 center who may team with Boykins immediately in the paint. **Katie Harlor (Danville/Danville)** comes to Kutztown after setting a career scoring mark in high school. **Molly Brown (Kennett Square/Kennett)** is an athletic player in the post who should fight for time.

Kutztown's season begins on November 15, when the Golden Bears host Columbia Union.

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the Eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

### Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the mecca of indoor athletic activity on campus. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room.

#### Keystone Arena ▶

The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the Golden Bear volleyball team in the fall, and the men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams in the winter. It was also the training camp home of the NBA's New Jersey Nets in the fall of 1995. Additionally, it served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004.

Athletes get extensive use out of the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

#### Keystone Fieldhouse ▶

Keystone Fieldhouse is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The fieldhouse is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in January 1995.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past nine years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class, while the 2003-04 school year saw all student-athletes achieve a highest-ever GPA of 2.86. Also last year, 87 student-athletes garnered Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete honors. During the same period, the athletic success of KU's teams reached all-time records.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

**The Monitoring of Progress:** The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored. This includes: GPA reports, persistence rate reports, close monitoring of first-time students, and NCAA eligibility compliance reports.

**Academic Support Service:** Student-athletes are encouraged to visit the academic support office in Keystone Hall for any academic problem which may arise. Confidential, one-on-one meetings can address the following concerns: information about additional services at KU, study skills tips, information about registration, and current academic performance. These sessions can also be utilized to discuss any other academic and/or personal matters of concern that the student-athlete may have.

**Course Selection and Registration:** In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

**Academic Coaching:** This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete. The meetings are held more frequently in the fall in recognition of the benefits of establishing good habits early. During these meetings, the following topics may be addressed: seminar follow-up, class attendance, parental intervention and involvement, and information about advising and registration. These meetings can also serve to address any other academic and/or personal matters of concern to the student-athlete.

**Faculty Advising:** This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

**Awards and Honors:** KU has developed or participates in a number of programs to provide the incentive for and acknowledgment of academic achievement. KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

**Pre-Season Academic Seminars:** During pre-season camps and the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships, and graduation planning. Materials are provided and used as a reference throughout the semester.

**Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors:** Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are required to visit the Career Services Office. They will be tested to measure their interests and help them select a major.

**Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies:** Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of this department's services in regard to tutoring or other needs for specialized instruction.

**Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center:** Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues. Such referrals are available to all student-athletes.

**Mentoring:** Student-athletes can be referred by their coach to either the formal University mentoring program or to faculty and professional staff volunteers for more informal mentoring.

**Financial Aid Liaison:** The financial aid liaison provides information to prospects and student-athletes concerning policies and guidelines of the financial aid office. Through the early version process, the liaison provides prospects with an estimate of potential funding sources. The liaison provides student-athletes with information concerning deadlines and regulations for continued financial aid, and is available to help families learn more about the financial aid process.

**Library Tour:** A library tour is required of all incoming student-athletes.

**Personal Computer:** Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

**Graduation Reception:** The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.
