History:

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Location:

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment:

Approximately 9,400 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 19 states and 39 nations are represented in the student body: 62% women, 38% men.

Academic Year:

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty:

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees:

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs:

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library:

Modern, spacious facility; 492,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities:

Gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 15 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life:

Approximately 150 student organizations include: advisory councils, academic, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station), diversified interest, Greek, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

Residence Halls:

Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style complexes and one residence house and two apartment-style complexes accommodate 4,100 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone and Internet and campus network access.

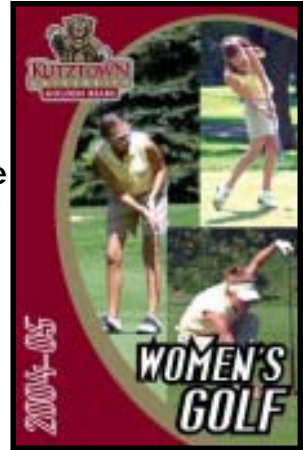

Head Coach **Robert Fisher**

Robert Fisher enters his fourth season as head coach of the women's golf team at Kutztown University.

Fisher took over the reigns of the program in January of 2002, guiding the program through the second half of its sophomore season of existence. The Golden Bears, competing against all men's teams, placed sixth at the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Championships. In 2003, Fisher's team again placed sixth, but improved by 29 strokes and boasted the PSAC tournament MVP, Jessica May, who placed 15th. The team continued its improvement last season, slashing another 41 strokes from its score.

Fisher also serves as head coach of Kutztown's wrestling program. Over the past five years, Fisher has amassed a dual meet record of 41-25. His wrestlers have earned four All-America honors. He served as assistant coach with the Golden Bear wrestling program from 1990-2000.

Prior to coming to Kutztown, Fisher served as assistant wrestling coach at his alma mater, Hazleton High School, from 1987-90. Fisher was a two-time district wrestling champion at Hazleton and a three-time northeast regional runner-up. He captured the District 11 championship and went on to win the District 2 championship when Hazleton changed districts. He still holds the record for the most wrestling wins in school history. A two-sport athlete, he was also a member of the 1984 Big 33 Football Team.

Fisher received his bachelor's degree in special education for the visually impaired from Kutztown in 1995. He went on to serve as a teacher of the blind/visually impaired at the Capital Area Intermediate Unit, in Summerdale, PA, from 1996-99. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in education from Bloomsburg University.

Associate Coach **Jason Barkley**

Jason Barkley is in his third season as associate coach of the women's golf team.

Barkley is a familiar face around Kutztown University, having graduated from KU with bachelor's degrees in finance and economics in 1991 and an MBA in 1993.

As an undergraduate, Barkley was a member of the Golden Bear track & field and cross country teams, as well as the men's golf team in the late 1980s.

In addition to his coaching duties, Barkley has remained an active supporter of Kutztown University Athletics. He has served on the board of the Golden Bear Club and Hall of Fame committee.

An avid golfer, Barkley maintains a two handicap and is a three-time qualifier for the Pennsylvania Amateur Tournament.





KU Women's Golf Team Enters 2004-05 Year With NCAA Regional Hopes

The Kutztown University women's golf program will begin its fifth season after ending last year ranked in the region's top ten for the first time in the program's history.

Last year, the Golden Bears firmly established themselves among women's golf programs in the region with a solid season. KU knocked over 21 strokes off its team average per round for a school record total of 364.6. The team also shot a school record score at the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Championships. The Golden Bears compete in the tournament as the only women's team, competing against five men's squads.

Returning for his third full year and fourth overall as head coach this season is **Robert Fisher**. Coach Fisher's squad will feature three returners from last year and an infusion of young talent. After breaking into the region's top ten last year, KU has its sights set on an NCAA Regional appearance. To do so, the Golden Bears will need to move into the top six.

Holly Shubilla leads the trio of returnees, all of whom are in just their second full season. A sophomore, Shubilla was one of the Golden Bears' top golfers a year ago. She averaged 87.4 shots per round, the second-best average in school history. The highlight of her freshman season was a school-record 78 on a par 74 course at the Cortland State Invitational. Shubilla finished with a two-day 160, good for fourth place. She also added fourth place finishes at the Kutztown Fall Invitational and the Gettysburg Spring Invitational. She finished fifth at the Kutztown Spring Invitational, and seventh at both the Lehigh Invitational and the Mount Saint Mary's Invitational.

Also returning are **Tristin Suzenski**

and **Colleen Casey**. Suzenski played in all 21 rounds a year ago and was fourth on the team with a 94.9 scoring average. She chipped a full stroke off her average from the fall season to the spring. Suzenski was consistent as a freshman and shot her low round of 87 on the second day of the Cortland Invitational. Casey saw limited action in her first year on the squad, playing in just four rounds. She averaged 115.8, with a low round of 110 at the Kutztown Spring Invitational.

Competing with those three for time will be a foursome of newcomers. **Andrea Ely (Oley/Oley Valley)** transfers to KU from the Golf Academy of the Carolinas. She placed 25th at the PIAA Championships in 2001. **Angela Petak (Brockway/Brockway Area)** was the District IX runner-up in high school and also placed 26th at the PIAA Championships. **Amy Miller (Schuylkill Haven/Schuylkill Haven)** and **Megan Olzewski (Kennett Square/Unionville)** round out the class. Miller was a four-year letterwinner in high school, while Olzewski sat out her freshman season at Kutztown.

The newcomers will have to replace several talented players. Jess May was a former Kutztown Female Rookie of the Year and would have led the team in scoring had she played enough rounds last year. She turned in an average of 85.4, good enough for a school-record, but played in only 13 of the team's 21 rounds. Also gone is Laura Boyko, a four year member of the KU top-four scorers. She was third on the team last year with an 89.1 average. Boyko and classmate Tara Redcay were the first four-year members of the Kutztown golf team.

The fall season gets underway on Thursday, September 9 when the Golden Bears host the KU Fall Invitational at Berkleigh Country Club.

Berkleigh Country Club



The Berkleigh Country Club enters its fourth season as the home of Kutztown University Women's Golf.

Berkleigh has held a tradition of challenging golf and family activity since 1926. This private club, founded by residents of Berks and Lehigh counties, features an 18-hole golf course designed by Robert White, the first president of the PGA. Over the decades, the course has enjoyed a rich history of tournament golf from the Reading Open of the 1950s to the First Union Betsy King Classic, which recently marked its fifth year on the LPGA tour. The "Club" is a member of the Philadelphia Golf Association, USGA, and Berks County Golf Association.

The golf course at Berkleigh is a par 74 and 5,899 yards of rolling countryside enriched with woods and

streams. Enjoyable for golfers at any level, the course includes four sets of tee placements. For members looking to improve their game or to warm up before their round, there is a driving range, large practice bunker, and practice green.

In addition to the golf course, Berkleigh's grounds include four tennis courts that are spacious enough for singles, doubles, or for the whole family to play together. The Olympic-size heated swimming pool grants members an extension on the swimming season. Private lessons are offered for both tennis and swimming, in addition to a mini-swim team for children.

Women's Golf at Kutztown

Women's golf continues to grow on the collegiate level. During the 2003-04 school year, 99 schools sponsored the sport at the NCAA Division II level.

In 2000, the NCAA sponsored a separate Division II and III women's golf championship for the first time.

Kutztown was the first school in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) to add women's golf as a varsity sport. West Chester will join Kutztown

as the only other women's golf team in the PSAC this spring. Upon Kutztown's implementation of women's golf, the PSAC Board of Directors voted to allow women's golf programs to compete with the men's golf teams at the PSAC championship. This began with the 2000-01 school year, and will continue until such time as there are enough teams for a separate women's championship.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past nine years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class, while the 2003-04 school year saw all student-athletes achieve a highest-ever GPA of 2.86. Also last year, 87 student-athletes garnered Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete honors. During the same period, the athletic success of KU's teams reached all-time records.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

The Monitoring of Progress: The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored. This includes: GPA reports, persistence rate reports, close monitoring of first-time students, and NCAA eligibility compliance reports.

Academic Support Service: Student-athletes are encouraged to visit the academic support office in Keystone Hall for any academic problem which may arise. Confidential, one-on-one meetings can address the following concerns: information about additional services at KU, study skills tips, information about registration, and current academic performance. These sessions can also be utilized to discuss any other academic and/or personal matters of concern that the student-athlete may have.

Course Selection and Registration: In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

Academic Coaching: This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete. The meetings are held more frequently in the fall in recognition of the benefits of establishing good habits early. During these meetings, the following topics may be addressed: seminar follow-up, class attendance, parental intervention and involvement, and information about advising and registration. These meetings can also serve to address any other academic and/or personal matters of concern to the student-athlete.

Faculty Advising: This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

Awards and Honors: KU has developed or participates in a number of programs to provide the incentive for and acknowledgment of academic achievement. KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

Pre-Season Academic Seminars: During pre-season camps and the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships, and graduation planning. Materials are provided and used as a reference throughout the semester.

Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors: Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are required to visit the Career Services Office. They will be tested to measure their interests and help them select a major.

Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies: Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of this department's services in regard to tutoring or other needs for specialized instruction.

Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center: Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues. Such referrals are available to all student-athletes.

Mentoring: Student-athletes can be referred by their coach to either the formal University mentoring program or to faculty and professional staff volunteers for more informal mentoring.

Financial Aid Liaison: The financial aid liaison provides information to prospects and student-athletes concerning policies and guidelines of the financial aid office. Through the early version process, the liaison provides prospects with an estimate of potential funding sources. The liaison provides student-athletes with information concerning deadlines and regulations for continued financial aid, and is available to help families learn more about the financial aid process.

Library Tour: A library tour is required of all incoming student-athletes.

Personal Computer: Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

Graduation Reception: The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.
