A Look at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania



History:

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Location:

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment:

Approximately 9,800 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 19 states and 39 nations are represented in the student body: 58% women, 42% men.

Academic Year:

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty:

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees:

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs:

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library:

Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities:

Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 30 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life:

Approximately 160 student organizations include: advisory councils, academic, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffee-house, financial center and cyberlounge.

Residence Halls:

Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,300 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

Head Coach **Janet Malouf**

Janet Malouf is in her 12th season as head women's basketball coach at Kutztown University.

Malouf guided the Golden Bears to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference playoffs for the 10th consecutive season last year. Overall, her team finished 12-15 and 5-7 in the PSAC Eastern Division, good for fourth place.

During her 11 seasons at Kutztown, Malouf has led the Golden Bears to more wins (175) and PSAC East victories (80) than any previous coach. She has been named PSAC East Coach of the Year twice (1995-96, 1997-98), while eight of her players have earned a total of 18 All-PSAC East awards. She has coached one PSAC Player of the Year and two PSAC Rookies of the Year. She holds a 175-125 overall record.

Malouf has had the two winningest seasons in school history. In 1999-2000, the Golden Bears set a school record with 21 victories. During that season, Malouf became Kutztown's first women's basketball coach to win 100 career games. In 1995-96, Malouf's squad won a then school-record 20 games, including a 9-3 mark in the PSAC East and a share of the regular season division title. The Golden Bears advanced to the NCAA Regional Playoffs for the first time in school history.

During the 1997-98 and 1998-99 seasons, Kutztown advanced to the semifinals of the PSAC Playoffs for just the second and third times in school history, respectively.

Prior to Kutztown, Malouf was the assistant women's basketball coach at Lafayette College for four seasons. The Leopards had winning campaigns three of the four seasons during her tenure. Malouf received her master's degree in sports management from Purdue University in 1990, where she served as a volunteer basketball assistant.

In addition to her Division I coaching experience, Malouf also played at Division I powerhouse Rutgers University, where she received her bachelor's degree in sports management. She was a four-year starter under head coach Theresa Grentz, who was also the coach of the 1992 U.S. Olympic women's basketball team. Malouf helped the Scarlet Knights to the NCAA tournament four-straight years, finishing in the Elite Eight in 1986 and 1987 and in the Sweet 16 in 1988. She held the university's assist record for men and women (718 career, 209 season) until 2001. In 2003, she was inducted into the Rutgers Women's Basketball Hall of Fame.

Assistant Coach **Steve Hahn**

Steve Hahn is in his 20th season with Golden Bear basketball. Hahn is now in his 11th season as assistant women's basketball coach after serving nine seasons as the assistant men's basketball coach.

Hahn is primarily responsible for on-floor coaching, scouting and the academic progress of players.

During his tenure at KU as men's assistant coach (1986-95), the Golden Bears advanced to the PSAC finals and earned the school's first-ever invitation to the NCAA Division II Tournament. Prior to KU, Hahn served as head coach of boys baseball at Reading High School and posted a 43-15 record.

Hahn owns a bachelor's degree from Albright and a master's degree from Temple.





Golden Bears Feature Young Team with Veteran Experience

The Kutztown University women's basketball team looks to improve on a 12-15 campaign in 2004-05, including a 5-7 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) East record, this upcoming season. Despite the losing record, Kutztown qualified for the PSAC Playoffs for the 10th consecutive season. All but two players return for another attempt at posting a record above .500 and a post-season berth.

The Golden Bears displayed head coach **Janet Malouf's** trademark defense in 2004-05. KU was the PSAC's top rebounding team last year (44.7 rebounds/game), while leading the PSAC in defensive field goal percentage (35 %) and blocked shot average (4.41 per game).

The 2005-06 team will feature three seniors, three juniors, six sophomores, and four incoming freshman. The team is still young, but the experience gained last season will help Kutztown remain in the thick of the playoff race.

PSAC East Rookie of the Year **Mercedes Van Wagner** led the Golden Bears with 291 points, averaging 10.8 points per game. Van Wagner also led the team with 211 rebounds and shot 53 percent from the field.

Rachel Weidensaul returns to the Golden Bears after a successful freshman season, earning her a projected starting position at shooting guard for the upcoming season. She averaged 9.3 points per game in 23 starts, and was tied for the team-lead in steals with 29. She was second on the team with 59 assists.

Megan Bainbridge is entering her junior year at Kutztown, and looks to be a force on the team. Bainbridge averaged 5.6 points last season and was the team's three-point leader, connecting on 21 trifectas. She tallied 96 assists last season, averaging 4.2 per game. Her average was good enough for tenth in the league.

Monique Boykins returns to the

Golden Bears for her senior season. Boykins held her ground in the paint last season, ranking second on the team with 39 blocked shots and 196 rebounds. She led the Golden Bears with 8.2 rebounds per game, and ranked tenth in the league.

Sara Elliot and **Trish Dudeck** both return for their senior seasons, while **Jess Brady** returns for her junior season. All three players were mainly back up players last season, but Brady did start nine of her 23 appearances. She averaged 10.3 points and 5.9 rebounds. Dudeck started one of her 25 appearances, netting 3.8 points and 3.2 boards per game. Both Brady and Dudeck connected on 78 percent of their free throw attempts, to tie for the team lead. Elliot played 215 minutes last season and tallied 36 points off of the bench.

Sophomores **Lisi Reyna**, **Nicole Germani**, **Katie Harlor**, **Molly Brown**, and junior **Jenn Loprete** also return this season. As a freshman, Reyna made 25 appearances and averaged 2.2 points. Germani appeared in 23 games and played a total of 195 minutes. Harlor appeared in 22 games last season and supported the team by averaging 3.1 points and 2.5 rebounds per game. Brown appeared in 11 games and averaged 2.4 points and 1.9 rebounds. Loprete, going into her junior year, appeared in six games last season.

Newcomers **Lara Dellegrotti** (**Berwick/Berwick**) and **Tricia McElmoyle** (**Jim Thorpe/Marian Catholic**) will be battling for a starting position at guard. Dellegrotti is the second leading scorer in Berwick girls basketball history, while McElmoyle was named first team All-State her senior year.

Two other newcomers will be competing for time on the floor. Forward **Amy Yutko** (**Frackville, PA/North Schuylkill**) and guard **Kelley Healey** (**Toms River, NJ/Toms River North**) will look to showcase their skills for playing time.

Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the hub of indoor athletic activity on campus. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room.

Keystone Arena ►

The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the Golden Bear volleyball team in the fall, and the men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams in the winter. It was also the training camp home of the NBA's New Jersey Nets in the fall of 1995. Additionally, it served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004.

Keystone Field House ►

Keystone Field House is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The field house is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in January 1995.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past 10 years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class, while the 2004-05 school year saw all student-athletes achieve a highest-ever GPA of 2.91, surpassing the overall GPA of the Kutztown student body. Also last year, 103 student-athletes garnered Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete honors. During the same period, the athletic success of KU's teams reached all-time records.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

The Monitoring of Progress: The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored. This includes: GPA reports, persistence rate reports, close monitoring of first-time students, and NCAA eligibility compliance reports.

Course Selection and Registration: In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

Academic Coaching: This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete. The meetings are held more frequently in the fall in recognition of the benefits of establishing good habits early. During these meetings, the following topics may be addressed: seminar follow-up, class attendance, parental intervention and involvement and information about advising and registration. These meetings can also serve to address any other academic and/or personal matters of concern to the student-athlete.

Faculty Advising: This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

Pre-Season Academic Seminars: During pre-season camps and/or the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships and graduation planning. Materials are provided and used as a reference throughout the semester.

Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors: Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are highly encouraged to visit the Career Services Office. There, the students will be tested to measure their interests and help them select a major.

Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies: Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of the Department of Developmental Studies' services in regard to tutoring or other needs for specialized instruction.

Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center: Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues. Such referrals are available to all student-athletes.

Mentoring: Student-athletes can be referred by their coach to either the formal University mentoring program or to faculty and professional staff volunteers for more informal mentoring.

Financial Aid Liaison: The financial aid liaison provides information to prospects and student-athletes concerning policies and guidelines of the financial aid office. Through the early version process, the liaison provides prospects with an estimate of potential funding sources. The liaison provides student-athletes with information concerning deadlines and regulations for continued financial aid, and is available to help families learn more about the financial aid process.

Library Tour: A library tour is highly recommended of all incoming student-athletes.

Personal Computer: Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

Recognition of Academic Accomplishments

The Department of Athletics has developed a comprehensive program to provide incentive for and acknowledgement of the many academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. Below are some examples of the program.

Graduation Reception: The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.

Awards and Honors: KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

Scholar-Athlete Banquet: Each year, the PSAC Scholar-Athletes are recognized at a banquet in their honor.

Dean's List Ceremony: All Kutztown University student-athlete dean's list recipients are acknowledged at a basketball game every year.
