History:

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Location:

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment:

Approximately 9,800 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 19 states and 39 nations are represented in the student body: 58% women, 42% men.

Academic Year:

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty:

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees:

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs:

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library:

Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities:

Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 30 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life:

Approximately 160 student organizations include: advisory councils, academic, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

Residence Halls:

Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,300 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

Head Coach Betty Wesner

Betty Wesner enters her 26th season as head field hockey coach at Kutztown University. She is also head compliance coordinator for the entire athletic department.

Wesner has played a vital role in the growth of field hockey and women's athletics at Kutztown over the past 25 years. She has compiled a record of 250-194-15, posting winning seasons in 17 of those 25 years.

Last year, Kutztown returned to the post-season with a 14-6 campaign. The Golden Bears qualified for the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Playoffs and were ranked as high as fourth among NCAA Division II teams and third in the South Region. Wesner, the 2004 PSAC Coach of the Year, recorded her 250th career win vs. Shippensburg.

Over the previous four years, the Golden Bears won 33 games. During the 1999 season, Wesner recorded her 200th career victory, an overtime decision over Mercyhurst, with the winning goal scored by her daughter, Sarah. In 1998, Wesner's team reached the PSAC Playoffs.

In 1997, the Golden Bears reached the pinnacle of success, advancing to the NCAA Division II Championship game for the first time in school history. For her effort, Wesner was named National Field Hockey Coaches' Association (NFHCA) Division II Coach of the Year, as well as NFHCA South Region, PSAC, and Kutztown University Women's Coach of the Year.

Wesner was named PSAC Coach of the Year after her 1988 squad recorded a school-record 18 wins and finished fifth in the national tournament. She has captured three PAIAW conference crowns, while coaching one national player of the year, 32 national All-Americans, eight all-regional selections, 19 PAIAW all-stars, and 44 All-PSAC honorees.

Wesner has taken her team on international tours to Great Britain, Holland and Australia, to compete against some of the best teams those countries have to offer.

Wesner served as head women's lacrosse coach at KU from 1984 until the program was discontinued in 1990. She was the director of equal opportunity in sports from 1985-1987.

Prior to KU, Wesner taught health and physical education and coached field hockey in the Twin Valley School District. Her field hockey teams won several sectional and divisional titles and county runner-up awards. Her 1975 squad won the Berks County title.

Wesner serves on several field hockey committees, including that of the PSAC and the NFHCA. She recently completed a term as Chair of the NCAA Division II Field Hockey Committee. She has served as the president of the Lehigh Valley Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women.

Wesner received a bachelor's degree in health and physical education from West Chester in 1971.

Wesner and her husband, Doug, reside in Exeter Township. Their son, Joshua, passed away in April 2000 after a courageous battle with Hodgkin's Disease. Their daughter, Sarah, was a member of the field hockey team from 1997-2000, and was a team captain in 2000. She graduated with a degree in social work and a minor in anthropology from KU in 2002. She is pursuing a master's degree in school counseling at Gwynedd-Mercy College, where she also serves as the head field hockey coach and assistant lacrosse coach.

Assistant Coach Jodi Cipolla

Jodi Cipolla begins her second season as an assistant coach at KU. She graduated from KU in 2003 with a degree in speech communication. As a member of the field hockey team, Cipolla was a four-year letter winner, a PSAC Scholar Athlete, an All-PSAC second team selection, an NFHCA North/South Senior All-Star, team captain, and team co-MVP. In 2002, Jodi served as a student assistant while completing her academic requirements.

Prior to returning to KU, Cipolla was an intern at Nichols College in Dudley, Massachusetts, where she was the assistant field hockey coach and the academic/athletic liaison for female athletes. She was also the field hockey sports information contact for the Commonwealth Coast Conference.





Coaching Staff



Student Assistant Erin Livingston

Erin Livingston will serve as a student assistant coach at KU in 2005 after wrapping up a distinguished playing career at KU. Livingston, a two-time All-America and All-PSAC pick, is the Golden Bears' all-time leader with 23 defensive saves and all three of her career goals were game-winners. Livingston was also a four-year starter on the Kutztown softball team and ranks third all-time with 39 doubles. A native of Philadelphia, she is a recipient of a 2005-06 NCAA Division II Degree Completion award, as she will finish her bachelor's degree in elementary education-mathematics this year.

Intern Assistant Jen DeNault

Jen DeNault joins the staff at Kutztown as an intern after a stellar career at Lock Haven. She finished her career with the Bald Eagles after tallying 22 goals and 19 assists for 63 points. In 2003, she was named the NCAA Division II and PSAC Player of the Year, and was a four-time All-America and All-PSAC selection.



Season Outlook

Golden Bears Look for Another Post-Season Bid

The 2005 Kutztown University field hockey team will look to expand on last year's successful season that resulted in a trip to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) semifinals. The Golden Bears will seek a trip to the NCAA playoffs for the first time since the tournament expanded to six teams last season. KU will have the benefit of a new artificial turf field, which should make play more consistent.

Head coach **Betty Wesner** will have a group of well-seasoned veterans to lead the post-season push. The team's strength should once again be its defense, despite the loss of All-America back Erin Livingston. Senior **Colleen Healey**, a second-team All-American, will lead the backfield. In 2004, she had three goals, three assists and two defensive saves.

Joining Healey in the back will be **Jaime Kennally** and **Amanda Behney**. Behney was the team's third-leading scorer last year with 14 points, but moves to the back this fall to replace Livingston. Kennally adds experience to the backfield through quickness and knowledge of KU's defensive scheme.

Laura Belfatti and **Laura Kline** return as starters in the midfield. Belfatti tied for second on the team with six goals scored. Kline, a second team All-PSAC team pick, was second on the squad with four assists and added a pair of goals.

On the front line, the team will need to replace a pair of departed starters. **Mandi**

Turner is Kutztown's top returning scorer with six goals, three assists and 15 points in 2004. **Lauren McCabe** also returns with her 11 points from four goals and three assists. **Heather Hoxter** scored three goals as a key reserve last season, and **Laura Wieder** should also play a larger role. **Tristin Ludy** should provide depth.

Three-year starting goalkeeper **Trista Hershey** returns for her senior season. She has started 55 career games, posting career bests with a 1.30 goals-against average and six shutouts in 2004. **Sam Flowers** will serve as her backup.

Coach Wesner is excited about an incoming recruiting class that should contribute as freshmen. **Kelly Healey (Toms River, NJ/Toms River North)**, sister of Colleen, will look to challenge for time after earning All-State honors in New Jersey. **Lindsey Bozarth (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood)** will also compete for time at forward. In the midfield and backfield, **Courtney Geibel (Mifflintown/Juniata)** will provide depth. Bozarth and Geibel were both all-conference picks in high school.

Those three newcomers are also excellent students and should help KU maintain its excellence in the classroom. Kutztown was third in Division II with a 3.30 GPA in 2004.

KU opens its season at the Shippensburg Tournament with a contest against Southern Connecticut State on August 26 at 11:30 AM.

Remembering Josh Wesner

Josh Wesner, son of KU field hockey coach Betty Wesner, passed away in April of 2000 after a long battle with Hodgkins Disease. He was 23 years old. Josh was a special part of the KU family.

He was a psychology major at KU with a minor in biology. In December of 2001, KU awarded Josh his diploma posthumously. He was a member of Student Government and was the president and initial organizer of Phoenix, an organization for disabled students run through the University's Human Diversity office. In addition, Josh was the scoreboard operator for the Golden Bear field hockey team and was the winner of the team's Coach's Award for inspiration in 1998.

A KU field hockey scholarship and golf tournament have been established in Josh's memory. Anyone interested in contributing to the scholarship should contact the KU Athletic Advancement Office at 610-683-4755.

Additionally, the annual tournament featuring Kutztown, Indiana (PA), Philadelphia and Catawba was named in memory of Josh.

Facilities

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

University Field/ Keystone Hall ▶

During the summer of 2005, Kutztown University embarked upon major renovations to University Field, the new home of the Golden Bear field hockey team. Kutztown replaced the natural grass field with new, state-of-the-art, synthetic athletic turf. In addition,

the track surrounding the field was re-surfaced and lights will be installed, though they will not be activated until the completion of the new student-recreation center, being built near the stadium, in 2006. Around the new field lies a 5,600-seat stadium. It features a state-of-the-art scoreboard that debuted in the fall of 2001.

Keystone Hall (pictured in the background, above) houses the athletics offices, Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room.

Keystone Field, the team's former competition field located behind Keystone Hall, will remain in service as a backup game field and practice facility for the Golden Bears.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past 10 years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class, while the 2004-05 school year saw all student-athletes achieve a highest-ever GPA of 2.91, surpassing the overall GPA of the Kutztown student body. Also last year, 103 student-athletes garnered Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete honors. During the same period, the athletic success of KU's teams reached all-time records.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

The Monitoring of Progress: The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored. This includes: GPA reports, persistence rate reports, close monitoring of first-time students, and NCAA eligibility compliance reports.

Course Selection and Registration: In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

Academic Coaching: This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete. The meetings are held more frequently in the fall in recognition of the benefits of establishing good habits early. During these meetings, the following topics may be addressed: seminar follow-up, class attendance, parental intervention and involvement and information about advising and registration. These meetings can also serve to address any other academic and/or personal matters of concern to the student-athlete.

Faculty Advising: This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

Pre-Season Academic Seminars: During pre-season camps and/or the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships and graduation planning. Materials are provided and used as a reference throughout the semester.

Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors: Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are highly encouraged to visit the Career Services Office. There, the students will be tested to measure their interests and help them select a major.

Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies: Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of the Department of Developmental Studies' services in regard to tutoring or other needs for specialized instruction.

Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center: Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues. Such referrals are available to all student-athletes.

Mentoring: Student-athletes can be referred by their coach to either the formal University mentoring program or to faculty and professional staff volunteers for more informal mentoring.

Financial Aid Liaison: The financial aid liaison provides information to prospects and student-athletes concerning policies and guidelines of the financial aid office. Through the early version process, the liaison provides prospects with an estimate of potential funding sources. The liaison provides student-athletes with information concerning deadlines and regulations for continued financial aid, and is available to help families learn more about the financial aid process.

Library Tour: A library tour is highly recommended of all incoming student-athletes.

Personal Computer: Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

Recognition of Academic Accomplishments

The Department of Athletics has developed a comprehensive program to provide incentive for and acknowledgement of the many academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. Below are some examples of the program.

Graduation Reception: The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.

Awards and Honors: KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

Scholar-Athlete Banquet: Each year, the PSAC Scholar-Athletes are recognized at a banquet in their honor.

Dean's List Ceremony: All Kutztown University student-athlete dean's list recipients are acknowledged at a basketball game every year.
