History:

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Location:

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment:

Approximately 9,800 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 19 states and 39 nations are represented in the student body: 58% women, 42% men.

Academic Year:

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty:

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees:

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs:

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library:

Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities:

Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 30 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life:

Approximately 160 student organizations include: advisory councils, academic, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffee-house, financial center and cyberlounge.

Residence Halls:

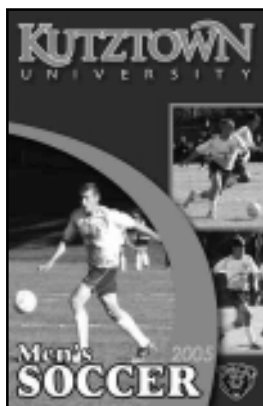
Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,300 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

Head Coach **Otto Ormosi**

Otto Ormosi begins his eighth season as head coach of the men's soccer program at Kutztown University. Ormosi's 62-61-9 record in his first seven seasons as head coach gives him the highest winning percentage in KU men's soccer history.

Last year marked the third consecutive season the Golden Bears finished at or above .500. Ormosi's squad completed 2004 at 9-9-2 overall and 3-5 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC). That followed a 2003 season when KU went 8-7-4, including 4-4-0 in

league play.

Ormosi's players have won a number of awards in his seven seasons. They have earned 16 All-PSAC awards, as well as eight All-Region selections. In 2000, John Lapore was named the PSAC Rookie of the Year.

In 1999, Ormosi guided the Golden Bears to their winningest season in school history. Kutztown was 12-7, shattering the previous wins record of nine set in 1975 and equaled in the 1991. In PSAC action, KU was 4-4. In 1998, Ormosi's first KU squad was 7-11 overall. During Ormosi's tenure, the Golden Bears have posted a 43-26-7 record against non-conference foes.

Ormosi came to Kutztown from Raritan Valley Community College in Somerville, NJ, where he was the head men's soccer coach from 1988-1997. Over his 10 seasons at Raritan Valley, Ormosi compiled a mark of 102-66-12. He led his team to winning records in seven of his last eight years, and eight regional tournament appearances between 1990 and 1997.

In 1997, Ormosi's final team at Raritan Valley finished 18-4-1. The team won the regional championship and finished with a national ranking of fifth. For his effort, Ormosi was named New Jersey Soccer Coaches Association, Garden State Athletic Conference and National Soccer Coaches Association of America Mid-Atlantic Coach of the Year.

Prior to Raritan Valley, Ormosi was the head soccer coach at Delaware Valley Regional High School from 1984-87. He led his squad to two league titles during that time.

Ormosi, a native of Middlesex, N.J., received a bachelor's degree in education from the College of Emporia (Ks.) in 1970. He holds a master's degree in physical education and athletic administration from Trenton State College (now the College of New Jersey). He and his wife, Linda, reside in Ottsville.

Assistant Coach **Skip Sibiski**

Skip Sibiski enters his second season as a member of the Kutztown staff. He will serve as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's teams.

Sibiski previously served as an assistant boys coach at Brandywine Heights High School for three years. He has also been the girls head coach at Brandywine Heights since 2003. Sibiski has 11 years of coaching experience at the club level.

Sibiski played collegiately at Moravian, graduating in 2002 with a degree in financial economics. He and his wife, Shannon, reside in Kutztown with their children, Kirby (9) and Beckham (6).





Golden Bears Eye Post-Season in 2005

The Kutztown University Golden Bears will feature a balanced roster of experienced veterans and talented newcomers in 2005. With seven starters and 13 letterwinners back, the Golden Bears hope to make a run for a post-season playoff berth under eighth-year head coach **Otto Ormosi**.

Kutztown finished the 2004 campaign with a 9-9-2 overall record, including a 3-5 mark in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference.

The unquestioned strength of the team will be the defense, with starters returning at goalkeeper and three of the four defensive positions.

Senior **Jason Sherman** is back for his third year starting in goal for the Golden Bears. Sherman netted a 1.74 goals-against average with 68 saves in almost 1,500 minutes last season. Sherman is the school's career record holder in shutouts with 10.

Sophomore **Ryan Kratz** also returns. Kratz averaged 2.14 goals against in 379 minutes last fall.

Sophomore **Collin Dalton** and junior **Steve Gorski** return as starters and will be joined by converted forward **Brian Walter** in the backfield this fall. Dalton and Gorski combined to start 39 games a year ago. Walter, a senior, was second on the team in points with 16 and led the squad with eight assists in 2004. He switched to defense in the spring and strengthened the already veteran unit.

The other starting defender slot is up for grabs. Sophomore **Luke Ott** and newcomer **Rick Zimmerer (Franklin, NJ/Wallkill Valley)**, a transfer from Sussex County Community College, are the front runners. Also returning at back is sophomore **Christian dos Santos**.

Senior first-team All-PSAC selection **Marc Benson** will anchor the midfield. Benson led the team with six goals and 17 total points. Fellow senior **Alan Hallman** returns to the

offensive end of the midfield, pending recovery from an off-season injury. He tallied two goals and six assists in 2004. Rounding out the returning starters in the midfield is junior **Jim D'Angelo**, who had three goals and an assist last season.

The defensive midfield position should be manned by sophomore **Chris Capone**, who saw action in 14 games last season.

An off-season injury may hamper **Matt Kade** in securing a full-time starting job in the midfield. Kade tallied a goal and two assists in 19 games, including seven starts, as a rookie.

Two newcomers are expected to fight for starting midfielder positions. **Jesse Novatski (Clarks Summit/Abington Heights)** and **Bryce Slattery (Williamsport/Williamsport)** should see ample time in the middle.

Other newcomers in the midfield hoping to make an impact include **Bill Frosoni (North Plainfield, NJ/North Plainfield)** and **Charlie Kulp (State College/State College)**.

Playing at the forward striker position is expected to be **Greg Sassaman**, who sat out last year. Newcomer **Carl Gompf (Milford, NJ/Delaware Valley)** also looks to contribute.

An always grueling schedule will be much more difficult this season, with double the number of conference games. The PSAC added a second game against each league opponent in 2005. The top four teams qualify for the PSAC Playoffs.

The men's soccer team will be the first Golden Bear team to open its season in 2005, with a contest vs. New York Tech on August 26 at the Shippensburg Classic. The PSAC schedule opens soon after, with the Golden Bears hosting East Stroudsburg on August 31 in the home opener at Keystone Field.

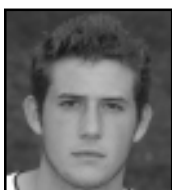

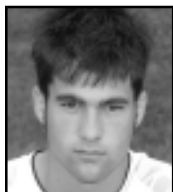

Facilities

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the mecca of indoor athletic activity on campus. The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the volleyball, men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams. Additionally, it served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams and a state-of-the-art fitness room.

Keystone Field▶

Located behind Keystone Hall, Keystone Field includes the 500-seat grass home to the Golden Bear men's and women's soccer programs. The facility debuted in 1999.

Athletes get extensive use out of the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

Practice Fields

Kutztown expanded its practice facilities in the spring of 2004 to include new fields for field hockey and soccer on KU's North Campus.

Keystone Field House▶

Keystone Field House is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The field house is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events and many camps and clinics throughout the year. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in 1995.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past 10 years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class, while the 2004-05 school year saw all student-athletes achieve a highest-ever GPA of 2.91, surpassing the overall GPA of the Kutztown student body. Also last year, 103 student-athletes garnered Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete honors. During the same period, the athletic success of KU's teams reached all-time records.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

The Monitoring of Progress: The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored. This includes: GPA reports, persistence rate reports, close monitoring of first-time students, and NCAA eligibility compliance reports.

Course Selection and Registration: In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

Academic Coaching: This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete. The meetings are held more frequently in the fall in recognition of the benefits of establishing good habits early. During these meetings, the following topics may be addressed: seminar follow-up, class attendance, parental intervention and involvement and information about advising and registration. These meetings can also serve to address any other academic and/or personal matters of concern to the student-athlete.

Faculty Advising: This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

Pre-Season Academic Seminars: During pre-season camps and/or the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships and graduation planning. Materials are provided and used as a reference throughout the semester.

Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors: Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are highly encouraged to visit the Career Services Office. There, the students will be tested to measure their interests and help them select a major.

Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies: Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of the Department of Developmental Studies' services in regard to tutoring or other needs for specialized instruction.

Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center: Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues. Such referrals are available to all student-athletes.

Mentoring: Student-athletes can be referred by their coach to either the formal University mentoring program or to faculty and professional staff volunteers for more informal mentoring.

Financial Aid Liaison: The financial aid liaison provides information to prospects and student-athletes concerning policies and guidelines of the financial aid office. Through the early version process, the liaison provides prospects with an estimate of potential funding sources. The liaison provides student-athletes with information concerning deadlines and regulations for continued financial aid, and is available to help families learn more about the financial aid process.

Library Tour: A library tour is highly recommended of all incoming student-athletes.

Personal Computer: Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

Recognition of Academic Accomplishments

The Department of Athletics has developed a comprehensive program to provide incentive for and acknowledgement of the many academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. Below are some examples of the program.

Graduation Reception: The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.

Awards and Honors: KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

Scholar-Athlete Banquet: Each year, the PSAC Scholar-Athletes are recognized at a banquet in their honor.

Dean's List Ceremony: All Kutztown University student-athlete dean's list recipients are acknowledged at a basketball game every year.
