A Look at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania



History:

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Location:

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment:

Approximately 9,800 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 19 states and 39 nations are represented in the student body: 58% women, 42% men.

Academic Year:

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty:

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees:

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs:

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library:

Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities:

Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 30 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life:

Approximately 160 student organizations include: advisory councils, academic, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

Residence Halls:

Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,300 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

Head Coach **Jeff Schellenberger**

Jeff Schellenberger enters his eleventh season as head coach of the women's soccer program at Kutztown University. He was KU's coach from 1989-91, serving as interim coach of the men's program in 1992. He returned to Kutztown as head women's soccer coach in 1998 and has since turned the program into one of the most competitive in the region.

Schellenberger's teams have won 14 games each of the past two seasons, the most wins in a season in KU women's soccer history.

In 2004, his squad finished 14-5-2 overall and 8-3-1 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division, earning him PSAC East and KU Women's Athletics Coach of the Year honors. The team won the school's first ever division title and reached the PSAC title game for the first time.

In 2003, Schellenberger coached the Golden Bears to a 14-4-3 overall record and a 9-2-1 mark in the PSAC. The conference victories were the most-ever in a season at KU. Kutztown reached the PSAC quarterfinals and qualified for the NCAA Division II Championship for the first time in school history. For his efforts, Schellenberger was named the KU Women's Athletics Coach of the Year.

The 2002 squad went 10-7-2 overall and 4-7 in the PSAC, after an injury-plagued 2001 squad finished 7-12, 2-9 in the PSAC. The 2000 team finished 7-7-3. His troops were 7-11 in 1999, posting four more wins than the previous year.

Schellenberger returned to Kutztown from Lebanon Valley College, where he was the assistant women's soccer coach in 1997. Prior to Lebanon Valley, he was the head men's soccer coach at Albright College from 1994-96. In addition, Schellenberger served as head coach of Schuylkill Valley High School's girls soccer program from 1992-2004.

Schellenberger, a resident of Kutztown, earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from Randolph-Macon (VA) College in 1984. In 1992, he completed a master's degree in sport and recreation management at Temple University.

In 1993, Schellenberger received the USSF "A" license for coaching. He is an EPYSA staff coach and instructor. In the summer of 2000, he served as coordinator for the National USSF Coaching School held at KU. In 2002, Schellenberger became director of the Student-Athlete Mentor (SAM) program.

Assistant Coach **Skip Sibiski**

Skip Sibiski enters his second season as a member of the Kutztown staff, serving as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's teams.

Sibiski previously served as an assistant boys coach at Brandywine Heights High School for three years. He has also been the girls head coach at Brandywine Heights since 2003. Sibiski has 11 years of coaching experience at the club level. Sibiski played collegiately at Moravian, graduating in 2002 with a degree in financial economics. He and his wife, Shannon, reside in Kutztown with their children, Kirby (9) and Beckham (6).





Golden Bear Women's Soccer Team Looks to Continue Winning Ways

Coming off the two winningest seasons in school history, the Kutztown University women's soccer team is set to make another run at the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference playoffs and the NCAA Northeast Regional.

The 2004 season saw KU win the PSAC's first-ever Eastern Division title after the league split into two divisions. The Golden Bears earned their first trip to the conference championship game. For the second straight year, the Golden Bears won a school-record 14 games, including a best-ever eight game winning streak during the year.

With eight returning starters, several key reserves and a talented incoming class, the 2005 Golden Bear women's soccer team should once again be among the elite in the PSAC. Head coach **Jeff Schellenberger** also has four All-PSAC East players returning, including the PSAC East and KU Female Rookie of the Year, **Kim Kelty**, and **Kelly Murdock**, who earned All-Region honors.

Kelty and Murdock led a deep and talented group of newcomers now entering its second year in the program. The duo tied for third on the team with 15 points each from their midfield positions. Kelty had five goals and five assists, while Murdock had four goals and a team-high seven helpers.

Senior **Jeannine Bria** and junior **Ashley Smith** join them in the starting midfield. Smith, a two-year starter, had six goals and six assists to finish second on KU in scoring. She also notched four game-winning goals. Bria, an All-PSAC East second team pick and three-year starter, tallied three goals and a pair of assists.

Two more sophomores, **Jen Jordan** and **Allyson Dattola**, are expected to play larger roles for Kutztown after each player missed time due to injury in 2004. New-

comers **Xiomara Marin** (West Paterson, NJ/Passaic Valley), **Jackie Toutkoushian** (Doylestown/Central Bucks East) and **Cheyenne Brunner** (Sunbury/Shikellamy) will compete for time in the midfield.

In the backfield, KU returns starters **Erin Gallagher**, **Mallary Kamen** and **Becky Worley**. Gallagher, a senior, is expected to provide leadership to the Golden Bears. She started all 21 games in 2004. Kamen, a junior, started 12 contests, while playing in all 21. Worley started 12 matches before injuries curtailed her freshman season. Junior **Shelby Varone** could also start after serving as a reserve her first two seasons. Junior **Maureen Bell** returns to the backfield after sitting out 2004. Lock Haven transfer **Ann Fink** (so. Fleetwood/Fleetwood) and freshman **Brie Dougher** (Medford Lakes, NJ/Shawnee) should also see action.

All-PSAC second teamer **Julie Folsom** returns at forward for the Golden Bears. As the team's leading scorer, she found the back of the net a team-high 12 times and added a pair of assists for 26 points. Five of her goals were game-winners. The second starting forward could come from the freshman class in the form of Brunner, Toutkoushian, Marin or **Jessica Barrett** (Coopersburg/Allentown Central Catholic).

Goalkeeper **Mandi Johnsen** is KU's all-time leader with 13 shutouts, but had her 2004 season wiped out due to injury. If she is not ready for the start of this season, **Lesley Freer** will get the nod in net. She played in six games a freshman with a 0.62 goals against average last year. Mansfield transfer **Nicole Rodweller** (Easton/Easton) will also challenge for minutes in goal.

The Golden Bears open the 2005 season with a home match against 2004 NCAA Division II runner-up Adelphi on August 27.

Facilities

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the Eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall, is the hub of indoor athletic activity on campus. The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the volleyball, men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room. Additionally, it served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004.

Keystone Field ▶

Located behind Keystone Hall, Keystone Field includes the 500-seat grass home to the Golden Bear men's and women's soccer programs. The facility debuted in 1999.

Athletes get extensive use out of the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

Practice Fields

Kutztown expanded its practice facilities in the spring of 2004 to include new fields for field hockey and soccer on KU's North Campus.

Keystone Field House ▶

Keystone Field House is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The field house is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in January 1995.

KU Athletics Hall of Fame



Kirsten Hansen Cherneskie ('90) became the first member of the women's soccer program to be inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2000. She was a standout performer during the early days of women's soccer at KU. Cherneskie, then Kirsten Hansen, played from 1986 to 1989. She led the team with a school record 19 goals and 40 points in 1987, when KU won a school-record 11 games. The 11-win mark was bettered in 2003 and 2004, but her single season records still stand. She scored a school-record four goals twice, once in 1986 and 1987. She was named the team's most-valuable player, while earning All-Region honors in 1988 and 1989 (honorable mention). Cherneskie

still holds KU's career goals scored (43) and points scored (94) records. Also a standout in the classroom, she graduated with honors in 1990. She is a member of the Phi Sigma Iota and Kappa Delta Pi, national honor societies. A native of Perkasio, PA, she graduated from Penn Ridge High School. Cherneskie teaches in the Pottstown School District and has four children with her husband, John.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past 10 years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class, while the 2004-05 school year saw all student-athletes achieve a highest-ever GPA of 2.91, surpassing the overall GPA of the Kutztown student body. Also last year, 103 student-athletes garnered Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Scholar-Athlete honors. During the same period, the athletic success of KU's teams reached all-time records.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

The Monitoring of Progress: The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored. This includes: GPA reports, persistence rate reports, close monitoring of first-time students, and NCAA eligibility compliance reports.

Course Selection and Registration: In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

Academic Coaching: This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete. The meetings are held more frequently in the fall in recognition of the benefits of establishing good habits early. During these meetings, the following topics may be addressed: seminar follow-up, class attendance, parental intervention and involvement and information about advising and registration. These meetings can also serve to address any other academic and/or personal matters of concern to the student-athlete.

Faculty Advising: This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

Pre-Season Academic Seminars: During pre-season camps and/or the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships and graduation planning. Materials are provided and used as a reference throughout the semester.

Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors: Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are highly encouraged to visit the Career Services Office. There, the students will be tested to measure their interests and help them select a major.

Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies: Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of the Department of Developmental Studies' services in regard to tutoring or other needs for specialized instruction.

Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center: Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues. Such referrals are available to all student-athletes.

Mentoring: Student-athletes can be referred by their coach to either the formal University mentoring program or to faculty and professional staff volunteers for more informal mentoring.

Financial Aid Liaison: The financial aid liaison provides information to prospects and student-athletes concerning policies and guidelines of the financial aid office. Through the early version process, the liaison provides prospects with an estimate of potential funding sources. The liaison provides student-athletes with information concerning deadlines and regulations for continued financial aid, and is available to help families learn more about the financial aid process.

Library Tour: A library tour is highly recommended of all incoming student-athletes.

Personal Computer: Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

Recognition of Academic Accomplishments

The Department of Athletics has developed a comprehensive program to provide incentive for and acknowledgement of the many academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. Below are some examples of the program.

Graduation Reception: The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.

Awards and Honors: KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

Scholar-Athlete Banquet: Each year, the PSAC Scholar-Athletes are recognized at a banquet in their honor.

Dean's List Ceremony: All Kutztown University student-athlete dean's list recipients are acknowledged at a basketball game every year.
