History:

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Location:

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment:

Approximately 10,000 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 24 states and 38 nations are represented in the student body: 60% women, 40% men.

Academic Year:

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty:

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees:

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs:

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library:

Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities:

Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 30 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life:

Nearly 200 student organizations include: academic, advisory councils, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station and student newspaper), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The McFarland Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

Residence Halls:

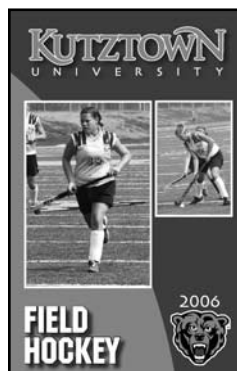
Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,434 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

Head Coach Betty Wesner

Betty Wesner enters her 27th season as head field hockey coach at Kutztown University.

Wesner has played a vital role in the growth of field hockey and women's athletics at Kutztown over the past 26 years. She has compiled a record of 265-200-15, posting winning seasons in 18 of those 26 years.

In the past two seasons, Wesner's teams have combined for 29 wins and back-to-back trips to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Playoffs. In 2005, the Golden Bears were ranked as high as third among NCAA Division II teams and second in the South Region. In 2004, KU ranked as high as fourth in Division II and third in the region. Wesner, the 2004 PSAC Coach of the Year, recorded her 250th career win vs. Shippensburg in 2004.

Over the previous four years, the Golden Bears won 33 games. During the 1999 season, Wesner recorded her 200th career victory, an overtime decision over Mercyhurst, with the winning goal scored by her daughter, Sarah. In 1998, Wesner's team reached the PSAC Playoffs.

In 1997, the Golden Bears reached the pinnacle of success, advancing to the NCAA Division II Championship game for the first time in school history. For her effort, Wesner was named National Field Hockey Coaches' Association (NFHCA) Division II Coach of the Year, as well as NFHCA South Region, PSAC, and Kutztown University Women's Coach of the Year.

Wesner was named PSAC Coach of the Year after her 1988 squad recorded a school-record 18 wins and finished fifth in the national tournament. She has captured three PAIAW conference crowns, while coaching one national player of the year, 36 national All-Americans, eight all-regional selections, 19 PAIAW all-stars, and 49 All-PSAC honorees.

Wesner has taken her team on international tours to Great Britain, Holland and Australia, to compete against some of the best teams those countries have to offer.

Wesner served as head women's lacrosse coach at KU from 1984 until the program was discontinued in 1990. She was the director of equal opportunity in sports from 1985-1987.

Prior to KU, Wesner taught health and physical education and coached field hockey in the Twin Valley School District. Her field hockey teams won several sectional and divisional titles and county runner-up awards. Her 1975 squad won the Berks County title.

Wesner serves on several field hockey committees, including that of the PSAC, NFHCA and the NCAA national selection committee. She has served as the president of the Lehigh Valley Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women.

Wesner received a bachelor's degree in health and physical education from West Chester in 1971. Wesner and her husband, Doug, reside in Exeter Township. Their son, Joshua, passed away in April 2000 after a courageous battle with Hodgkin's Disease. Their daughter, Sarah, was a member of the field hockey team from 1997-2000, and was a team captain in 2000. She graduated with a degree in social work and a minor in anthropology from KU in 2002. She completed her master's degree in school counseling at Gwynedd-Mercy College, where she also serves as the head field hockey coach, assistant lacrosse coach, senior women's administration and coordinator of intramural's and facilities.

Assistant Coach Jodi Cipolla

Jodi Cipolla begins her third season as an assistant coach at KU. She graduated from KU in 2003 with a degree in speech communication. As a member of the field hockey team, Cipolla was a four-year letter winner, a PSAC Scholar Athlete, an All-PSAC second team selection, an NFHCA North/South Senior All-Star, team captain, and team co-MVP. In 2002, Jodi served as a student assistant while completing her academic requirements.

Prior to returning to KU, Cipolla was an intern at Nichols College in Dudley, Massachusetts, where she was the assistant field hockey coach and the academic/athletic liaison for female athletes. She was also the field hockey sports information contact for the Commonwealth Coast Conference.





Student Assistant Colleen Healey

Colleen Healey enters her first season on the Golden Bear field hockey coaching staff, after completing a stellar playing career last season.

Healey, a two-year captain, was a two-time National Field Hockey Coaches Association All-America selection, earning first team honors in 2005 and second-team status in 2004. She was a first-team All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference selection in 2005 and a four-time NFHCA Academic squad honoree.

Healey graduated in May 2005 with a degree in elementary education, and is currently pursuing a master's degree as a reading specialist.

Season Outlook

Young Golden Bears Look for Post-Season Bid

The 2006 Kutztown University field hockey team will look to expand on last year's successful season that resulted in a trip to its second straight Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) semifinals.

Head coach **Betty Wesner** will have a young team to work with, however, returning are the teams top three scorers from last year. **Kelley Healey**, **Lindsey Bozarth** and **Mandi Turner** were also ranked in the top 20 in Division II in scoring for 2005.

Healey, reigning PSAC Rookie of the Year, was named to second-team All-PSAC and National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) All-America honors last fall. She finished with 17 goals and nine assists for a total of 43 points. Those 43 points are tied for second most in a single season in program history. Healey will return to her role as a starting forward.

Joining Healey up front will be fellow sophomore and All-PSAC first team honoree Bozarth. Bozarth kept pace with Healey last season, finishing with 16 goals and seven assists for 39 points. Her point total was good for fourth place on KU's single-season chart.

Depth at forward will be a strong point for the Golden Bears. Turner returns for her senior year. Last season, Turner finished with 13 goals and 5 assists. Challenging for playing time will be juniors **Heather Hoxter** and **Tristin Ludy**. Each scored two goals last season. Competing for field time is sophomore **Lyndsay Butler** along with newcomers **Lauren Solley** (**Oley Val-**

ley/Oley Valley) and **Carrie Healey** (**Toms River, NJ/Toms River North**), younger sister of Kelley.

The midfield will be quarterbacked by senior **Laura Belfatti**. Belfatti started all 21 games last season, notching a goal and an assist. She was named to the All-PSAC first team. The rest of the midfield will be patrolled by new starters. Aiming to fill the openings will be sophomore **Whitney Stum**, junior **Laura Wieder** and newcomer **Anne Waapu** (**Hastings, NEW ZEALAND**). Stum saw action in 19 games, while Wieder claimed game time in seven.

With three of the four starters lost to graduation, the backfield positions will be up for grabs. The lone returning starter is sophomore **Courtney Geibel**. Geibel started 17 of 21 games, scoring a goal. **Jennifer Belfatti**, Holly Hubbard, **Kristin Snyder** and **Jenna Watts** return for their sophomore season. Belfatti, younger sister of Laura, saw action in 10 games. Hubbard played in six games, while Snyder played in 14 and Watts notched time in nine. Also in the mix for a starting spot will be newcomer **Madison Weary** (**Palmyra/Palmyra**).

In goal, gone is All-America goalkeeper Trista Hershey, who was a four-year starter. Junior **Sam Flowers** will take over in the cage. Flowers saw action in five games last season, with 12 saves and a 1.39 goals-against average.

KU opens its season at the St. Michael's Tournament on September 2 at noon.

Remembering Josh Wesner

Josh Wesner, son of KU field hockey coach Betty Wesner, passed away in April of 2000 after a long battle with Hodgkins Disease. He was 23 years old. Josh was a special part of the KU family.

He was a psychology major at KU with a minor in biology. In December of 2001, KU awarded Josh his diploma posthumously. He was a member of Student Government and was the president and initial organizer of Phoenix, an organization for disabled students run through the University's Human Diversity office. In addition, Josh was the scoreboard operator for the Golden Bear field hockey team and was the winner of the team's Coach's Award for inspiration in 1998.

A KU field hockey scholarship and golf tournament have been established in Josh's memory. Anyone interested in contributing to the scholarship should contact the KU Athletic Advancement Office at 610-683-4755.

Additionally, the annual tournament featuring Kutztown, C. W. Post, Philadelphia and Catawba is named in memory of Josh.

Facilities



Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

University Field

During the summer of 2005, Kutztown University embarked upon major renovations to University Field, now the home of the Golden Bear field hockey team. Kutztown replaced the natural grass field with new, state-of-the-art, synthetic athletic turf. In addition, the track surrounding the field was re-surfaced and lights were installed and activated in 2006. Around the new field lies a 5,600-seat stadium. It features a state-of-the-art scoreboard that debuted in the fall of 2001.

Keystone Hall (pictured in the background, above) houses the athletics offices, Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room. Keystone Field, the team's former competition field located behind Keystone Hall, will remain in service as a backup game field and practice facility for the Golden Bears.

The Student Recreation Center (pictured in the center background, above) is a brand new, 64,623 square foot facility that opened in the fall of 2006. Located between Keystone Hall and University Field, it is THE place to be for student recreation and fitness on campus. Among the amenities are a nearly 9,000 sq. ft. fitness center and weight room, two group fitness studios, two racquetball courts, an indoor rock climbing wall, a synthetic surface gymnasium with curved walls for indoor sports, a synthetic surface half gymnasium, a suspended jogging track (approx. 1/10 mile), an office suite for recreational services staff, a meeting room, retail space/snack bar and locker rooms with jacuzzis.



Risley Weight Room

Athletes get extensive use from the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

Keystone Fieldhouse

Keystone Fieldhouse is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The fieldhouse is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in January 1995.
