History:

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Location:

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment:

Approximately 10,000 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 24 states and 38 nations are represented in the student body: 60% women, 40% men.

Academic Year:

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty:

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees:

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs:

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library:

Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities:

Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 30 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life:

Nearly 200 student organizations include: academic, advisory councils, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station and student newspaper), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The McFarland Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

Residence Halls:

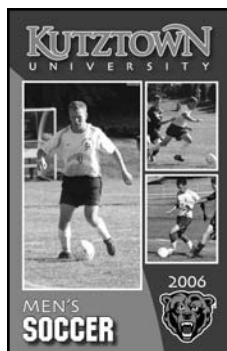
Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,434 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

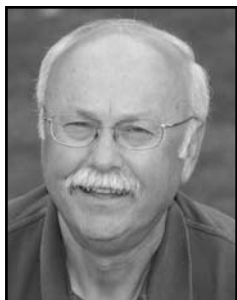

Head Coach Otto Ormosi

Otto Ormosi begins his ninth season as head coach of the men's soccer program at Kutztown University. Ormosi's 65-71-10 record in his first eight seasons as head coach gives him the highest winning percentage in KU men's soccer history.

The 2005 season proved to be a tough campaign as the Golden Bears managed only four wins.

The 2004 season marked the third consecutive season the Golden Bears finished at or above .500. Ormosi's squad completed 2004 at 9-9-2 overall and 3-5 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC). That followed a 2003 season when KU went 8-7-4, including 4-4-0 in league play.

Ormosi's players have won a number of awards in his seven seasons. They have earned 16 All-PSAC awards, as well as eight All-Region selections. In 2000, John Lapore was named the PSAC Rookie of the Year.

In 1999, Ormosi guided the Golden Bears to their winningest season in school history. Kutztown was 12-7, shattering the previous wins record of nine set in 1975 and equaled in the 1991. In PSAC action, KU was 4-4. In 1998, Ormosi's first KU squad was 7-11 overall. During Ormosi's tenure, the Golden Bears have posted a 43-26-7 record against non-conference foes.

Ormosi came to Kutztown from Raritan Valley Community College in Somerville, NJ, where he was the head men's soccer coach from 1988-1997. Over his 10 seasons at Raritan Valley, Ormosi compiled a mark of 102-66-12. He led his team to winning records in seven of his last eight years, and eight regional tournament appearances between 1990 and 1997.

In 1997, Ormosi's final team at Raritan Valley finished 18-4-1. The team won the regional championship and finished with a national ranking of fifth. For his effort, Ormosi was named New Jersey Soccer Coaches Association, Garden State Athletic Conference and National Soccer Coaches Association of America Mid-Atlantic Coach of the Year.

Prior to Raritan Valley, Ormosi was the head soccer coach at Delaware Valley Regional High School from 1984-87. He led his squad to two league titles during that time.

Ormosi, a native of Middlesex, N.J., received a bachelor's degree in education from the College of Emporia (KS.) in 1970. He holds a master's degree in physical education and athletic administration from Trenton State College (now the College of New Jersey). He and his wife, Linda, reside in Ottsville.

Assistant Coach Skip Sibiski

Skip Sibiski enters his third season as a member of the Kutztown staff. He will serve as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's teams.

Sibiski previously served as an assistant boys coach at Brandywine Heights High School for three years. He has also been the girls head coach at Brandywine Heights since 2003. Sibiski has 11 years of coaching experience at the club level.

Sibiski played collegiality at Moravian, graduating in 2002 with a degree in financial economics. He and his wife, Shannon, reside in Kutztown with their children, Kirby (10) and Beckham (7).





Young Golden Bears Look to Make Noise in PSAC

The Kutztown University Golden Bears will feature a roster full of newcomers and a few seasoned veterans who return in hopes of improving upon KU's record from last year. With 11 incoming freshmen on this year's squad, ninth-year head coach **Otto Ormosi** looks to build a winning squad for the future.

Kutztown finished last season with a record of 4-15-1, including a 4-11-1 record in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC). The team looks to improve its consistency on offense, while clamping down on defense.

This year's squad will go into the season with the defense as its main strength. The defense is led by veterans with experience and depth, which is created by the incoming crop of freshmen.

Anchoring the backfield are returning seniors **Jim D'Angelo**, **Ricky Zimmerer** and **Steve Gorski**. Zimmerer and Gorski combined to play in 35 games last year, tallying three assists between the two of them. D'Angelo converts from the forward position where he played in all 20 team games, starting 19 of them.

Two newcomers are expected to fight for the fourth and final defensive backfield position. **Christopher Ponto (Coatesville/Bishop Shanahan)** and **Mike Choiniere (Boyertown/Boyertown)** will both see ample playing time this season.

The other back looking to make an impact is freshman **John Ferguson (Chalfont/Central Bucks West)**.

Another team strength can come from the health of sophomore forward **Greg Sassaman**, who was second on the team in goals with five and added four assists last year. If Sassaman is able to overcome injury, his goal scoring and leadership will be a bonus to the team.

Joining Sassaman at the forward position will be sophomore **Bill Frosoni**, who was a part-time starter last year with a goal and two assists. With more playing time this season he should improve on those numbers.

Returning junior **Matt Kade** and sophomore **Charlie Kulp** will be joined by converted back **Collin Dalton** in the midfield. Kade and Kulp combined for 26 shots and one goal last year. Dalton, a junior, started all 19 games he played in and his one goal was a game-winner. He switched to midfield in the spring, leaving an already talented and deep defense to help strengthen the scoring attack.

The other starting midfielder will be freshman **Rusty Chapel (Topton/Brandywine)**, who will look to make an immediate impact.

Junior midfielder **Chris Capone**, will contribute through his experience and veteran leadership.

Also looking to chip in on this year's squad in the middle are newcomers **Jarrett Cutsler (Doylestown/Central Bucks West)** and **Jason Lear (Montoursville/Montoursville)**.

Junior goalkeeper **Ryan Kratz** will be in his first year starting in net for the Golden Bears. He will be pushed by incoming freshmen **Matthew Fredericks (Montdale/Lakeland)** and **Bryan Hare (Abington/Abington)**.

With a young roster, the playoffs may not be in the cards for the 2006 Golden Bears, but they certainly aim to make some noise in the PSAC. The team will have its work cut out for it. An already difficult schedule is made harder by the fact that the team only has eight home contests versus the 12 games to be contested on opponent soil.

KU opens with two games on the road against conference opponents while ending the season with its final four games against conference foes including the season finale at East Stroudsburg.

The season opener will be August 24 at Slippery Rock and the home opener occurs August 30 at Keystone Field against California (PA).

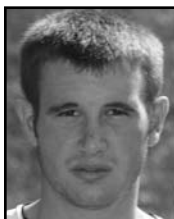

Facilities

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the mecca of indoor athletic activity on campus. The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the volleyball, men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams. Additionally, it served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams and a state-of-the-art fitness room.

Keystone Field ▶

Located behind Keystone Hall, Keystone Field includes the 300-seat grass home to the Golden Bear men's and women's soccer programs. The facility debuted in 1999.

Athletes get extensive use out of the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

Practice Fields

Kutztown expanded its practice facilities in the spring of 2004 to include new fields for field hockey and soccer on KU's North Campus.

Keystone Field House ▶

Keystone Field House is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The field house is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events and many camps and clinics throughout the year. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in 1995.
