A Look at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania



History:

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Location:

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment:

Approximately 10,000 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 24 states and 38 nations are represented in the student body: 60% women, 40% men.

Academic Year:

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty:

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees:

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs:

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library:

Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities:

Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 30 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life:

Nearly 200 student organizations include: academic, advisory councils, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station and student newspaper), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The McFarland Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

Residence Halls:

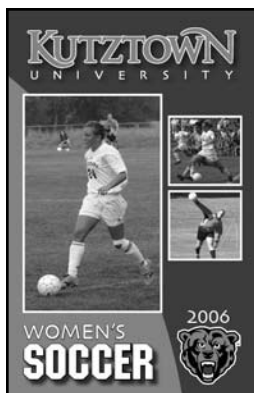
Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,434 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

Head Coach Jeff Schellenberger

Jeff Schellenberger enters his 12th season as head coach of the women's soccer program at Kutztown University. He was KU's coach from 1989-91, serving as interim coach of the men's program in 1992. He returned to Kutztown as head women's soccer coach in 1998 and has since turned the program into one of the most competitive in the region.

Schellenberger's teams have won 14 games each of the past three seasons, the most wins in a season in KU women's soccer history.

In 2005, Kutztown finished 14-7-1 and 8-3-1 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division. The team reached its second straight PSAC title game against Slippery Rock, falling 1-0.

In 2004, his squad finished 14-5-2 overall and 8-3-1 in the PSAC, earning him PSAC East and KU Women's Athletics Coach of the Year honors. The team won the school's first ever division title and reached the PSAC title game for the first time.

In 2003, Schellenberger coached the Golden Bears to a 14-4-3 overall record and a 9-2-1 mark in the PSAC. The conference victories were the most-ever in a season at KU. Kutztown reached the PSAC quarterfinals and qualified for the NCAA Division II Championship for the first time in school history. For his efforts, Schellenberger was named the KU Women's Athletics Coach of the Year.

The 2002 squad went 10-7-2 overall and 4-7 in the PSAC, after an injury-plagued 2001 squad finished 7-12, 2-9 in the PSAC. The 2000 team finished 7-7-3. His troops were 7-11 in 1999, posting four more wins than the previous year.

Prior to returning to Kutztown, Schellenberger served as assistant women's soccer coach at Lebanon Valley in 1997. Preceding Lebanon Valley, he was the head men's soccer coach at Albright College from 1994-96. In addition, Schellenberger served as head coach of Schuylkill Valley High School's girls soccer program from 1992-2004.

Schellenberger, a resident of Kutztown, earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from Randolph-Macon (VA) College in 1984. In 1992, he completed a master's degree in sport and recreation management at Temple University. He now serves as an EPA Regional staff member for boys soccer.

In 1993, Schellenberger received the USSF "A" license for coaching. He is an EPYSA staff coach and instructor. In the summer of 2000, he served as coordinator for the National USSF Coaching School held at KU. In 2002, Schellenberger became director of the Student-Athlete Mentor (SAM) program.

Assistant Coach Skip Sibiski



Skip Sibiski enters his third season as a member of the Kutztown staff, serving as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's teams.

Sibiski previously served as an assistant boys coach at Brandywine Heights High School for three years. He has also been the girls head coach at Brandywine Heights since 2003. Sibiski has 11 years of coaching experience at the club level. Sibiski played college soccer at Moravian, graduating in 2002 with a degree in financial economics. He and his wife, Shannon, reside in Kutztown with their children, Kirby (10) and Beckham (7).



Graduate Assistant Coach **Rachel Napoli**

Rachel Napoli enters her first year with the Golden Bear coaching staff. Napoli came to Kutztown after completing a stellar playing career at Wheeling Jesuit University. Napoli was a four-time West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference all-star, earning a spot on the first team from 2003-05. In each of those three seasons, Napoli was named to second-team all-region honors as a midfielder. She is currently pursuing a master's degree in elementary education at Kutztown.

Season Outlook

Golden Bear Women's Soccer Team Strives For the PSAC Championship

Coming off its third consecutive year of 14 wins in a season, the Kutztown University women's soccer team sets its eyes on another post-season run in 2006.

The Golden Bears advanced to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Championship game for the second-straight season. Both times, KU finished as the runner up, including last year's 1-0 loss to Slippery Rock for the PSAC title. KU finished 14-7-1 overall, 8-3-1 in the PSAC East.

With six starters returning, the Golden Bears will infuse a mixture of reserves from last year and newcomers into the lineup in hopes of making a third-straight post-season run.

Junior **Kim Kelty** again leads the Golden Bears in the midfield. Kelty, who earned first-team All-PSAC East and second team All-Region honors last year, started every contest, contributing four goals and eight assists.

Joining Kelty in the middle will be senior **Mallary Kamen** and sophomores **Cheyenne Brunner** and **Xiomara Marin**. Kamen started 19 games last season. Brunner and Marin played in 22 and 20 games, respectively. Brunner scored six goals while Marin scored two. They will battle for the starting outside midfielder position. Looking to battle for time will be sophomore **Jackie Toutkoushian** who played in 18 contests, scoring three goals. Newcomers are expected to make an immediate impact. Local product **Angela Corrado** (Kutztown/Kutztown HS), **Diana**

Hopper (New York, NY/Ramapo {NJ} HS) and **Michelle Flick** (Montoursville/Montoursville HS) should all see significant playing time.

Sophomore **Julie Folsom** returns to the line-up after suffering a season-ending injury early last year. Folsom played in just two games before the injury. The team's leading scorer in 2004, Folsom will look to jump right into action this season. Joining Folsom at forward will be newcomer **Raven Chiara** (Jamesburg, NJ/Monroe Twp. HS). Chiara was an All-State Central Top 20 and her team's MVP.

The defense last season held teams to an average of 7.2 shots per game and 0.97 goals per game. Returning starters in the back are senior **Shelby Varone** and junior **Becky Worley**. Varone started all 22 games last year, while Worley started in 18 of the 22 contests. Looking to fill a vacated starting spot is junior **Kristen Kentner**. Kentner started in seven of 19 games played, tallying three goals and two assists. **Alex Butler** and newcomer **Jamie Fooy** (Lancaster/Hempfield HS) will compete for time in the back field.

Senior goalkeeper **Nicole Rodweller** will get the nod in net. Rodweller started 17 contests last season. She stopped 74 shots for 13 wins, including seven shutouts. Her goals against average was 0.84, fifth in the PSAC. Rodweller will have a large role to play as she is the only goalkeeper on the team.

Facilities

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the Eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall, is the hub of indoor athletic activity on campus. The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the volleyball, men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room. Additionally, it served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004.

Keystone Field ▶

Located behind Keystone Hall, Keystone Field includes the 300-seat grass home to the Golden Bear men's and women's soccer programs. The facility debuted in 1999.

Athletes get extensive use out of the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

Practice Fields

Kutztown expanded its practice facilities in the spring of 2004 to include new fields for field hockey and soccer on KU's North Campus.

Keystone Field House ▶

Keystone Field House is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The field house is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events. KU Athletics Hall of Fame



Kirsten Hansen Cherneskie ('90) became the first member of the women's soccer program to be inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2000. She was a standout performer during the early days of women's soccer at KU. Cherneskie, then Kirsten Hansen, played from 1986 to 1989. She led the team with a school record 19 goals and 40 points in 1987, when KU won a school-record 11 games. The 11-win mark was bettered in 2003 and 2004, but her single season records still stand. She scored a school-record four goals twice, once in 1986 and 1987. She was named the team's most-valuable player, while earning All-Region honors in 1988 and 1989 (honorable mention).

Cherneskie still holds KU's career goals scored (43) and points scored (94) records. Also a standout in the classroom, she graduated with honors in 1990. She is a member of the Phi Sigma Iota and Kappa Delta Pi, national honor societies. A native of Perkasio, PA, she graduated from Penn Ridge High School. Cherneskie teaches in the Pottstown School District and has four children with her husband, John.
