History:

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Location:

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment:

Approximately 10,000 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 24 states and 38 nations are represented in the student body: 60% women, 40% men.

Academic Year:

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty:

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees:

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs:

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library:

Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities:

Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 30 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life:

Nearly 200 student organizations include: academic, advisory councils, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station and student newspaper), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The McFarland Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

Residence Halls:

Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,434 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

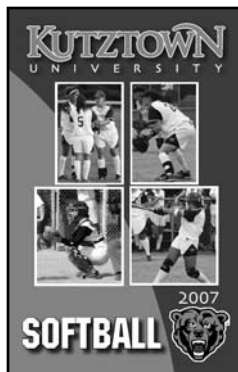

Head Coach Judy Lawes

Judy Lawes begins her 20th season as head softball coach at Kutztown University.

Last season, the Golden Bears finished with a 32-19 record, 16-8 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division. Lawes won her 500th game during the season with a 7-6 win over Millersville. The Golden Bears qualified for the PSAC playoffs and the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional Tournament. The regional appearance was the fourth-straight for Lawes' squad. It marked her 19th consecutive winning season.

In 2005, Lawes guided KU to a 27-24 record, 13-11 in the PSAC Eastern Division. In 2004, Lawes' team finished the season with a 31-19 record. In 2003, her Golden Bears posted a 23-18 record overall and finished third in the PSAC East with a 14-10 record. Kutztown qualified for the Mid-Atlantic Regional, and finished fourth. Lawes led the Golden Bears to a 28-18 overall record in 2002, and to the PSAC and Mid-Atlantic Regional tournaments in both 2000 and 2001. The Golden Bears set a school record in 2000 with 19 PSAC East wins.

During her 19-year tenure at KU, Lawes has led the Golden Bears to all nine of their appearances in the NCAA Division II Tournament in the school's history. She guided them to three-straight appearances in 1994-96 and then again in 2000, 2001, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006.

Lawes has received many honors for her coaching accomplishments. She was named PSAC East Coach of the Year in 1989, 1994 and 2000. Lawes also garnered the Dr. Dorothy Moyer Award in 1994, 1995 and 2000, which is presented to the KU Coach of the Year for women's athletics. Other accomplishments include setting the school record for overall wins (39) in 1995 and wins in the Eastern Division (19) in 2000. Additionally, her team won a share of the PSAC East title in 1994. Lawes is among the top 25 all-time winningest softball coaches in NCAA Division II with a record of 504-330-1. Among her wins, 235 have come against PSAC East foes. Lawes is also Kutztown's winningest coach in school history, regardless of sport.

Lawes came to KU in 1987 as head softball and women's tennis coach and assistant women's basketball coach. She held the basketball position until 1990 and the tennis position until 1991.

Lawes also serves as the director of the Judy O'Connell softball camp for girls, one of the top youth camps in the area.

Lawes received her bachelor's degree in communications from Shippensburg University in 1984 and her master's degree in counseling/student personnel from Shippensburg in 1987. In October of 2001, she was inducted into Shippensburg's Athletic Hall of Fame for her record-setting accomplishments as a softball and tennis player.

Lawes and her husband, Robert, have a daughter, Rachel (13), and a son, Ryan (7).



Assistant Coach Alicia Cunic

Alicia Cunic is in her second season on the KU softball coaching staff. Cunic came to Kutztown after a stellar career at St. Joseph's. Cunic was a career .313 hitter, with 23 home runs and 108 RBI. She was a 2004 All-Atlantic 10 selection at catcher and was a four-year starter.



Assistant Coach Brianne Barona

Brianne Barona joins the softball team for her first season as an assistant coach. Barona, then Brianne Homyak, was a standout basketball and softball player during her tenure at Kutztown. A four-year starter in softball, she was a 1999 All-PSAC East second team honoree. She was also named the 1997-98 KU Female Rookie of the Year. She scored 1,248 points and was a two-time all-conference first-team selection in basketball. Barona is currently in her second year teaching at William Allen High School in special education. She and her husband, Sammy, a former KU men's basketball standout, are expecting their first child in July, 2007.



KU Hopes to Continue Power Surge in 2007

The 2007 Kutztown University softball team will look to the bats to power its way back to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) playoffs and NCAA Mid-Atlantic tournament.

In 2006, KU finished 32-19 overall, 16-8 in the PSAC East. KU advanced to the PSAC and NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional tournaments. The Golden Bears belted a school-record 54 home runs and tallied a whopping .494 team slugging percentage.

After a record-setting freshman season, PSAC East Rookie of the Year **Stephanie Denlinger** will look to take the same momentum into her sophomore year. Denlinger started in all 51 contests, belting 16 home runs, a KU single-season record. She hit an impressive .356 with 16 doubles and knocked in 42 runs. The first team All-PSAC East honoree finished with a .785 slugging percentage. Denlinger also was named the KU Female Rookie of the Year and National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Mid-Atlantic All-Region first team. She is slated to start at first base and will see some time in the pitching circle.

Also returning for their sophomore season are sluggers **Ashley Fitzgerald** and **Krista Cameron**. The NFCA Mid-Atlantic All-Region second team honoree started all 51 games last season. Fitzgerald edged Cameron, .3701 to .3697, for the team batting title last year. Fitzgerald knocked out eight home runs. She had a team-leading 44 RBI. Fitzgerald will be the designated player and will see some time at first base. Cameron, an All-PSAC East second team honoree, belted out 10 homers among her 61 hits, and knocked in 32 runs. She will start at third base.

Rounding out the starting infield will be sophomore **Kim Morrison** at second and junior **Lindsay Bennett** at shortstop. Morrison started 47 contests at four positions last season and batted .322 with 49 hits and 19 RBI. She was named to the All-PSAC East first team and all-region second team. Bennett started in 50 games last year. She had 37 hits, eight homers and 30 RBI. **Anne Arbogast (Ambler/Wissahickon HS)** and **Emily Fazekas (Mechanicsburg/Cumberland Valley HS)** will look for playing time.

Returning to the outfield for her senior season is lead-off hitter **Adriane Willmer**.

She started all 51 contests in center field last season. She earned first-team All-PSAC East and all-region honors while batting .341. She had a .381 on base percentage as the lead-off batter. Willmer had 60 hits with nine doubles and three triples.

Joining Willmer in the outfield will be junior **Kathy Gregg** and newcomer **Maria Schiavo (Old Forge/Old Forge HS)**. Last season, Gregg saw action in 44 games while starting 33. She batted .234 with 18 hits and 12 runs scored. Schiavo was a district all-star. Adding depth to the outfield will be junior **Sam Flowers** and freshman **Liana Daczka (Dover/Northeastern HS)**. Flowers saw action in 22 contests last year and had six hits. Daczka was the 2005 and 2006 MVP for Northeastern High School.

The ace of the pitching staff will be junior **Rachel Weidensaul**. The right handed pitcher was 19-6 last season with a 1.83 earned-run average (ERA). She pitched eight shutouts and struck out 81 while walking 40. Newcomer **Kate Arbogast (Ambler/Wissahickon HS)** will be in the starting rotation. Arbogast was on the Wissahickon varsity softball team for four years and captain for two years. Also pitching will be Denlinger and Bennett. Denlinger pitched in 40.0 innings in 12 games while Bennett pitched 4.2 in two appearances. Newcomer **Christie McIntyre (Brampton, ONT)** will add some depth to the pitching staff.

Starting behind the plate will be senior **Dani Spalik**. She started in 48 games last season and had a batting average of .270 with 27 hits, nine RBI and three homers. Backing her up will be junior **Caitlin Hague** and newcomer **Laine Heisler (Reading/Reading HS)**. Hague played in 22 games last year. She had 14 hits with two doubles. Heisler was her softball team's captain for two years and was all-division.

Junior **Jennie Lincoln** and newcomer **Tami Wambold (Hatboro/Hatboro-Horsham HS)** will share time at designated player with Fitzgerald. Lincoln played in 29 games last year. She hit two home runs and had six RBI. Wambold was named all-league first team.

The Golden Bears open the 2007 season at the USC-Aiken Tournament on February 10-11.

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the hub of indoor athletic activity on campus. The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the volleyball, men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room. The arena also served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004.

North Campus Field ▶

KU's North Campus Softball Field is the home of the Golden Bear softball team. The facility includes dugouts, hitting cages and an infield tarp. Dimensions for the field are 190 to right and left field and 220 to center.

Keystone Field House ▶

Keystone Field House is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The field house is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events and many camps and clinics throughout the year. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in 1995.

The brand new, 64,623 square foot student recreation center opened in the fall of 2006. 2005-06 Dixon Trophy

For the first time in school history, Kutztown University is the winner of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference's (PSAC) Dixon Trophy for the 2005-06 academic year. The trophy is presented annually to the league's most successful all-around program.

The Dixon Trophy is named after F. Eugene Dixon, Jr., former chairman of the Board of Governors of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. It is awarded annually to the PSAC member institution that accumulates the most points based on results of conference playoffs and/or regular-season records. Each institution's point total is calculated by adding

its top six men's finishes and top six women's finishes in 21 conference sports.

Kutztown, the runner-up the past two years, totaled 140 points, edging Shippensburg by one and a half points.

Academics & Athletics at KU

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past 11 years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class. In 2005-06, KU's student-athletes achieved a cumulative grade-point average of 2.84, the second highest in school history. Also, 94 Golden Bears were recognized as Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Scholar Athletes.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

The Monitoring of Progress: The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored.

Course Selection and Registration: In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

Academic Coaching: This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete.

Faculty Advising: This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

Pre-Season Academic Seminars: During pre-season camps and/or the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships and test-taking strategies.

Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors: Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are highly encouraged to visit the Career Services Office.

Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies: Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of the Department of Developmental Studies' services in regard to tutoring or other needs

for specialized instruction.

Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center: Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues.

Library Tour: A library tour is highly recommended of all incoming student-athletes.

Personal Computer: Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

Academic Accomplishment Recognition

Graduation Reception: The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.

Awards and Honors: KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

Scholar-Athlete Banquet: Each year, the PSAC Scholar-Athletes are recognized at a banquet in their honor.

Dean's List Ceremony: All Kutztown University student-athlete dean's list recipients are acknowledged at a basketball game every year.
