# A Look at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania



## History:

Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

## Location:

Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

## Enrollment:

Approximately 10,000 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 24 states and 38 nations are represented in the student body: 60% women, 40% men.

## Academic Year:

Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

## Faculty:

Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

## Majors/Degrees:

KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

## Special Academic Programs:

There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

## Library:

Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

## Special Facilities:

Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 30 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 500 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

## Student Life:

Nearly 200 student organizations include: academic, advisory councils, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station and student newspaper), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The McFarland Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

## Residence Halls:

Ten residence halls (6 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,434 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

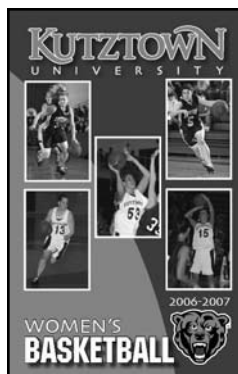

### Head Coach Janet Malouf

Janet Malouf is in her 13th season as head women's basketball coach at Kutztown University.

Malouf guided the Golden Bears to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference playoffs for the 11th consecutive season last year. Overall, KU finished 16-11, 7-5 in the PSAC East, good for fourth place. Kutztown won in the PSAC quarterfinals to advance to the semifinals for the first time since 1999.

During her 12 seasons at Kutztown, Malouf has led the Golden Bears to more wins (191) and PSAC East victories (87) than any previous coach. She has been named PSAC East Coach of the Year twice (1995-96, 1997-98), while 10 of her players have earned a total of 20 All-PSAC East awards. She has coached one PSAC Player of the Year and two PSAC Rookies of the Year. She holds a 191-137 overall record.

Malouf has had the two winningest seasons in school history. In 1999-2000, the Golden Bears set a school record with 21 victories. During that season, Malouf became Kutztown's first women's basketball coach to win 100 career games. In 1995-96, Malouf's squad won a then school-record 20 games, including a 9-3 mark in the PSAC East and a share of the regular season division title. The Golden Bears advanced to the NCAA Regional Playoffs for the first time in school history.

During the 1997-98, 1998-99 and 2005-06 seasons, KU advanced to the semifinals of the PSAC Playoffs for just the second, third and fourth times in school history, respectively.

Prior to Kutztown, Malouf was the assistant women's basketball coach at Lafayette College for four seasons. The Leopards had winning campaigns three of the four seasons during her tenure. Malouf received her master's degree in sports management from Purdue University in 1990, where she served as a volunteer basketball assistant.

In addition to her Division I coaching experience, Malouf also played at Division I powerhouse Rutgers University, where she received her bachelor's degree in sports management. She was a four-year starter under head coach Theresa Grentz, who was also the coach of the 1992 U.S. Olympic women's basketball team. Malouf helped the Scarlet Knights to the NCAA tournament four-straight years, finishing in the Elite Eight in 1986 and 1987 and in the Sweet 16 in 1988. She held the university's assist record for men and women (718 career, 209 season) until 2001. In 2003, she was inducted into the Rutgers Women's Basketball Hall of Fame.

### Assistant Coach Steve Hahn

Steve Hahn is in his 21st season with Golden Bear basketball. Hahn is now in his 12th year as assistant women's basketball coach after serving nine seasons as the assistant men's basketball coach.

Hahn is primarily responsible for on-floor coaching, scouting and the academic progress of players.

During his tenure at KU as men's assistant coach (1986-95), the Golden Bears advanced to the PSAC finals and earned the school's first-ever invitation to the NCAA Division II Tournament. Prior to KU, Hahn served as head coach of boys basketball at Reading High School and posted a 43-15 record.

Hahn owns a bachelor's degree from Albright and a master's degree from Temple. He also serves as color commentator on KU's football and men's basketball broadcasts.





# Golden Bears Look to Use Strong Defense, Balanced Attack in 2006-07

Kutztown University's women's basketball team returns several key veterans for the 2006-07 season, as the Golden Bears look to continue its unprecedented run of post-season appearances.

Kutztown finished the 2005-06 season with a 16-12 overall record, including a 7-5 record in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division. The Golden Bears made their 11th-consecutive appearance in the PSAC Playoffs, the longest current streak in the league. In addition, KU advanced to the semifinals for the first time since 1999.

KU featured the trademark defense instilled by head coach **Janet Malouf**. The Golden Bears led the PSAC in defensive field goal percentage (36%) for the fourth time in the last five years. KU utilized a balanced scoring attack, with five players averaging between seven and just under 10 points per game.

With 11 letterwinners and three starters returning, the Golden Bears are poised for another post-season run, and will take a shot at winning the PSAC East title.

Returning for her senior season is guard/forward **Jess Brady**. A second team All-PSAC East honoree last season, Brady led KU in scoring, averaging 9.6 points per game. She was second on the team with 5.9 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game.

**Mercedes Van Wagner** will start at center. The 6-1 junior started 23 of 28 games last season, averaging 8.8 ppg. She connected on more than 50% of her field goal attempts, and led the team with 203 rebounds (7.3 rpg). Her 52 blocks last season were the fourth-most in a single season in program history.

Forward **Rachel Weidensaul** is set to move back into the starting lineup this season. Last year, Weidensaul saw action in all 28 games as the top reserve, after starting 23 games as a freshman. Weiden-

saul averaged 8.0 points and led KU with 38 steals.

**Katie Harlor** and **Molly Brown** also return at forward. Harlor, a small forward, saw time in 18 games last year, averaging 2.3 points. Brown was limited by injury, but could make an impact if healthy.

The rest of the depth in the frontcourt will be made up of newcomers. **Amanda Jennings (Washington Twp., NJ/Washington Twp. HS)** was a second-team all-state selection. She and **Claire Sitarz (Southampton/Archbishop Wood HS)** will battle for time in the post. **Rachel Wisemiller (Hazleton/Hazleton HS)** was the Wyoming Valley Conference MVP, and **Katie Dovey (Willow Hill/Fannett-Metal HS)** was the District 5 Player of the Year. Both will vie for time at forward. Other newcomers include **Laura Petriello (East Brunswick, NJ/East Brunswick HS)** and **Chauntelle Schroeder (Toronto, ONT./Mother Teresa HS)**.

Sophomore guards **Lara Dellegrotti** and **Tricia McElmoyle** return after turning in solid freshman campaigns. Slated to start at guard, Dellegrotti averaged 7.6 ppg with 26 three-pointers. A 12-game starter, she shot over 83% from the free throw line. McElmoyle is also slated to start in the backcourt this year, after compiling 13 starts a year ago. She averaged 6.5 points, including 26 three pointers. The 5-8 guard also notched 18 blocks.

Competing for playing time in the backcourt will be sophomore **Kelley Healey**. Healey saw action in 14 games last season, scoring 20 points and grabbing 10 rebounds. Also returning are senior **Jenn Loprete** and sophomore **Shir Suez**.

Newcomer **Vivian Melvin (Chichester/Chichester HS)** will look to break into the guard rotation.

Kutztown's season begins on Nov. 15 when it hosts Columbia Union.

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the Eastern United States. Twenty of KU's 21 teams have their home venues on campus.

### Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the hub of indoor athletic activity on campus. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room.

#### Keystone Arena ▶

The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the Golden Bear volleyball team in the fall, and the men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams in the winter. It was also the training camp home of the NBA's New Jersey Nets in the fall of 1995. Additionally, it served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004.

Athletes get extensive use out of the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

#### Keystone Field House ▶

Keystone Field House is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The field house is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in January 1995.

For the first time in school history, Kutztown University is the winner of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference's (PSAC) Dixon Trophy for the 2005-06 academic year. The trophy is presented annually to the league's most successful all-around program.

The Dixon Trophy is named after F. Eugene Dixon, Jr., former chairman of the Board of Governors of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. It is awarded annually to the PSAC member institution that accumulates the most points based on results of conference playoffs and/or regular-season records. Each institution's point total is calculated by adding

its top six men's finishes and top six women's finishes in 21 conference sports.

Kutztown, the runner-up the past two years, totaled 140 points, edging Shippensburg by one and a half points.

## Academics & Athletics at KU

---

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past 11 years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class. In 2005-06, KU's student-athletes achieved a cumulative grade-point average of 2.84, the second highest in school history. Also, 94 Golden Bears were recognized as Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Scholar Athletes.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

**The Monitoring of Progress:** The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored.

**Course Selection and Registration:** In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

**Academic Coaching:** This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete.

**Faculty Advising:** This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

**Pre-Season Academic Seminars:** During pre-season camps and/or the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships and test-taking strategies.

**Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors:** Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are highly encouraged to visit the Career Services Office.

**Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies:** Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of the Department of Developmental Studies' services in regard to tutoring or other needs

for specialized instruction.

**Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center:** Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues.

**Library Tour:** A library tour is highly recommended of all incoming student-athletes.

**Personal Computer:** Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

### **Academic Accomplishment Recognition**

The Department of Athletics has developed a comprehensive program to provide incentive for and acknowledgement of the many academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. Below are some examples of the program.

**Graduation Reception:** The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.

**Awards and Honors:** KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

**Scholar-Athlete Banquet:** Each year, the PSAC Scholar-Athletes are recognized at a banquet in their honor.

**Dean's List Ceremony:** All Kutztown University student-athlete dean's list recipients are acknowledged at a basketball game every year.
