A Look at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania



History: Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, PA Department of Education, NCATE, NLNAC, CSWE, NCACE, NASM and NASAD.

Location: Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment: Approximately 10,200 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 24 states and 38 nations are represented in the student body: 60% women, 40% men.

Academic Year: Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty: Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees: KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs: There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library: Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities: Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 50 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 800 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life: Nearly 150 student organizations include: academic, advisory councils, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station and student newspaper), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The McFarland Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

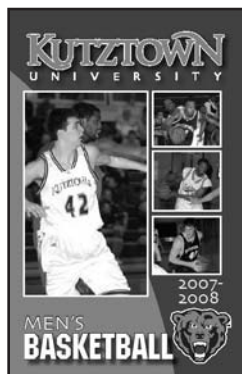
Residence Halls: Fifteen residence facilities (8 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,800 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

Head Coach Bernie Driscoll

Bernie Driscoll returns for his eighth season as head coach of the men's basketball team at Kutztown University.

In his seven years at the helm of the Golden Bears, Driscoll has tallied a 95-96 overall record. However, after a two-year rebuilding process, he has a 84-56 mark the past five seasons. Driscoll has led the Golden Bears to five straight winning seasons and a program record five-straight PSAC playoff appearances. His mark in PSAC East play stands at 38-46, but KU is 34-26 over the last five years.

Last season, Driscoll guided Kutztown to a 17-11 overall record, including a 6-6 mark in the PSAC East. KU hosted its first-ever men's PSAC playoff game in the quarterfinals.

In 2005-06, Kutztown finished with a 16-12 overall record, including a 7-5 mark in the PSAC East. The team advanced to the conference quarterfinals. In 2004-05, the team was 15-12 overall, also advancing to the quarterfinals. KU was ranked as high as 17th in the nation. The 2003-04 season was one of the best in the program's history. The Golden Bears finished 18-11 overall, including 7-5 in the PSAC East. KU reached the PSAC title game for the first time in 16 years. In 2002-03, Driscoll's club had a remarkable turnaround and he earned PSAC East Coach of the Year honors. After winning a combined 11 games in two years, the Golden Bears went 18-10 overall, and 8-4 in the PSAC East. The squad made its first PSAC playoff appearance since 1999, winning the second-most games in school history.

Driscoll came to Kutztown from West Chester, where he served as the top assistant coach from 1987-2000. In his final three seasons there, the Golden Rams won two PSAC East titles, and received two bids to the NCAA Tournament. WCU produced a string of three straight 20-win seasons, and appeared in the PSAC Final Four each of those three years. In addition, Driscoll was a key factor in the academic success of the Golden Ram basketball program, which boasted a 98 percent graduation rate for its players.

Driscoll, 51, received a bachelor's degree in biology from Dickinson College, Carlisle, PA, in 1977. While at Dickinson, he participated in varsity football and baseball and still holds most of the career receiving records at the school. He received a master's degree in education from St. Joseph's University, Philadelphia, in 1988.

Driscoll and his wife, Liz, have three children — daughters, Maureen (23) and Kelly (20), and son, Ricky (19).

Assistant Coach Tom York

Tom York enters his seventh season as assistant men's basketball coach at Kutztown University.

A KU graduate with a bachelor's degree in elementary education, York was a three-year starter and two-time MVP selection as a Golden Bear. He earned All-PSAC East honors in 1981-82. After coaching at Phoenixville and Glen Mills high schools, York compiled a 96-92 record in seven seasons as KU's head women's basketball coach (1987-94). He was named PSAC East Coach of the Year after guiding the women's basketball team to an 18-10 record in 1989-90.

York then spent four stellar seasons as head coach of girls' basketball at Wilson High School (1996-00) in West Lawn, Pa. He compiled a record of 105-20, winning two county championships and three AAAA District III titles. He came back to KU from Exeter High School, where he coached girls' basketball in 2000-01.

York and his wife, Wendy, have two children, son, Travis (17) and daughter, Amanda (15).

Assistant Coach Rick Hicks

Rick Hicks joins the KU men's basketball coaching staff this season. Hicks. He comes to Kutztown after 16 years coaching at Coatesville High School. He was an assistant coach for the Red Raiders from 1991-2003 before taking over the reigns as head coach from 2003-07.

Season Outlook

Experienced Nucleus Ready to Lead Golden Bears in 2007-08

The Kutztown University men's basketball team returns three players who started in all 28 games last season, including the last two Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference East Rookies of the Year.

Junior **Dave Ben** and sophomore **Stephen Dennis**, both earned the PSAC's top freshman award in their respective first years. The duo, with senior center **Sean McKeon** are KU's returning All-PSAC East performers.

The three Golden Bears, who started every game last season, led KU to a 17-11 record and an even 6-6 mark in the PSAC East. Five of the six losses were decided by five points or fewer. KU qualified for the PSAC playoffs, but fell 79-63 to Cheyney in the quarterfinals.

The 2005-06 PSAC Rookie of the Year, Ben, led KU in scoring with 18.9 points, earning All-PSAC first team honors. Ben also led the team with 55 3-pointers, but shot only 31.3 percent from beyond the arc — an area in which KU head coach **Bernie Driscoll** believes his team needs to improve.

McKeon, who also was named to the All-PSAC first team, shot 48.7 percent from the field and 38.6 percent from 3 while posting 14.8 points per game. He set a single-season KU record with 117 blocked shots, leading Division II with 4.2 blocks/game. He also pulled down 8.6 rebounds per game.

Dennis averaged 15.4 points per game en route to his Rookie of the Year honors. Dennis also was named to second-team All-PSAC east honors and the *Division II Bulletin* All-Freshman team. He dished out 90 assists and averaged 35.9 minutes per game. He dropped in a career-high 28 points against District of Columbia on Feb. 21. The 6-foot-5 sophomore scored more than 20 points in

six games, while shooting 47 percent from the field.

Andre Woodlin had the best shooting percentage of players who started in more than 10 games last season at 49.1 percent, but his season was cut short after 12 starts with a leg injury. Woodlin, a junior who averaged 10.8 points per game, returns healthy to the Golden Bears and will battle with Nate Edwards for the starting nod at the two-guard. Edwards, a sophomore, started in 12 games and played in 28 last season, scoring 8.8 points per game and leading KU with 62 steals.

Two newcomers, forwards **Dan Lewis** (so. Centre Hall/Penns Valley) and **Maurice Stallion** (so. Upper Marlboro/), will vie for starting time at the four-spot. Lewis, a 6-8 sophomore transfer from New Jersey Institute of Technology, played in 22 games at NJIT and scored more than 1,000 points in his high school career. Stallion averaged 13 points per game at Columbia Union College before transferring this season.

Other newcomers include **Steve Coffey** (fr. West Lawn/Wilson), **Ryan Nemetz** (fr. Wilkes-Barre/Bishop Hoban) and **Mike Connolly** (Harleysville/Souderton). Coffey, a transfer from Liberty University, will back up Dennis at point guard, and Connolly, who returns from knee surgery, will back up Ben at guard. Nemetz will redshirt this season after suffering a knee injury over the summer.

Senior **Kevin Hafera** will return to KU to back up McKeon. **Mark Bower**, a 6-7 junior, also will battle for minutes with Lewis and Stallion at forward, and sophomore **Max Foye** will return at guard. Foye started in two games and played in 26, averaging 13.4 minutes per game and 4.2 points per game.

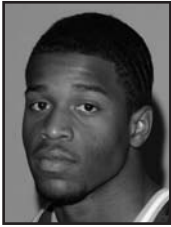

Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the hub of indoor athletic activity on campus. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room.

The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the Golden Bear volleyball team in the fall, and the men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams in the winter. It served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004 and was the training camp home of the NBA's New Jersey Nets in the fall of 1995.

Keystone Field House is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The field house is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events and many camps and clinics throughout the year. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in 1995.

Men's Basketball History/Honors

On January 24, 1903, then Keystone State Normal School faced off against Reading High School. Although the Maroon & Gold was defeated, 24-8, the game began a century of men's basketball that produced numerous outstanding players and several conference championships.

The first faculty coach was also a standout player. KU Athletics Hall of Fame member George B. Ely came to Kutztown in 1905. A standout athlete and coach, he led the basketball team to successful records from 1905-08.

The men's basketball program reached a high level of success in the late 1910s, winning two Pennsylvania State Normal School championships. The program's first title, and the first championship in any sport at the school, came in 1917. Coach Bert Bohler and player Raymond Loose led the team to a perfect 18-0 record that season. In 1919, Bohler led an almost completely new cast of players to a second championship.

Arlan Bayer was one of Kutztown's best players in the first half of the century. He scored 711 points from 1926-30, a record that stood for 25 years. He also held records for points in a season (249) and a single game (32).

In 1936, a group of future Hall of Famers brought another title to Kutztown. Hall of Fame coach James MacGovern, and Hall of Fame players Russ Stoudt (captain), Joseph "Gino" Musso, John Polischak and George Kovich were key factors in the title run. The team finished the year 11-2, defeating West Chester, a team it had lost to earlier in the year, for the Pennsylvania State Teachers College championship.

The program, discontinued during World War II, was reinstated in 1945-46 by Hall of Fame coach Walt Risley. Risley coached the cagers until 1963. Roger Cocivera (1952-56) became the first 1,000-career point scorer, finishing with 1,231 points.

The 1960s and 1970s produced seven 1,000-point scorers, including John Cresswell, the first to eclipse 1,400 career points in 1969, and George Krell, who passed Cresswell with 1,467 points in 1970. Hall of Famer Eddie McTague set the school record for assists and his steals mark still stands today.

In the mid-1980s, head coach Rick Binder produced several standout players and a three-year span of 53 wins. Hall of Famer Butch Hills set the school's scoring record with 1,525 career points. He teamed with fellow Hall of Famer Marty Eggleston, who set the career rebounds and blocks records, to lead the 1987-88 team to a school-record 21 wins. That team also won the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference East title and qualified for the NCAA playoffs.

The 1990s produced the school's current scoring leader, Lock Jennings, who scored 1,682 points from 1989-93, and 1,000-point scorer, Keith Mackrey.

In KU's second century, current head coach Bernie Driscoll has posted five straight winning seasons and led Kutztown to an appearance in the PSAC title game. The decade has also produced three 1,000-point scorers - Bilal Salaam, Jeff Brickus and Bobby Eberhart - and the school's current all-time leaders in rebounds (Salaam), assists (Brickus) and blocks (Salaam).

Kutztown University was the winner of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference's (PSAC) Dixon Trophy for the 2005-06 academic year. The trophy is presented on an annual basis to the league's most successful all-around program.

The Dixon Trophy is named after F. Eugene Dixon, Jr., former chairman of the Board of Governors of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. It is awarded annually to the PSAC member institution that accumulates the most points based on results of conference playoffs and/or regular-season records. Each institution's

point total is calculated by adding its top six men's finishes and top six women's finishes in 21 conference sports.

Academics & Athletics at KU

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past 12 years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class. In 2006-07, KU's student-athletes achieved a cumulative grade-point average of 2.91, matching the highest in school history. Also, a record 120 Golden Bears were recognized as Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Scholar Athletes.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

The Monitoring of Progress: The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored.

Course Selection and Registration: In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

Academic Coaching: This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete.

Faculty Advising: This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

Pre-Season Academic Seminars: During pre-season camps and/or the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships and test-taking strategies.

Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors: Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are highly encouraged to visit the Career Services Office.

Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies: Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of the Department of Developmental Studies' services in regard to tutoring or other needs

for specialized instruction.

Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center: Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues.

Library Tour: A library tour is highly recommended of all incoming student-athletes.

Personal Computer: Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

Academic Accomplishment Recognition

The Department of Athletics has developed a comprehensive program to provide incentive for and acknowledgement of the many academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. Below are some examples of the program.

Graduation Reception: The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.

Awards and Honors: KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

Scholar-Athlete Banquet: Each year, the PSAC Scholar-Athletes are recognized at a banquet in their honor.

Dean's List Ceremony: All Kutztown University student-athlete dean's list recipients are acknowledged at a basketball game every year.
