History: Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, PA Department of Education, NCATE, NLNAC, CSWE, NCACE, NASM and NASAD.

Location: Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment: Approximately 10,200 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 24 states and 38 nations are represented in the student body: 60% women, 40% men.

Academic Year: Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty: Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees: KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs: There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library: Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities: Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 50 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 800 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life: Nearly 150 student organizations include: academic, advisory councils, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station and student newspaper), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The McFarland Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

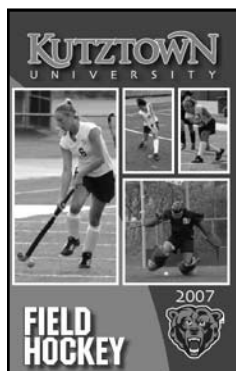
Residence Halls: Fifteen residence facilities (8 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,800 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

Head Coach Betty Wesner

Betty Wesner enters her 28th season as head field hockey coach at Kutztown University.

Wesner has played a vital role in the growth of field hockey and women's athletics at Kutztown over the past 27 years. She has compiled a record of 275-210-15, posting winning seasons in 18 of those 27 years.

Last season, Wesner's team was 10-10. Three players were named to the All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) teams and two were named to the National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) Division II All-America team.

In the previous two seasons, Wesner's teams combined for 29 wins and back-to-back trips to the PSAC Playoffs. In 2005, the Golden Bears were ranked as high as third among NCAA Division II teams and second in the South Region. In 2004, KU ranked as high as fourth in Division II and third in the region. Wesner, the 2004 PSAC Coach of the Year, recorded her 250th career win vs. Shippensburg in 2004.

From 2000-03, the Golden Bears won 32 games. During the 1999 season, Wesner recorded her 200th career victory, an overtime decision over Mercyhurst, with the winning goal scored by her daughter, Sarah. In 1998, Wesner's team reached the PSAC Playoffs.

In 1997, the Golden Bears reached the pinnacle of success, advancing to the NCAA Division II Championship game for the first time in school history. For her effort, Wesner was named NFHCA Division II Coach of the Year, as well as NFHCA South Region, PSAC and Kutztown University Women's Coach of the Year.

Wesner was named PSAC Coach of the Year after her 1988 squad recorded a school-record 18 wins and finished fifth in the national tournament. She has captured three PAIAW conference crowns, while coaching one national player of the year, 38 national All-Americans, eight all-regional selections, 19 PAIAW all-stars, and 52 All-PSAC honorees.

Her team has earned the NFHCA Team Academic Award each of the past four seasons, finishing in the top five in Division II in team GPA each year.

Wesner has taken her team on international tours to Great Britain, Holland and Australia to compete against some of the best teams those countries have to offer.

Wesner served as head women's lacrosse coach at KU from 1984-90. She was the director of equal opportunity in sports from 1985-1987 and has served as the department's compliance officer. Prior to KU, Wesner taught health and physical education and coached field hockey in the Twin Valley School District. Her 1975 squad won the Berks County title.

Wesner serves on several field hockey committees, including that of the PSAC, NFHCA and the NCAA national selection committee. She has served as the president of the Lehigh Valley Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women.

Wesner received a bachelor's degree in health and physical education from West Chester in 1971. Wesner and her husband, Doug, reside in Exeter Township. Their son, Joshua, passed away in April 2000 after a courageous battle with Hodgkin's Disease. Their daughter, Sarah, was a member of the field hockey team from 1997-2000, and was a team captain in 2000. She graduated with a degree in social work and a minor in anthropology from KU in 2002. Sarah returned to KU in 2007 as the head women's lacrosse coach, after serving as head field hockey coach and assistant lacrosse coach at Gwynedd-Mercy College.

Assistant Coach Beth Wheeler

Beth Wheeler enters her first year as the assistant coach of both field hockey and women's lacrosse at KU. She was a four-year member of the Roanoke College field hockey team and a three-year member of Roanoke's lacrosse team. Wheeler comes to KU from Saint James School, a boarding school in Saint James, Md., where she coached the girls varsity field hockey team to a 12-3-2 record and a league championship.





Golden Bears Look To Return To The Postseason

After a trip to the semifinals of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference playoffs in 2005, the Kutztown University field hockey team struggled last season and missed out on the playoffs for the first time since 2003.

With a wealth of experience returning on both offense and defense, the Golden Bears, who finished 10-10 overall and 5-9 in the PSAC last season, will look to turn it around and get back into the postseason.

Though the KU offense scored 2.89 goals per game, it sputtered at times, and the Golden Bears will look for a more consistent offense to help returning goalkeeper **Sam Flowers**, a senior who started all 20 games for KU with a 1.98 goals against average. Flowers was saddled with losses in four contests in which she held the opposition to two or fewer goals. She was atop the leaderboard in PSAC play with four shutouts and 10.07 saves per game in her first year as a starter.

Flowers is one of four seniors returning. Defender **Laura Wieder** and forwards **Heather Hoxter** and **Tristin Ludy** round out the senior class. The squad is junior-laden, as seven third-year players who started as sophomores, including **Kelley Healey** who posted 40 points with 18 goals and four assists last season, are back for 2007.

Healey, a two-time All-American, scored 43 points as a freshman en route to winning the 2005 PSAC Rookie of the Year Award.

Junior back **Courtney Geibel**, who started all 20 games last season and won All-PSAC second team honors, will anchor the KU defense in front of Flowers. Junior backs **Holly Hubbard** and **Kristin Snyder** will line up alongside Geibel. Each made their first starts last season after seeing limited action their freshman year.

Snyder, who started in 19 of 20 contests last season, also made an impact on the offensive side of the field, scoring two goals on 20 shots.

KU will look to replace All-America

midfielder **Laura Belfatti**. Her sister, **Jennifer Belfatti**, a junior, will try to pick up where Laura left off. The younger Belfatti tallied two assists in 2006 while starting in five of 16 games played.

Redshirt freshman **Anne Waapu (r-fr. Hastings, NEW ZEALAND)** and true freshman **Abbey Sheeler (fr. Fleetwood/Brandywine)** also will play in the midfield for KU this season.

Together, the midfield will move the ball ahead to Healey, Hoxter or Ludy. Hoxter is the second leading returning scorer from last season's squad, posting 15 points on five goals — two were game-winners — and five assists. Ludy added a goal and two assists in her 14 appearances, three of which were starts.

Sophomore **Alyssa Maltese**, who had a goal and an assist in 11 appearances, also will vie for time at the forward position.

Other returning goal scorers include juniors **Lyndsay Butler** and **Whitney Stum** and sophomores **Lauren Solley** and **Carrie Healey**, younger sister of Kelley.

Junior **Jenna Watt**, sophomore **Madison Weary** and redshirt freshman **Alyson Iovacchini** also return.

KU will welcome in freshmen **Monica Detweiler (fr. Souderton/Christopher Dock HS)**, **Blayke Narehood (fr. Reedsville/Indian Valley HS)**, **Melissa Watson (fr. Virginia Beach, Va./Ocean Lakes HS)**, **Courtney Zook (fr. Oley Valley/Oley Valley HS)** and **Jennifer Williamson (Flemington, NJ/South Hunterdon Regional HS)**.

Jess DeNault (fr. Hamburg/Hamburg), **Jackie Healey (Toms River, NJ/Toms River North HS)** and **Taylor Sukanick (fr. New Tripoli/LCC)** will make their KU debut this year as well. DeNault transferred Lock Haven. Healey, twin sister of Carrie, comes to KU from the University of Delaware. Sukanick is a Lehigh-Carbon Community College transfer.

KU's season gets underway Sept. 1-2 at the Shippensburg Lady Raider Classic.

Facilities



Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty-one of KU's 23 teams have their home venues on campus.

University Field

During the summer of 2005, Kutztown University embarked upon major renovations to University Field, now the home of the Golden Bear field hockey team. Kutztown replaced the natural grass field with new, state-of-the-art, synthetic athletic turf. In addition, the track surrounding the field was re-surfaced and lights were installed and activated in 2006. Around the new field lies a 5,600-seat stadium. It features a state-of-the-art scoreboard that debuted in the fall of 2001.

Keystone Hall (pictured in the background, above) houses the athletics offices, Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room. Keystone Field, the team's former competition field located behind Keystone Hall, will remain in service as a backup game field and practice facility for the Golden Bears.

The Student Recreation Center (pictured in the center background, above) is a 64,623 square foot facility that opened in the fall of 2006. Located between Keystone Hall and University Field, it is THE place to be for student recreation and fitness on campus. Among the amenities are a nearly 9,000 square foot fitness center and weight room, two group fitness studios, two racquetball courts, an indoor rock climbing wall, a synthetic surface gymnasium with curved walls for indoor sports, a synthetic surface half gymnasium, a suspended jogging track (approx. 1/10 mile), an office suite for recreational services staff, a meeting room, retail space/snack bar and locker rooms with jacuzzis.



Risley Weight Room

Athletes get extensive use from the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

Keystone Fieldhouse

Keystone Fieldhouse is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The fieldhouse is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events. It also is used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in January 1995.

2005-06 Dixon Trophy

Kutztown University was the winner of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference's (PSAC) Dixon Trophy for the 2005-06 academic year. The trophy is presented on an annual basis to the league's most successful all-around program.

The Dixon Trophy is named after F. Eugene Dixon, Jr., former chairman of the Board of Governors of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. It is awarded annually to the PSAC member institution that accumulates the most points based on results of conference playoffs and/or regular-season records. Each

institution's point total is calculated by adding its top six men's finishes and top six women's finishes in 21 conference sports.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past 12 years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class. In 2006-07, KU's student-athletes achieved a cumulative grade-point average of 2.91, matching the highest in school history. Also, a record 120 Golden Bears were recognized as Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Scholar Athletes.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

The Monitoring of Progress: The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored.

Course Selection and Registration: In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

Academic Coaching: This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete.

Faculty Advising: This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

Pre-Season Academic Seminars: During pre-season camps and/or the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships and test-taking strategies.

Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors: Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are highly encouraged to visit the Career Services Office.

Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies: Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of the Department of Developmental Studies' services in regard to tutoring or other needs

for specialized instruction.

Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center: Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues.

Library Tour: A library tour is highly recommended of all incoming student-athletes.

Personal Computer: Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

Academic Accomplishment Recognition

The Department of Athletics has developed a comprehensive program to provide incentive for and acknowledgement of the many academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. Below are some examples of the program.

Graduation Reception: The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.

Awards and Honors: KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

Scholar-Athlete Banquet: Each year, the PSAC Scholar-Athletes are recognized at a banquet in their honor.

Dean's List Ceremony: All Kutztown University student-athlete dean's list recipients are acknowledged at a basketball game every year.
