History: Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, PA Department of Education, NCATE, NLNAC, CSWE, NCACE, NASM and NASAD.

Location: Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

Enrollment: Approximately 10,200 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 24 states and 38 nations are represented in the student body: 60% women, 40% men.

Academic Year: Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

Faculty: Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

Majors/Degrees: KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A, B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

Special Academic Programs: There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

Library: Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

Special Facilities: Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 50 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 800 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

Student Life: Nearly 150 student organizations include: academic, advisory councils, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station and student newspaper), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The McFarland Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

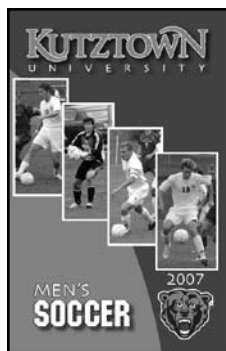
Residence Halls: Fifteen residence facilities (8 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,800 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

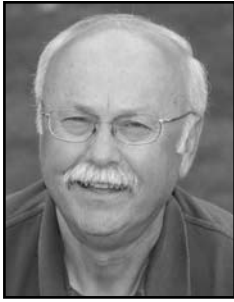

Head Coach **Otto Ormosi**

Otto Ormosi begins his 10th season as head coach of the men's soccer program at Kutztown University. Ormosi's 68-93-11 record in his first nine seasons as head coach gives him the second-most wins in the program's history.

Ormosi's players have won a number of awards in his nine seasons. They have earned 18 All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) awards, including five first-team selections. In 2000, John Lapore was named the PSAC Rookie of the Year. His players

have been named to all-region honors nine times.

From 2002-04, Kutztown finished at or above .500. In 2002, the team was 9-9-2, followed by an 8-7-4 record in 2003 in which the team tied the school record with four PSAC victories. In 2004, the program was 9-9-2.

In 1999, Ormosi guided the Golden Bears to their winningest season in school history. Kutztown was 12-7, shattering the previous wins record of nine set in 1975 and equaled in the 1991. In PSAC action, KU was 4-4. The following year, Ormosi's troops reached 10 wins for just the second time in program history, finishing 10-8-1.

In 1998, Ormosi's first KU squad was 7-11 overall.

Ormosi came to Kutztown from Raritan Valley Community College in Somerville, N.J., where he was the head men's soccer coach from 1988-1997. Over his 10 seasons at Raritan Valley, Ormosi compiled a mark of 102-66-12. He led his team to winning records in seven of his last eight years, and eight regional tournament appearances between 1990 and 1997.

In 1997, Ormosi's final team at Raritan Valley finished 18-4-1. The team won the regional championship and finished with a national ranking of fifth. For his effort, Ormosi was named New Jersey Soccer Coaches Association, Garden State Athletic Conference and National Soccer Coaches Association of America Mid-Atlantic Coach of the Year.

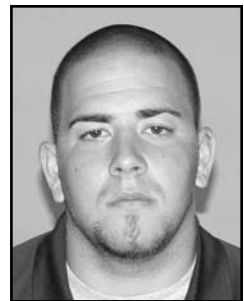
Prior to Raritan Valley, Ormosi was the head soccer coach at Delaware Valley Regional High School from 1984-87. He led his squad to two league titles during that time.

Ormosi, a native of Middlesex, N.J., received a bachelor's degree in education from the College of Emporia (KS) in 1970. He holds a master's degree in physical education and athletic administration from Trenton State College (now the College of New Jersey). He and his wife, Linda, reside in Ottsville.

Assistant Coach **Ricky Mucelli**

Ricky Mucelli, a former PSAC Player of the Year, will be in his first year of coaching at Kutztown University.

Mucelli is a three-time member of the All-PSAC First Team, accumulating 14 goals and 15 assists in his three years at West Chester University (2004-06). Last year, he was named NSCAA first-team All-Northeast Region. Mucelli played for the Reading Rage in 2005 and has worked with the Berks Soccer Academy for two seasons. He was an all-state soccer standout at Kutztown High School. Prior to coming to KU, Mucelli was active as a trainer and counselor at many summer soccer camps.





Young Golden Bears Look to Improve Offense in 2007

The Kutztown University men's soccer team has health and experience on its side to start the 2007 season. Three seniors and a now-healthy **Greg Sassaman** lead an experienced group of six sophomores and four juniors into the new campaign.

KU, which finished 2-17-1 overall and 2-13-1 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, will look to ignite an offense that struggled last season, scoring just eight goals.

Otto Ormosi, heading into his 10th year as the head men's soccer coach, believes that number will go up.

"If we stay healthy, we're going to score a lot more goals," he said.

Sassaman, who tallied just an assist last year after playing only 11 games because of an injury, hopes to return to his 2005 form when he scored five goals and four assists. He had a productive spring, scoring seven goals in three games, and Ormosi expects that type of play out of his senior forward.

Jake Young (so. Blandon/Fleetwood), a transfer from Division I Syracuse, will play alongside Sassaman this season. Young started in two games and played in seven last season for the Orange. He had 36 goals and 27 assists in high school, leading Fleetwood to a 67-27-3 record in his four years.

Rusty Chapel, a sophomore who recorded an assist with nine starts and 20 appearances, sophomores **Joe Carmina** and **Carl Gompf (so. Milford/Delaware Valley Regional)** and junior **Bill Frosoni** return to solidify a deep corps of forwards.

Matt Kade, who tallied a goal and an assist last season, will provide the senior leadership in the midfield. He will play inside, along with junior **Nicholas Forte**, who will have more of an attacking role. Kade will play a more defensive-minded game in the midfield.

Sophomore **Jason Lear** and junior **Charlie Kulp** are slated to play the outside midfield positions.

Ryan Mudgett (fr. Topton/Brandywine Heights), **Raul Velasquez (fr. Macungie/Emmaus)**, **James Robinson (jr. Ellesmere Port,**

ENGLAND) and **Keegan Moyer (jr. Blandon/Fleetwood)**, a transfer from St. Joseph's, will make their KU debut this season, and all could get a chance to play in the midfield.

Incoming freshman **Pat Vymazal (fr. Kutztown/Kutztown)**, who Ormosi says has "terrific speed," also will vie for playing time in the midfield. Vymazal, as is the case for several other players, is talented in more than just one position.

"We are very versatile," Ormosi said. "We have players who can play two positions equally well."

Senior **Collin Dalton**, who played in the midfield last season, will move back to play defense in front of senior goalkeeper **Ryan Kratz**. Dalton is a three-year starter for the Golden Bears. Kratz, a 6-foot-1 keeper, had a 2.67 goals against average in his first full season as a starter last year. He also recorded shutouts in the two Golden Bear wins last season.

Sophomore **Matthew Fredericks** will back up Kratz again this year, along with incoming freshman **Shawn Knash (fr. Honesdale/Honesdale HS)**.

The defense struggled last season, allowing 53 goals, and Ormosi attributed the defensive struggles to the fact that KU spent much of its time playing in its zone.

"We played defense for too long," he said. "Defensively, we're much improved from last year."

Dalton, with help from sophomore defenders **John Ferguson** and **Mike Choiniere**, will look to lead KU's defensive turnaround. Choiniere is the Golden Bears' leading returning scorer from last season, as he tallied five points on two goals and an assist.

Sophomores **Brian Waller** and **Chris Ponto**, along with newcomer **Thomas Bangert (jr. Bietigheim, GERMANY)**, also could play into the mix on defense.

With back-to-back home games to start the season and four games in 10 days, KU will find out quickly how much its defense and offense has improved.

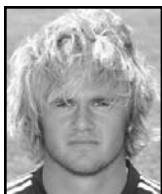

Facilities

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty-one of KU's 23 teams have their home venues on campus.

Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the mecca of indoor athletic activity on campus. The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the volleyball, men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams. Additionally, it served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams and a state-of-the-art fitness room.

Keystone Field ▶

Located behind Keystone Hall, Keystone Field includes the 300-seat grass home to the Golden Bear men's and women's soccer programs. The facility debuted in 1999.

Athletes get extensive use out of the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

Practice Fields

Kutztown expanded its practice facilities in the spring of 2004 to include new fields for field hockey and soccer on KU's North Campus.

Keystone Field House ▶

Keystone Field House is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The field house is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events and many camps and clinics throughout the year. It also is used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in 1995.

The 64,623 square foot student recreation center opened in the fall of 2006. Among the amenities are a nearly 9,000 sq. ft. fitness center and weight room, two group fitness studios, two racquetball

courts, an indoor rock climbing wall, a synthetic surface gymnasium with curved walls for indoor sports, a synthetic surface half gymnasium, a suspended jogging track (approx. 1/10 mile), an office suite for recreational services staff, a meeting room, retail space/snack bar and locker rooms with jacuzzis.

2005-06 Dixon Trophy

Kutztown University was the winner of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference's (PSAC) Dixon Trophy for the 2005-06 academic year. The trophy is presented on an annual basis to the league's most successful all-around program.

The Dixon Trophy is named after F. Eugene Dixon, Jr., former chairman of the Board of Governors of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. It is awarded annually to the PSAC member institution that accumulates the most points based on results of conference playoffs and/or regular-season

records. Each institution's point total is calculated by adding its top six men's finishes and top six women's finishes in 21 conference sports.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past 12 years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class. In 2006-07, KU's student-athletes achieved a cumulative grade-point average of 2.91, matching the highest in school history. Also, a record 120 Golden Bears were recognized as Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Scholar Athletes.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

The Monitoring of Progress: The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored.

Course Selection and Registration: In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

Academic Coaching: This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete.

Faculty Advising: This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

Pre-Season Academic Seminars: During pre-season camps and/or the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships and test-taking strategies.

Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors: Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are highly encouraged to visit the Career Services Office.

Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies: Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of the Department of Developmental Studies' services in regard to tutoring or

other needs for specialized instruction.

Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center: Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues.

Library Tour: A library tour is highly recommended of all incoming student-athletes.

Personal Computer: Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

Academic Accomplishment Recognition

The Department of Athletics has developed a comprehensive program to provide incentive for and acknowledgement of the many academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. Below are some examples of the program.

Graduation Reception: The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.

Awards and Honors: KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

Scholar-Athlete Banquet: Each year, the PSAC Scholar-Athletes are recognized at a banquet in their honor.

Dean's List Ceremony: All Kutztown University student-athlete dean's list recipients are acknowledged at a basketball game every year.
