# A Look at Kutztown University of Pennsylvania



**History:** Kutztown University of Pennsylvania, a member of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, was founded in 1866 as Keystone Normal School. It became Kutztown State Teachers College in 1928, Kutztown State College in 1960, and achieved university status in 1983. Today, Kutztown University is a modern, comprehensive institution and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, PA Department of Education, NCATE, NLNAC, CSWE, NCACE, NASM and NASAD.

**Location:** Kutztown University's picturesque 325-acre campus is located in a Pennsylvania Dutch community mid-way between Allentown and Reading. Several large cities are easily accessible, including Philadelphia and New York.

**Enrollment:** Approximately 10,200 full- and part-time undergraduate and graduate students. Most are Pennsylvania residents, but students from 24 states and 38 nations are represented in the student body: 60% women, 40% men.

**Academic Year:** Consists of two 15-week terms. The university also offers classes during two five-week summer sessions.

**Faculty:** Teaching-focused with scholarly expertise; many are engaged in research, student/faculty research, writing and consulting. There is a 19:1 student/faculty ratio.

**Majors/Degrees:** KU has nearly 60 undergraduate majors in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Education. There are 19 graduate degree programs within the College of Graduate Studies and Extended Learning. Degrees at Kutztown include the B.A., B.F.A., B.S.B.A., B.S.N., B.S.W., B.S.Ed.; M.A., M.B.A., M.P.A., M.L.S., M.S., and M.Ed.

**Special Academic Programs:** There are honors programs throughout the undergraduate curriculum, Phi Kappa Phi and Alpha Epsilon Lambda national honor societies, 17 international exchange and study abroad programs, freshmen seminars, independent study, internships, four MBA locations, and diversified and intensive academic support services.

**Library:** Modern, spacious facility; 517,000 bound volumes, as well as thousands of maps, periodicals and microforms; Endeavor integrated library system; numerous Web databases; Internet; electronic full-text periodical databases; 191 computers, including laptops; 527 network connections; seating for 800 patrons.

**Special Facilities:** Wireless campus, gallery, planetarium, observatory, TV production facilities, 50 student-accessible computer labs containing nearly 800 PCs/Macs, cartography lab, early learning center, smart classrooms, curriculum materials center and Pennsylvania German Heritage Center.

**Student Life:** Nearly 150 student organizations include: academic, advisory councils, campus media (including a fully-equipped radio station and student newspaper), diversified interest, Greek Life, performing arts, public service, special interest, sports (club and recreation) and visual arts affiliates. Entertainment options include concerts, dances, lectures, comedy, excursions and cultural events. The McFarland Student Union houses the bookstore, movie theater, game room, snack bar, TV lounge, coffeehouse, financial center and cyberlounge.

**Residence Halls:** Fifteen residence facilities (8 coed, 2 single gender, 2 modified single gender), two apartment-style coed complexes and one residence house accommodate 4,800 students. All residence halls are wired for cable TV, telephone, Internet and campus network access.

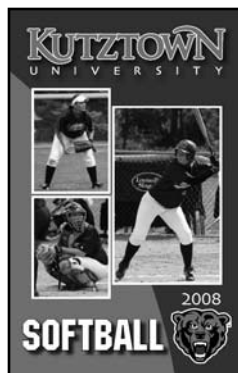

## Head Coach Judy Lawes

Judy Lawes begins her 21st season as head softball coach at Kutztown University.

The 2007 season was a remarkable one for the Golden Bears, as KU set school records for overall (43) and Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division (22) wins. KU won the regular-season PSAC East crown, and hosted both the PSAC and NCAA Mid-Atlantic regional tournaments for the first time. The Bears finished second and fifth, respectively, in the tournaments. KU set single-season PSAC records in four team and seven individual categories, as well as program records in 17 team and 18 individual categories. Lawes was named the PSAC East Coach of the Year.

Lawes has had a winning year in every one of her 20 seasons at KU. She has led the Golden Bears to a record of 547-348-2, which ranks among the top 25 active Division II coaches. She recorded her 500th victory in a 7-6 win over Millersville in 2006. Among her wins, 257 have come against PSAC East foes. Lawes is Kutztown's winningest coach in school history, regardless of sport. Since the 2000 season alone, Kutztown has recorded 246 victories.

Lawes has led the Golden Bears to all ten of their appearances in the NCAA Division II Tournament in the school's history. She guided them to three-straight appearances in 1994-96 and then every year from 2000-07. Lawes has also guided Kutztown to 12 PSAC playoff appearances, including four runner-up finishes (1988, 1989, 1996, 2007).

Many honors have been bestowed upon Lawes for her coaching accomplishments. She was named PSAC East Coach of the Year in 1989, 1994, 2000 and 2007. Lawes also garnered the Dr. Dorothy Moyer Award in 1994, 1995, 2000 and 2007, which is presented to the KU Coach of the Year for women's athletics. Other accomplishments include setting the school record for overall wins (43) in 2007 and wins in the Eastern Division (22) in 2007. Additionally, her team won a share of the PSAC East title in 1994 and won the title outright in 2007.

Lawes came to KU in 1987 as head softball and women's tennis coach and assistant women's basketball coach. She held the basketball position until 1990 and the tennis position until 1991.

Lawes also serves as the director of the Judy O'Connell softball camp for girls, one of the top youth camps in the area.

A graduate of Shippensburg University, Lawes received her bachelor's degree in communications in 1984 and her master's degree in counseling/student personnel from Shippensburg in 1987. In October of 2001, she was inducted into Shippensburg's Athletic Hall of Fame for her record-setting accomplishments as a softball and tennis player.

Lawes and her husband, Robert, have a daughter, Rachel (14), and a son, Ryan (8).



## Assistant Coach Brianne Barona

Brianne Barona is in her second season as an assistant coach. Barona, then Brianne Homyak, was a standout basketball and softball player during her tenure at Kutztown. A four-year starter in softball, she was a 1999 All-PSAC East second team honoree. She was also named the 1997-98 KU Female Rookie of the Year. She scored 1,248 points and was a two-time all-conference first-team selection in basketball. Barona is currently in her third year teaching at William Allen High School in special education. She and her husband, Sammy, a former KU men's basketball standout, had a baby boy, Sammy, Jr. on July 6, 2007.



## Assistant Coach Jodie Swavely

Jodie Swavely enters her first year with the Golden Bears. Swavely was a standout pitcher at Indiana University of Pennsylvania from 2003-06. She set the school's career record for strikeouts (643) and shares the program record for wins (62). She was a four-time All-PSAC West selection. Swavely graduated from IUP in 2006 with a degree in health administration.



### Golden Bears Look for Home Run Season in 2008

There's an old Nike commercial that makes the statement "Chicks dig the longball." The same can be said for the Kutztown University softball team, which not only digs the long ball, but this team digs just about every other offensive statistic there is.

After rewriting the KU and Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference softball record books in 2007, the majority of Kutztown's heavy hitters and its sophomore pitching ace return in 2008, looking to make another run deep into the post season.

Head coach **Judy Lawes**, who enters her 21st season, led the Golden Bears to the 2007 PSAC East title, a second place finish in the conference tournament and a fifth-place showing at the NCAA Division II Mid-Atlantic Regional.

KU batted .349 as a team and scored 416 runs. Six players who batted better than .300 return for the 2008 season.

The Golden Bears' potent offense is fueled by **Steph Denlinger**. The 2007 PSAC East Player of the Year and National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) and Daktronics first-team All-America selection, Denlinger finished her sophomore campaign with a .507 (73-for-144) batting average in 54 games. She had 24 home runs, 73 RBIs, 70 runs scored and 51 walks. She led the nation in home runs per game (0.24) and slugging percentage (1.111), and set PSAC single-season records for runs, RBI, homers, slugging percentage and walks last year. She also established KU single-season records for batting average, total bases and on-base percentage, while shattering KU's career home run record with 40 in just two seasons. The third-year first baseman is projected to move up in the lineup to the leadoff spot to provide some additional plate appearances.

**Ashley Fitzgerald** (.396, 11 HR, 61 RBI), a second-team NFCA All-American as a utility player, and **Caitlin Hague** (.325, 12 RBI) will share time at catcher. Fitzgerald was also named first-team All-PSAC East, and was one of two players with a school-record 20 doubles last year.

The rest of the Golden Bears infield will include **Kim Morrison** at second and **Krista Cameron** at third, while there will be a position battle at shortstop between **Anne Arbogast**, **Emily Fazekas** and incoming freshman

**Krista Tedjeske** (Summerhill/Forest Hills). Morrison and Cameron were All-PSAC East and all-region selections at their respective positions last season. Cameron batted .359 with 16 home runs and 66 RBI last year. She also had 20 doubles, a single-season record, and has 26 home runs in two seasons, second to Denlinger on KU's career chart. Morrison hit .329 with three dingers and 53 runs scored and 31 batted in. Newcomer **Alex Najpauer** (fr. **Topton/Brandywine Heights**) will provide depth.

In the outfield, senior **Kathy Gregg** (.337, 25 runs, 7 RBI) will move from right to center field. Senior **Sam Flowers**, Fitzgerald and newcomer **Maggie Reifsnnyder** (fr. **Philadelphia/Little Flower**) will share time in right field, while sophomore **Maria Schiavo**, who batted .324 last season and was named to the PSAC East's second team, will start in left field.

Providing depth in the outfield will be **Nicole Hannum** (fr. **Horsham/Hatboro-Horsham**), **Angela Domenici** (fr. **Kunkletown/Pleasant Valley**) and **Joanna Spangler** (fr. **York/Central York**).

**Tami Wambold** will see time as designated hitter. She had two homers and three RBI in just 17 at-bats as a rookie last year.

KU is expected to have a deeper pitching staff in 2007, to support sophomore ace **Katlin Arbogast**.

Arbogast, the 2007 PSAC East Rookie and Pitcher of the Year and first-team All-Region selection, finished the season with a record of 27-9 in 32 starts. She pitched 29 complete games and had five shutouts. She set single-season school records for wins, strikeouts (287), complete games, innings pitched (249.1) and appearances (40).

Also returning to the circle will be sophomore **Christie McIntyre**, who saw limited time as a rookie last season.

KU also will look for production out of its freshmen pitchers this year. **Monica Glomb** (fr. **Mars/Mars**), **Mary Hoch** (fr. **Somerton/St. Hubert**), Reifsnnyder and **Lauren Doering** (**Brampton, ONT.**) join the staff this season. Glomb, like Arbogast, has several pitches to work with, while Hoch and Reifsnnyder are power pitchers.

Kutztown University is blessed with some of the top athletic facilities among Division II colleges and universities in the eastern United States. Twenty-one of KU's 23 teams have their home venues on campus.

### Keystone Hall

The headquarters of the KU athletic department, Keystone Hall is the hub of indoor athletic activity on campus. The 3,400-seat Keystone Arena, located in the center of Keystone Hall, is the home of the volleyball, men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams. Keystone Hall also houses the Golden Bear Sports Medicine department, designated locker rooms for all intercollegiate athletic teams, and a state-of-the-art fitness room. The arena also served as the site of a town meeting by President George W. Bush in 2004.

### North Campus Field ▶

KU's North Campus Softball Field is the home of the Golden Bear softball team. It was the host site of the 2007 PSAC and Mid-Atlantic Regional tournaments. The facility includes dugouts, hitting cages and an infield tarp. Dimensions for the field are 190 to right and left field and 220 to center.



### ◀ Risley Weight Room

Athletes get extensive use out of the free-weight room, located on the ground floor of Risley Hall, the original gym. The weight room was recently renovated and expanded.

### Keystone Field House ▶

Keystone Field House is home to the KU men's and women's indoor track teams, and has been the site of major eastern championships in recent years. The field house is used by all teams for indoor practice and overflow athletic events and many camps and clinics throughout the year. It is also used for non-athletic events, such as President Clinton's address during his visit in 1995.

The 64,623 square foot student recreation center opened in the fall of 2006. The facility, located between Keystone Hall and University Field, is THE place to be for student recreation and fitness on campus. Among the amenities are a nearly 9,000 sq. ft. fitness center and weight room, two group fitness studios, two racquetball

courts, an indoor rock climbing wall, a synthetic surface gymnasium with curved walls for indoor sports, a synthetic surface half gymnasium, a suspended jogging track (approx. 1/10 mile), an office suite for recreational services staff, a meeting room, retail space/snack bar and locker rooms with jacuzzis.

## 2005-06 Dixon Trophy

Kutztown University was the winner of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference's (PSAC) Dixon Trophy for the 2005-06 academic year. The trophy is presented on an annual basis to the league's most successful all-around program.

The Dixon Trophy is named after F. Eugene Dixon, Jr., former chairman of the Board of Governors of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. It is awarded annually to the PSAC member institution that accumulates the most points based on results of conference playoffs and/or regular-season records. Each institution's

point total is calculated by adding its top six men's finishes and top six women's finishes in 21 conference sports.

## Academics & Athletics at KU

---

The **KU Academic Success Initiative**, when fully implemented by the coaching staff, provides the appropriate support, incentive, and opportunity for students to make a similar effort toward their academic success as made toward their athletic performance. The Initiative is based on the expectation that both individual and team academic performance will be at or above the level of the overall student body. This expectation is built into the evaluation of coaches and is an integral part of the process of awarding athletic scholarships. KU provides athletic scholarships to support the academic pursuits of its student-athletes. Student-athletes are expected to participate in sports because they love to do so.

Continuing indications reveal that the Initiative works and is having a profound and measurable effect on both academic and athletic performance. Over the past 12 years, KU's freshman class of student-athletes has had a significantly higher grade-point average than the overall freshman class. In 2006-07, KU's student-athletes achieved a cumulative grade-point average of 2.91, matching the highest in school history. Also, a record 120 Golden Bears were recognized as Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Scholar Athletes.

The **KU Academic Success Initiative** contains the following components:

**The Monitoring of Progress:** The academic progress of student-athletes is continually tracked and monitored.

**Course Selection and Registration:** In order to avoid unnecessary conflicts between athletic events and classes, student-athletes are provided a registration date earlier than the rest of the campus student population. Registration is now done online via the Internet. Students can go online at any time to view their schedule, grades, transcript, financial aid, payments, charges and restrictions on their account.

**Academic Coaching:** This year-long program is based on one-on-one personal contacts between the coach and the student-athlete.

**Faculty Advising:** This is an essential part of the college experience and is often a major factor in the ultimate academic success of students. Advisor meetings are required in order to register for classes.

**Pre-Season Academic Seminars:** During pre-season camps and/or the first week of classes, athletes may participate in seminars addressing topics such as time management, study skills, class participation, student/faculty relationships and test-taking strategies.

**Career Services Visit For Undeclared Majors:** Incoming students who have not yet declared a major or who may be unsure of their chosen major are highly encouraged to visit the Career Services Office.

**Referrals For Services to the Department of Developmental Studies:** Student-athletes are strongly encouraged to make use of the Department of Developmental Studies' services in regard to tutoring or other needs

for specialized instruction.

**Referrals For Services to the Counseling and Advisement Center:** Trained counselors/faculty advisors are available to help with psychological/academic counseling/advisement issues.

**Library Tour:** A library tour is highly recommended of all incoming student-athletes.

**Personal Computer:** Each student-athlete is strongly encouraged to have access to a networked personal computer.

### Academic Accomplishment Recognition

The Department of Athletics has developed a comprehensive program to provide incentive for and acknowledgement of the many academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. Below are some examples of the program.

**Graduation Reception:** The athletic department hosts a reception for graduating student-athletes and their families at the winter and spring commencement ceremonies to recognize the culmination of student-athletes' education at Kutztown University.

**Awards and Honors:** KU offers specific academic scholarships available only to student-athletes. KU student-athletes are nominated for all available NCAA, PSAC and CoSIDA awards.

**Scholar-Athlete Banquet:** Each year, the PSAC Scholar-Athletes are recognized at a banquet in their honor.

**Dean's List Ceremony:** All Kutztown University student-athlete dean's list recipients are acknowledged at a basketball game every year.
