How to cite an article or publication retrieved from an electronic database using MLA Style.

If you are citing an article that you retrieved from an online database that the library subscribes to, you should provide enough information so that the reader is able to retrieve the article from the online database.

The generic citation form would look like this:

Author. "Title of Article." Publication Name Volume Number (if necessary)

Publication Date: page number-page number. Database name. Service

name. Kutztown University Library, Kutztown, PA. Date of access

<electronic address of the database>.

Example:

Arroyo, Carmen G. and Edward Zigler. "Racial Identity, Academic Achievement, and the Psychological Well-Being of Economically Disadvantaged Adolescents." Journal of Personality and Social Psychology 69.5 (1995): 903-914. PsycINFO. EBSCOhost. Kutztown University Library, Kutztown, PA. 17 March 2004 <<http://search.epnet.com>>.

Some Tips:

- Author initials should be followed by periods and separated by a space (for example: Smith, R. K.).
- Publication months should be abbreviated as follows: Jan., Feb., Mar., Apr., May, June, July, Aug., Sept., Oct., Nov., Dec.
- Dates should appear in the order: day month year.

A special note for EBSCO and ProQuest:

EBSCO and ProQuest are the company names of our two largest database vendors. They do not refer to the databases that you are using. When citing an article you retrieved from either of these databases, you will need to note which database you are using (e.g. Academic Search Premier, Business Source Premier, ERIC, and etc. when using EBSCO). If you are using ProQuest and you simply clicked on Continue (to search all databases), simply note ProQuest as

the database and <http://www.proquest.com/> as the url (technically, you should note which database the article was from, see a librarian for more assistance).
