The grant money is being used to study the impact of hypoxia (low oxygen) on Lake Erie fish assemblages and to assess the activity patterns of the invasive round goby in Lake Erie. Jason Buckley, a junior biology student at Kutztown University, is working with Professor Winslow on this project.
