Abstract: This presentation will include the use/creation of Bitmoji's to help keep students engaged, creating a Bitmoji "classroom" or an "advising" office. We will also discuss the use of software programs to help students feel connected and can interact with their peers while learning in an online/remote environment.

About the speaker: Dr. Bazley has been at Kutztown University since Fall of 2008 and is an Associate Professor in the Department of Elementary, Middle Level, Library and Technologies Education (EMLT) in the College of Education. She teaches both undergraduate and graduate classes in diversity, children's literature, math, foundations of teaching and theory and development. Dr. Bazley created and has run the Alaska Distance Intervention program since 2010, which has led to student teaching positions and permanent teaching jobs in Alaska. Dr. Bazley has published numerous articles in the area of diversity, literature, has a textbook publication called *Teaching Diversity Through Children's Literature* and is currently writing a textbook examining differences in international educational systems.
