Abstract: This workshop will examine different tools and software that can be incorporated into your zoom classes to help students stay engaged and interact with your lectures/lessons.

About the speaker: Dr. Kristen Bazley has been at Kutztown University since Fall of 2008 and is an Associate Professor in the Department of Elementary, Middle Level, Library and Technologies Education (EMLT). Dr. Bazley came from Tampa, FL, where she taught in Tampa's highly diverse public-school system. She teaches both undergraduate and graduate classes in diversity, children's literature, foundations of teaching, and theory and development. Dr. Bazley created and has run the Alaska Distance Intervention program since 2010, which enables teacher candidates to tutor students remotely in Bush Alaska. She is also the advisor of the student organizations, Association of Childhood Education International, Alpha Sigma Tau, and the Kutztown Equestrian Team. Dr. Bazley has published a textbook *Teaching Diversity through Children's Literature*, and numerous articles in the area of diversity and literature.
