Career Center Highlights and New Initiatives

- Continued strengthening the newly-designed micro-internship program.
 The inaugural group of eight (8) employers created and offered nine (9) micro-internships for students.
- A portion of Clark Associates and Enterprise donations provided the ability to offer twelve (12) students a \$1,000 scholarship from the Fund for Unpaid Interns.
- Mock Interview Mania weeks in both Fall & Spring connected 202 students with 39 local recruiters for in-person, practice interviews.
- Partnered with The Washington Center (TWC) to secure additional state-funded scholarships, enabling students to participate in their week-long academic seminars at no cost. As a result, 18 students attended the January Presidential Inauguration seminar, 3 attended the May National Security seminar, and 5 students participated in the Summer 2024 internship program at a significantly reduced cost.
- The Career Center, in partnership with the Men's Golf Club and College of Business, hosted its third annual Career Classic fundraising golf event in September at Golden Oaks Golf Club. In addition to golfing and networking, 120 registrants had the option to select and play golf with 12 students during their round of golf. An additional 12 students participated in the networking event.
- The Career Closet provided professional clothing to just under 200 students, who purchased 473 professional clothing items at just \$2 per piece, with some given to students at no cost.
- Continued to partner with faculty of Freshman Year Seminars, Senior Seminars and other courses to incorporate the Career Development Certificate program into their courses for 774 students.
- Staff members earned two professional development certificates from the Pennsylvania Association of Colleges and Employers (PennACE) International and LGBTQA+ Student Supporter Certificates.
- Jeann Cengeri, office manager, was awarded KU Employee of Month for July.
- Jenelle Henry, assistant director, has been honored with the prestigious Donna Dentler Service Award by the Pennsylvania Association of Colleges and Employers. This award recognizes members who have demonstrated exceptional service and commitment to the association.

Special Events and Services


The CDC coordinates numerous career events for students. Here are just a few:

Student Engagement with the Career Center:

- Highest-ever undergraduate student engagement remained high at 54%.
- With the addition of a new Criminal Justice Career Fair and strong overall attendance across all events, a record-breaking 1,277 students participated in career fairs this year—the highest number in KU's recent history.

Career Coaching/Counseling Appointments

On-on-one career coaching/counseling appointments returned to regular levels over the past few years, excluding 2023-24. Freshmen and Sophomores had the most appointments and the top topics of discussion included career choice, academic major choice, internship and job search strategies.
