Registration Information

Kutztown students that are active can find directions on how to register through MyKU at Registrar's Office - Kutztown University.

Non-Kutztown students can complete the electronic registration form by clicking the Non-KU link on the Kutztown Summer website Summer Sessions - Kutztown University.

Registration in Undergraduate courses for the Summer does NOT admit a student to a regular degree program at Kutztown University or establish any priority for admission. Non-KU students registering for Graduate-level courses (with the exception of Art Institute courses) must also complete the Graduate Admissions Application at Apply to Kutztown Graduate programs - Kutztown University.

Registration and course enrollment is not complete until payment is made in full.

Health & Wellness Services

Clinical Services

Clinical Services is located on the first floor of the Health & Wellness Center at Beck Hall. Currently enrolled students who have completed the required electronic medical forms and have paid the health center fee may utilize services. 	Important Information (Numerical and Alphabetical)
Overload Approval	Neither Undergraduate nor Graduate students should attempt more than nine (9) semester hours of credit in either Summer I or Summer II. A course load of more than 9 hours in either session requires the approval of the Department Chair for Undergraduates and approval from the Graduate Dean for Graduate students.
Parking	In summer, students do not need to register their cars on campus. See Public Safety website for restrictions.
Repeating a course	Undergraduate students will be limited to a <i>maximum</i> total of <i>six</i> (6) repeats. A single course can be repeated a <i>maximum</i> of <i>three</i> (3) times. Only the most recent grade will be calculated in the GPA and the total credits needed for graduation. The course <i>must</i> be repeated at Kutztown. Students must obtain permission from the Dean of the student's major to take a course beyond the maximum number of repeats for an individual course OR the overall maximum repeats. Graduate and Post-Baccalaureate students can repeat a single course for graduate improvement only once. They will be limited to a maximum of two repeats across the program. The most recent grade (regardless of whether it is higher or lower) will be the grade used for the GPA calculation.

2024 Chincoteague Bay Field Station of the Marine Science Consortium

Kutztown University is a member of the Chincoteague Bay Field Station of the Marine Science Consortium (CBFS) located in Wallops Island, VA. Through this affiliation we are able to offer three-week long, field-based summer courses for students at the field station in Wallops Island, VA. The CBSF facilities include state-of-the-art classrooms and laboratories, dormitories, and a cafeteria. The CBSF also operates a number of research vessels for use in teaching and research.

Registration Procedures and Information

Kutztown University students should register with the fields station first through the link listed below then register with the University.

There are also other college courses being offered at the CBFS for summer 2024. Students should check the CBFS website at **CBFS Summer College Courses (cbfieldstation.org)** to find out more about these other courses and the registration procedures for the sponsoring universities.

Students planning on counting non-KU CBFS courses toward their major should consult with their faculty advisor regarding course selection and appropriate course registration procedures. Students will also need to file a **PASSHE Visiting Student** form for these courses prior to the start of the course.

Students must register both through the CBFS Website AND through the sponsoring university.

There are 2 fees:

1. A non-refundable deposit of \$125 (\$769 for travel courses) per course is required. The non-refundable deposit is applied to the total amount due. The respective deposit is due immediately upon receipt of invoice. Invoices will be sent out beginning January 2, 2024. Courses are on a first come first served basis. In order to have your seat saved in the class you must pay your deposit(s). The remaining amount will be billed to you separately. You will receive separate deposits for each course you registered for, so please make sure you pay all the deposits necessary.

If you decide to switch courses, your course deposit will be transferred. The deposit is not refundable if you voluntarily drop the class, fail to meet the stated prerequisites, or fail to complete enrollment at the offering university. The deposit is not refundable if you are excluded for non-payment of CBFS fees. The deposit is refundable if the course is cancelled.

Art Education Study Institute for the Professional Development of Teachers

The Summer Institutes for Art Educators are held in the summer months that correspond to Public School summer vacation schedules. The Institutes provide intensive one to two week instruction in art education and its related fields of study. Art Education and Visual Studies classes meet for one week, all studio courses run for two weeks. The Institutes connect students with community resources and visiting artist/scholars. The Institutes are designed to provide in-depth experiences that are unavailable through regular coursework.

Registration will begin March 11, 2024 and will end one week prior to the start of the Institute. No refunds will be given after the start of class.

ARU 525 Community of Care: Social Emotional Growth in Art Settings

Carrie Nordlund, Ph.D. Workshop: June 24th - 27th 9:00am to 4:00pm Online: June 28th - July 19th

Caring in, with, and through, the arts can be intentional, purposeful, and foundational. This Institute is designed to offer four days of concentrated artistic exploration on the role art education could play in fostering climates of care and relationships supportive of social and emotional learning in art settings. The content is appropriate for and adaptable to all ages, pre-K through adult learners. On-site workshops will meet from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM Monday through Thursday on June 24th, 25th, 26th, and 27th in the Sharadin Arts Building. The Institute offers Act 48 credits for completion. An optional three-credit asynchronous online course will build on the work from the Institute from June 28th through July 19th. Class enrollment is limited to 15 students. Limited enrollment for Act 48 noncredit students.

ARU 556 PATCHWORK PEDAGOGY: Using Collage and Assemblage to Reinforce Memory, Create Connection, and Foster Belonging

Dr. Julia L. Hovanec Workshop: July 15th – 18th 9:00am – 4:00pm Online: July 19th - August 8th

In this institute, learners will use collage and assemblage to reinforce memory, create connection, and foster belonging. Participants will piece together various engaging and artistic encounters and strategies as their colleagues and students create collages and assemblages. The work will be layered with meaning and filled with purpose. Learners will recollect, affix, link, fasten, bridge, and secure while considering inclusivity and memory-making. Through art encounters and other unique experiences, educators gain the concrete skills, knowledge, and dispositions necessary to help them construct, co-construct, and transform curricula, teaching, and learning. The shared content and strategies are appropriate for and adaptable to all ages, Pre-K through adult learners. The institute features workshops, projects, presenters, and a field trip to bolster pedagogy. The onsite workshop/institute will take place July 15th through July 18th and offers Act 48 credits for completion. The 3-credit asynchronous online course, which runs from July 19th through August 8th, builds on the patchwork pedagogy presented in the institute.

ARU 541 Transformative Justice and Community Building Through Storytelling

Dra. Leslie C. Sotomayor Workshop: June 17th— 21st 8:00am—4:00pm Online: June 3rd - 14th

Transformative Justice and Community Building Through Storytelling Summer Institute experience focuses on actionable social change through art studio practice and education. The four-week intensive course will be during Summer Session I, May 28th-June 21st. Three weeks are online, and one-week is in person. The reflexive online component will include readings, films, journal prompts, CR-SE standard requirements, and resources for curricular and learning implementations. The on-site in-person one-week ACT 48 Credit summer institute experience during June 3-7, 2024, between 8am-4pm, will focus on studio arts practice and participatory community building. We will screen the new film, Pardon Me with director and creator, Shuja Moore and through Connection Works offer free Pardon Coach training and certification. Artists talks and studio workshops include working with regional artists and field trips centering community building efforts and care ethics.


