Registration Information

Kutztown students that are active can find directions on how to register through MyKU at **Registrar's Office - Kutztown University**.

Non-Kutztown students can complete the electronic registration form by clicking the Non-KU link on the Kutztown Summer website **Summer Sessions - Kutztown University**.

Registration in Undergraduate courses for the Summer does NOT admit a student to a regular degree program at Kutztown University or establish any priority for admission. Non-KU students registering for Graduate-level courses (with the exception of Art Institute courses) must also complete the Graduate Admissions Application at **Apply to Kutztown Graduate programs - Kutztown University**.

Registration and course enrollment is not complete until payment is made in full.

Health & Wellness Services

Clinical Services

Clinical Services is located on the first floor of the Health & Wellness Center at Beck Hall. Currently enrolled students who have completed the required electronic medical forms and have paid the health center fee may utilize services. Summer session hours are 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. No physician appointments are available. Over-the-counter medication may be accessed through a self-care station. Although nursing appointments are available without additional charge, some specialized services require a nominal fee (prescription medications, laboratory testing, etc.) and will be charged to the student's account. Required Medical Forms

Undergraduate Students: Matriculated undergraduate students attending on-campus courses must complete the required electronic medical forms. Transient students may waive the health record requirement by completing a waiver document. If a transient student utilizes Clinical Services, the required medical forms must be completed.

Graduate, Post-Baccalaureate, and Professional Credit Students: Submission of required medical forms may be waived through a separate document unless a student is living on campus or uses campus Clinical Services.

Important Information (Numerical and Alphabetical)	
Overload Approval	Neither Undergraduate nor Graduate students should attempt more than nine (9) semester hours of credit in either Summer I or Summer II. A course load of more than 9 hours in either session requires the approval of the Department Chair for Undergraduates and approval from the Graduate Dean for Graduate students.
Parking	In summer, students do not need to register their cars on campus. See Public Safety website for restrictions.
Permit to Study at Another Institution (Undergraduate)	Undergraduate students wishing to study at another college and transfer the credits earned to Kutztown must obtain permission, in writing, prior to enrollment. This form is available at Forms - Kutztown University .
Repeating a course	Undergraduate students will be limited to a maximum total of six (6) repeats. A single course can be repeated a maximum of three (3) times. Only the most recent grade will be calculated in the GPA and the total credits needed for graduation. The course must be repeated at Kutztown. Students must obtain permission from the Dean of the student's major to take a course beyond the maximum number of repeats for an individual course OR the overall maximum repeats. Graduate and Post-Baccalaureate students can repeat a single course for graduate improvement only once. They will be limited to a maximum of two repeats across the program. The most recent grade (regardless of whether it is higher or lower) will be the grade used for the GPA calculation.

2026 Chincoteague Bay Field Station of the Marine Science Consortium

Kutztown University is a member of the Chincoteague Bay Field Station of the Marine Science Consortium (CBFS) located in Wallops Island, VA. Through this affiliation we are able to offer three-week long, field-based summer courses for students at the field station in Wallops Island, VA. The CBSF facilities include state-of-the-art classrooms and laboratories, dormitories, and a cafeteria. The CBSF also operates a number of research vessels for use in teaching and research.

Registration Procedures and Information

Kutztown University students should register with the fields station first through the link listed below then register with the University.

There are also other college courses being offered at the CBFS for summer 2026. Students should check the CBFS website at [CBFS Summer College Courses \(cbfieldstation.org\)](http://www.cbfieldstation.org) to find out more about these other courses and the registration procedures for the sponsoring universities.

Students planning on counting non-KU CBFS courses toward their major should consult with their faculty advisor regarding course selection and appropriate course registration procedures. Students will also need to file a **PASSHE Visiting Student** form for these courses prior to the start of the course.

Students **must register both** through the CBFS Website AND through the sponsoring university.

There are 2 fees:

1. A non-refundable deposit of \$150 (\$800 for travel course) per course is required. The non-refundable deposit is applied to the total amount due. The respective deposit is due immediately upon receipt of invoice. Invoices will be sent out beginning January 2, 2026. Courses are on a first come first served basis. In order to have your seat saved in the class you must pay your deposit(s). The remaining amount will be billed to you separately. You will receive separate deposits for each course you registered for, so please make sure you pay all the deposits necessary.

If you decide to switch courses, your course deposit will be transferred. The deposit is not refundable if you voluntarily drop the class, fail to meet the stated prerequisites, or fail to complete enrollment at the offering university. The deposit is not refundable if you are excluded for non-payment of CBFS fees. The deposit is refundable if the course is cancelled.

Art Education Study Institute for the Professional Development of Teachers

The Summer Institutes for Art Educators are held in the summer months that correspond to Public School summer vacation schedules. The Institutes provide intensive one to two week instruction in art education and its related fields of study. Art Education and Visual Studies classes meet for one week, all studio courses run for two weeks. The Institutes connect students with community resources and visiting artist/scholars. The Institutes are designed to provide in-depth experiences that are unavailable through regular coursework.

Registration will begin **March 18, 2026** and will end one week prior to the start of the Institute. No refunds will be given after the start of class.

————— **Trial By Fire: The Ceramic Transformation**
Gwendolyn Yoppolo June 5th- 26h Onsite 12pm to 5pm

Working with clay is an elemental process that integrates feeling and thought, touch and sight, and past and present. As we move from inspiration to design, through the making process and the changes of the firing, we materialize our vision, align our hands and eyes, and evolve our ideas and goals. As we transform our materials, we also transform the way we perceive and understand the world. In turn, our artwork changes the people around us by evoking emotion, delivering poetic metaphor, making connections to cultural histories, and resonating senti/ments.

In this two-week studio-based workshop, we will explore ancient and contemporary forming methods such as pinching, coiling, slab building, wheel throwing, prototyping, molding, and digital technologies in ceramics. Integrating surface design into our making process will help us convey expressive meaning and create unified artworks. We will use drawing, writing, and collaborative dialogue to clarify the thoughts, inspirations, and emotions that we embody in our artwork. Blending risk-taking creativity with a critical consciousness within a supportive learning community will ensure a transformative experience for participants during this workshop.

ARED 571 Artists as Partners in Pedagogy: Conversations in making and Meaning

Dr. Julia L. Hovanec Non Credit Workshop: July 6th– 9th 8am – 4pm Online: July 10th - August 6th

This immersive four-day institute invites art educators to explore the intersection of artistic practice and teaching through partnership, conversation, and creative process. Each day centers on the idea of connection between artists and educators, materials and meaning, process and pedagogy. Participants will engage in hands-on mixed-media studio encounters led by visiting artists and a faculty facilitator, discovering how artistic partnerships can inspire curriculum, community, and connection.

Through open studio time, visiting artists, reflective dialogue, and a local field experience, participants will consider how the artist's studio and the art room can inform one another in mutually enriching ways. The accompanying online course provides space for deeper reflection, continued artmaking, and the design of curriculum inspired by the institute experience. Participants will leave with renewed creative energy, a broadened understanding of artistic partnership, and strategies for weaving these connections into their teaching, learning, and own artistic practice.

Summer Study Abroad

KU-Led Programs are study abroad experiences led by Kutztown University faculty or staff. Students travel with their Program Leader(s) and other KU students for the entire program. Students pay Kutztown University a **Program Charge**, which covers program planning and logistics, as well as **tuition and fees** if the program offers academic credit.


