1. Call to Order

At 3:03 p.m. Chairman Giorno called the meeting to order.

Chairman Giorno noted that an Executive Session was held and no action was taken.

3. Roll Call of Council Members

Attendance was taken at the direction of Chairman Giorno which established that a quorum of the Council was present.

4. Remarks by Mr. Dennis Giorno, Council Chairperson

"Welcome to the November meeting of the Kutztown University Council of Trustees.

The trustees have been very busy since our September meeting moving forward with the Presidential Search.

We have contracted Storbeck as the firm to help conduct the search. Storbeck joined us two weeks ago for the first meeting of the comprehensive search committee, as well as meetings with President Hawkinson and members of Cabinet. Their reps met with the trustees this morning at our executive session.

Storbeck will be back on campus November 21st to gather feedback from all members of the campus community prior to our next search committee meetings.

We thank the campus community for its participation, and we work toward identifying our 13th President to succeed Dr. Hawkinson in July."

5. Remarks by Ms. Kyra Richards, Student Government Board President

"We held our annual safety and accessibility walk on 11/6, identifying around 60 areas in need of improvement on campus. Thank you to all who attended, especially faculty and administrators. Student Government Board has hosted many college and committee events, with a special focus on diversity and inclusivity. We are holding midterm elections to fill our open seats and finalizing our budget packet reviews, ensuring clubs and organizations have proper funding for the next school year. As always, Student Government Board is extremely grateful for your support."

6. Remarks by Dr. Kenneth S. Hawkinson, University President

"Final enrollment numbers have been finalized for the current academic year at KU.

Total headcount enrollment for the 2024 fall semester is 7,468, up 41 students and 0.55% from last fall. Of the students enrolled at KU, 6,307 are undergraduates, while 1,161 are enrolled in graduate studies, a 16.57% increase.

The university's retention rate of first-time, full-time students improved by 3% to 77.8%. KU's four-year graduation rate increased by more than 1% to 44.0% (based on the 2020 cohort compared to 2019).

The average high school grade-point average of KU's fall 2024 freshmen class increased from 3.35 to 3.38, the highest for the university in recorded history for the third-straight year.

I want to thank the many students and their parents who chose KU, as well as our Admissions Office and all the KU faculty and staff who continually work hard to attract new students to be part of the KU campus community.

Kutztown University's Dr. Peg Speirs, professor of Art Education, is the recipient of the 2024 Outstanding Higher Education Art Educator award from the Pennsylvania Art Education Association (PAEA). Through a rigorous review process, PAEA identified Speirs as an outstanding leader in the field of art education for her creative contributions, excellence in professional engagement and dedication to service.

This past spring, three Golden Bears earned All-America honors and are here with us today. I would ask each honoree to please stand as I call your name.

From women's lacrosse, two student-athletes earned All-America honors from the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association. **Cyrose Conteh** is a graduate student defender and was named All-America Second Team. She was a First Team All-Region and All-P-S-A-C performer. She ranks second in school history in draw controls, and third in caused turnovers.

Sam Graf concluded her junior season last spring as Second Team All-America. She is a two-time All-American and First Team All-Region and All-P-S-A-C midfielder. Sam holds eight school records, including career records for points and draw controls.

From track & field, graduate student **Joe Jardine** earned All-America Second Team honors in the pole vault. At the NCAA Outdoor Championships in Emporia, Kansas, Joe tied for 12th place with a height of 16-feet, 2.75-inches. Joe is the school-record-holder in the indoor pole vault, and ranks third outdoors.

University Marketing has produced three Cub Cab videos during the fall semester, two hosted by Dean of Students Stephen Rupprecht and a homecoming edition featuring Tracey Gibson-Jackson, class of 1996.

The high-quality video production and social media strategy resulted in more than 77,000 views and an engagement rate of 6.4% across all three videos, which is about double KU's typical engagement rate.

This social media campaign helps to strengthen KU's brand perception while encouraging student and alumni engagement."
