1. Call to Order

4. Remarks by Mr. Dennis Giorno, Chairman

"Good afternoon, and welcome to the final public meeting of the Kutztown University Council of Trustees for the 2024-25 academic year.

I want to congratulate the Kutztown University community on so many outstanding events over the past several weeks, including the three spring commencement ceremonies, the welcoming for incoming President Dr. Phil Cavalier, and of course the ribbon cutting and dedication of the Hawkinson Welcome Center this morning. As you can see, Dr. Hawkinson's portrait, which we also unveiled this morning, is permanently displayed in this room with past principals and presidents. Congratulations Ken!

On behalf of the trustees, I want to wish everyone a safe, healthy and happy summer break and again wish President Hawkinson and Ann Marie all the best in retirement."

5. Student Government Board Update - No update was shared.

6. Remarks by Dr. Kenneth S. Hawkinson, University President

"Yesterday, we had our annual Faculty and Staff Recognition Picnic where we honored 145 members of our community for their years of service from five to thirty-five years and our retirees. It is our opportunity to recognize the many employees who invest years and decades to provide wonderful service to our institution.

Kutztown University has been awarded a \$946,951 grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Education for its Dual Credit Innovation program to address the state's teacher shortage. The grant will support scholarships and programming for KU's Early College Academy for Education. My congratulations to Dean Rebecca Burns, Provost Lorin Basden Arnold, and all the others who made this grant possible.

KU's Early College Academy of Education is an innovative approach to rethinking dual enrollment that thoughtfully and intentionally steps students into college, supporting their successful transition to post-secondary education. High school students who have a general interest in working with children and education studies can attend classes on KU's campus, where they will take two courses in the fall semester and two in the spring. The four courses count toward majors in education.

The current cohort in the pilot Early College Academy for Education has 39 students. The grant will allow the program to expand to 60 students in year one and a total of 150 students over two years.

Liquid, a marketing agency led by our own trustee Jim Ludlow, proudly announced the winners of the ninth annual Liquid Digital Marketing Award competition in collaboration with KU. This year's challenge, presented in collaboration with Insomnia Cookies, tasked student teams with developing innovative digital marketing campaigns to boost awareness and sales of the brand's

Cookie'wich menu item. The five KU seniors on the winning team impressed the panel with their comprehensive strategy, creative execution and insightful analysis. Their campaign stood out for its originality and practical application, earning them the top honor and monetary prize.

The Liquid Digital Marketing Award competition exemplifies the synergy between academia and industry, preparing students for successful careers in marketing and beyond. Thank you, Jim, to you and Liquid, for your continued support.

Kutztown University's home for Golden Bear Athletics, Keystone Hall, will undergo complete building renovation for the first time in its 54-year existence, beginning May 2026. The building will feature a modernized home for KU student-athletes, coaches, staff and fans and is slated to open in January 2028.

Highlights of the project include:

- Upgraded team locker rooms
- Updated office spaces for coaches, support staff and administrators. Keystone Pool upgrades
- A complete arena renovation
- Team rooms, an updated lobby, accessible entrances, state-of-the-art technology and more
- HVAC and many "behind the wall" improvements

The primary source of funding will be state capital funds.

I am happy to announce that as one of my last duties as President, I will award Mr. Robert Grim, esquire, a Kutztown University President's Medal. Bob is a life-long resident of Kutztown where he has practiced law since 1969. He served as chairperson and vice chairperson of the council to begin this decade. He is a generous supporter of the university, community advocate and has an extensive family legacy with KU and the borough of Kutztown dating back to the 1800s. I look forward to sharing more with everyone about Bob Grim at the ceremony later this month.

Finally, Ann Marie and I have been honored by numerous events in the last few months, and I can't tell you how humbling it has been. The events this morning with the opening of the Welcome Center and the unveiling of the portrait made it very difficult to find the right words of thanks.

I'm not worthy of the honors and accolades that have come my way. As all the accomplishments have resulted from the contributions of so many associated with this institution. If I am to have any credit at all it is to have the wisdom to surround myself with brilliant and engaged people who have helped and supported me over the last decade. This amazing Council of Trustees who have provided such important advice and guidance, my talented vice presidents and other administrators and staff, my wonderful office team, our faculty, the chancellor and State System personnel, my fellow presidents, the board of governors, the mayor and local community members, the amazing and generous alumni and friends of the university, legislators and civic leaders, my wonderful wife Ann Mrie and our students. It has all been about the students.
