

KU M.Ed. Music Education Requirements

An M.Ed. in Music Education includes advanced teaching theories and instructional design strategies designed for individuals with a K-12 Music Certification. The program provides advanced course work in the field of music education, developing research strategies applicable to the field of teaching and learning, and understanding historical and contemporary musical composition.

Student Learning Outcomes

1. Articulate, reflect upon, and implement knowledge of historical and contemporary trends in the development of music education.
2. Articulate current developments and changes in the field of Music Education.
3. Apply research and data-gathering tools to assess teaching and learning.
4. Analyze musical compositions in the context of historical periods or current trend.

Note that all students must achieve 30 graduate credits to complete the program.
